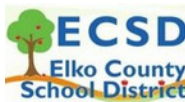

LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

With great enthusiasm, I present our 2024 Annual Report for Nevada Outdoor School (NOS)! Every year, when we draft this report, it gives us the opportunity to reflect on the last year – our accomplishments, failures, long standing partnerships and newly developed relationships. Throughout this Annual Report, we highlight some of the great successes of the past year and commemorate some milestones since our organization's founding in 2002. We celebrate with you and because of you!

Since our founding in 2002, NOS has become the premier provider of environmental, outdoor and ethics education in rural Nevada, partnering with many local agencies, organizations, non-profits, corporations and foundations, managing over 30 different funding sources annually. Our growth in the Elko County communities has really expanded along with our staffing needs, requiring us to find a larger office and work space to accommodate our people, our camping gear and all our outdoor education materials. Stop in and say hello at our new digs at 170 Idaho Street!

With our program participation growing we have been able to really put our Action, Impact, Choice outdoor education model into everything we do. Through guidance and support, we encourage our program participants to analyze their actions, evaluate the impacts those actions have and choose wisely to positively impact the natural world and reduce negative impacts when possible. At NOS, we believe that the more experiences people have outside exploring the natural world, the more they will want to learn about nature and the environment. The more they learn about the natural world, the more they will love, appreciate and care for the outdoors and increase their Time Spent Outdoors, or "TSO", our metric of success!

Eventually, one day, everyone will be good stewards of their environment, but until then, our work continues. Our staff and AmeriCorps Outdoor Educators strive everyday to better the world through their passion for our mission. Their work and enthusiasm make this job exciting and rewarding.

Our Ride Safe Ride Smart OHV Safety Program is expanding into more communities statewide, providing even more Youth OHV Safety Camps, hands-on OHV safety courses and youth rider evaluations. The Nevada online OHV Safety Course has already seen 80 participants since launching last year. I am especially proud to say that NOS, along with our partners Nevada Off Road Association, Renown Children's Hospital, University Medical Center, Tread Lightly! and the BLM – Carson City District, put 275 FREE youth off road helmets on kids at a couple of high use OHV recreation areas in Clark and Churchill Counties. Together we are fighting the problem of too many pediatric deaths and head traumas contributed to OHV accidents and so far, we are having great success. My hope is that eventually, helmet use for youth in Nevada will be a normal and expected sight at our high use recreation areas and in our rural communities. Until then, we will continue to work to secure the necessary funding to be able to continue this valuable program.

As I think back over this last year and about each and every person who makes Nevada Outdoor School such a unique and successful organization, I am filled with pride. Each one of our NOS staff and AmeriCorps Members brings a delightfully different perspective and a wealth of knowledge and mad skills to the team and I am lucky to be surrounded by such a talented group.

You, our donors, friends and partners are key to everything we do. From all of us at NOS, thank you for coming along this journey with us.

