Seed Storage Tips

Dark - Keep seeds in a dark room or box

Dry - Naturally lower in humidity, the North is ideal for drying and storing seeds. Aim for relative humidity less than 40%. Store seeds in airtight containers or jars

Cool - Store seeds in the temperature range of 1° C - 7° C if possible. In a cold room or in the back of a refrigerator works great. Be sure seeds are airtight before storing in the fridge and allow to come to room temperature before opening the container or jar
