Tuesday March 1st- Arrival

4:30 PM Happy Hour & Heavy Snacks at club house (reserved for us) Wednesday March 2nd-

Morning on your own. Sleep in or swim in the pool. Visit nearby Sam's Town Hotel & Casino or gamble in one of the largest casinos in Las Vegas. Enjoy their 6 restaurants and food court, movie theater, and bowling center. Sit in the large indoor atrium and people watch.

4:15 pm – Depart RV Park via Uber, Lyft or Taxi for The Heart Attack Grill- 450 E Fremont St #130, Las Vegas, USA.

If you want to drive, you can find parking at Fremont Street Experience Parking

or at the large parking lot at the D Hotel and Casino. The walk is .02 miles to the restaurant. Wear comfortable shoes and clothes.

5:00 pm-Dinner at The Heart Attack Grill- We will at meet at 5pm by the weight scale (eat free if you weigh 350 lbs) outside the front entrance at the corner of Las Vegas Boulevard and Fremont Street.

6:30 pm to 9:30pm - Downtown Las Vegas Walking Tour Night **Thursday March 3rd**- You have choices today.

Kayak the Colorado River to Emerald Cove Depart 9am (bring your senior park pass).

The Neon Sign Museum at 770 Las Vegas Blvd N, Las Vegas isn't just a tourist trap. It showcases some of the most iconic signs that have been displayed throughout the city, highlighting the rich Las Vegas history. Guided tours and immersive shows and events are only a few of the activities available at this 3-acre museum. If you are an avid photographer and always looking for that "one shot," check out the Photo Walk; this allows you to bring in your equipment and focus on finding that perfect photo. Not only are the 200+ signs a highlight of the museum, but the visitor center is of mid-century modern design using atomic and space-age shapes by architect Paul Revere Williams, making this stop a must-see.

The Mob Museum 300 Stewart Ave, Las Vegas, NV 89101

(Parking on site) -Learn about the birth of the Mob and how law enforcement caught them. Interactive exhibits and artifacts are located just a few steps away from Fremont Street inside a restored 1933 Las Vegas courthouse. The exhibits connect both the academic community and the public with artifacts, digital records, and educational resources. Check out the Crime Lab Experience, a Prohibition-era world, and Mob's Greatest Hits.

Antelope Canyon (this must be pre-booked by you) and Horseshoe Bend (all day trip)

Friday March 4th- Pack a lunch - bring your national senior park pass. **7:30am**- **Hikers Depart for the Valley of Fire**, arrive 8:45. Hike the Seven Wonders Loop to the Fire Wave and White Domes, 3.2 miles, 2hrs, moderate. You can go to the Fire Wave and return for a shorter hike to the petroglyphs and Atlatl Rock, .01 mile.

8:30am- Depart for Valley of Fire on your own.

If you are not hiking, it's a 45-minute drive from Valley of Fire to lunch in Overton.

2 choices for lunch-

1. La Fonda Mexican Restaurant, 461 S Moapa Valley Blvd, Overton

2. The Inside Scoop, 395 S Main St, Overton

12:00 Picnic Lunch @ location to be determined

Afternoon-St Thomas Ghost Town -Walk among Nevada's own Atlantis, a ghost town that was underwater over 60 years. This former Mormon settlement is reemerging from the receding waters of Lake Mead. Watch a video at https://www.nps.gov/lake/learn/nature/st-thomas-nevada.htm Loop hike is a flat 2 miles.

Directions: From the Valley of Fire, turn left from the visitor's center, go east on Valley of Fire Rd., turn right on Hwy 169, go through Overton Lake Meade Fee Station (bring your park pass). Take an immediate left on Old St Thomas Rd (it turns into a dirt road) to the Historic St Thomas Trail. Loop is 2.5 miles or go as far as you like.

8:30 am- Departure for the Historic Railroad Hiking Trail Afternoon on your own

Here's where to go: https://www.recreation.gov/timed-entry/10075177 or call 877-444-6777. Timed reservations are required for vehicle entry to the Scenic Loop between 8am-5pm from October 1 through May 31. Entry is free with your America the Beautiful Annual Senior Pass, but you must reserve the time.



When you make your reservations, CALL 817-441-7878 and ask for the FMCA May Rally, not Cuatro Estados. Jayne put our group in the computer that way. Also, do not try to reserve on-line; you must call on the phone to get the discount and to verify the number of coaches we need to get the rally room for free.

ALEDO TEXAS RALLY SCHEDULE

Tuesday May 3, 2022. Arrive at Cowtown RV 7000 E I-20, Aledo, Texas.

Dinner of tacos and Spanish rice will be provided by the Rallymasters at 5:30 or 6:00. Remember to bring your favorite drink and dinnerware.

Wednesday May 4, 2022. Civil War Museum, 760 Jim Wright Freeway, FW. Leave RV park at 9:30. If we have a group of 10 or more for a tour, we must notify the museum in advance, and the fee will be \$6 per person. If you want to go on the tour, please inform the rallymaster before the rally begins. The tour is about 2 hours, and the rest of the day is on your own. Happy hour at 5, bring a lite snack to share.