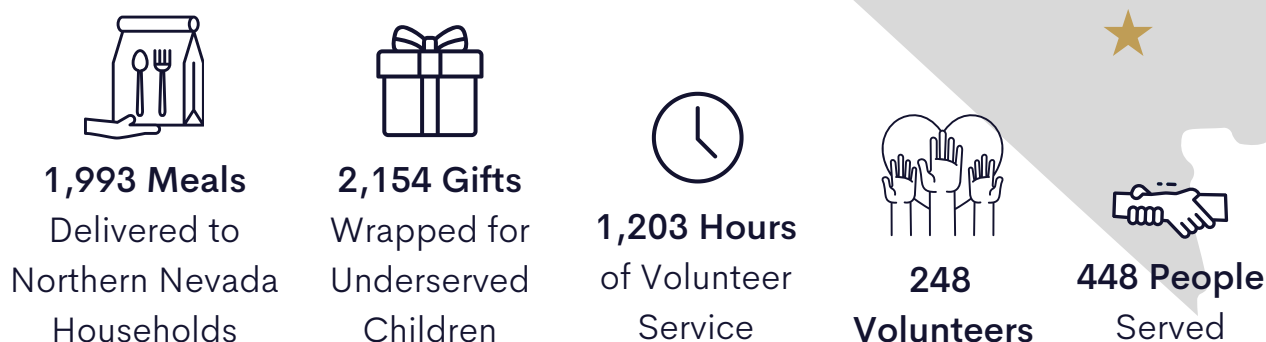




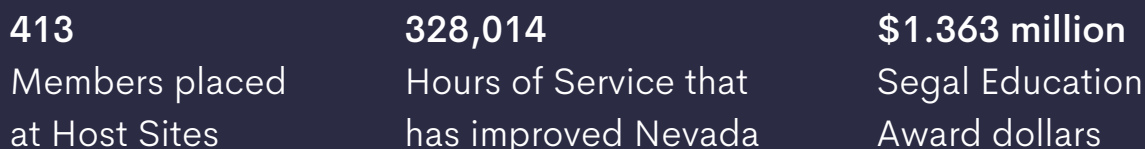

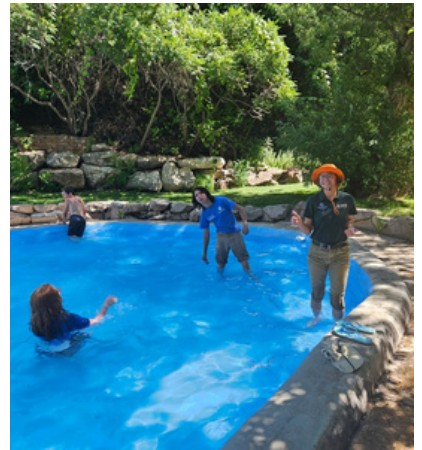


2024 Statistics



Lifetime Statistics



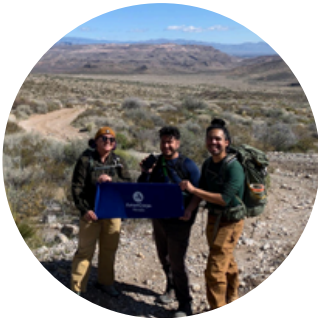


THE AMERICORPS EXPERIENCE CHANGES LIVES

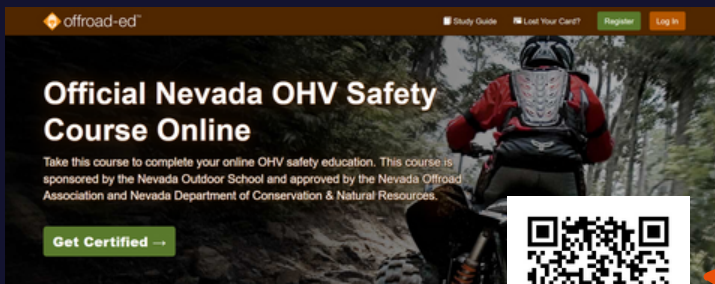

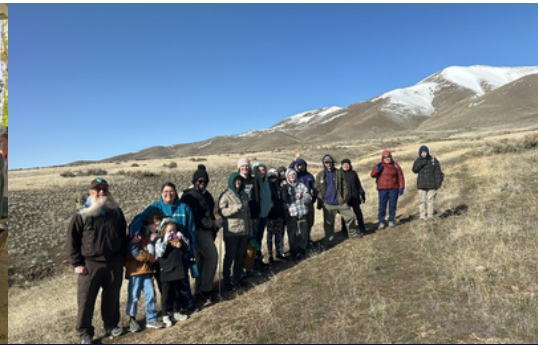

CALIFORNIA TRAIL INTERPRETIVE CENTER

Since 2017, we have had a NOSome Assistance Agreement with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM), Elko District to help staff the California Trail Interpretive Center (CTIC).





At CTIC, visitors can experience life size diorama, original mural, exhibits on the native peoples, and production depicting the trek of the early pioneers. They can hike on accessible trails, through a wagon encampment, and see a Shoshone village. It is a beautiful educational facility and a partnership that opens a lot of possibilities for NOS programs!

A NOS Programs Coordinator at the Trail Center provides field trips and Traveling Trunk classroom visits to Elko County School District students and enhanced visitor interpretive experiences to the general public!

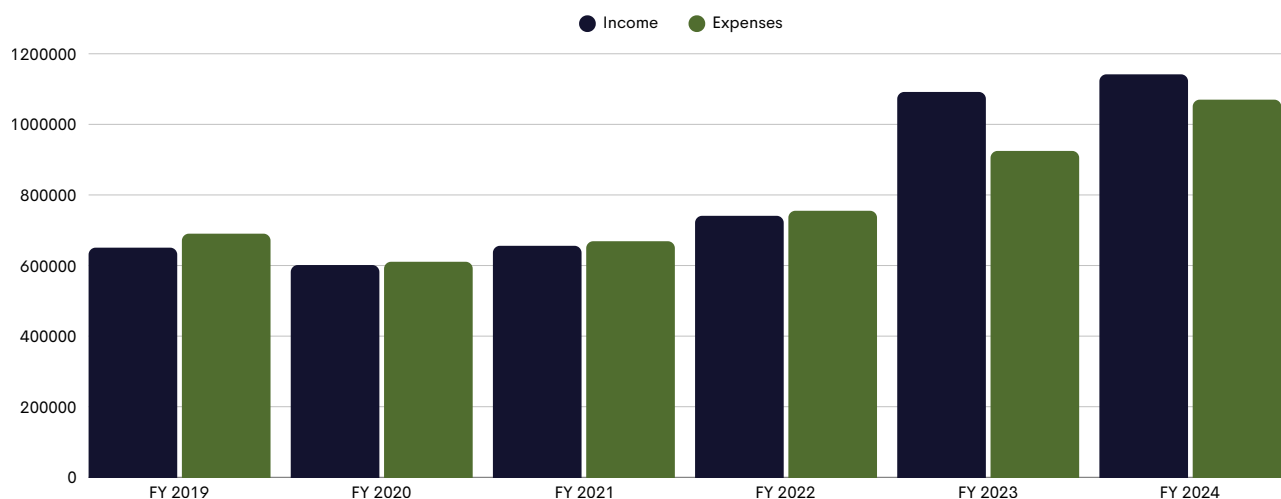
