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| <h3>Seed Starting Tips</h3>  | <p>Keep fungus gnats to a minimum to prevent dampening-off disease. Airflow from a fan helps prevent diseases and produces strong seedlings</p> |
| | <p>Sterilize all pots and trays being re-used to prevent unwanted diseases and pests</p> |
| | <p>Water trays or pots from the bottom to prevent washing away tiny seeds. If the top is dry, a fine-mist sprayer works great</p> |
| | <p>Some seeds need darkness to germinate- an example is delphinium. Ensure dark-preferring seeds aren't under grow lights</p> |
| | <p>If you're ever unsure how deep to sow, a good rule of thumb is to plant the seeds at twice the depth of the seed's diameter</p> |
| | <p>Some seeds need heat to germinate, some seeds prefer cooler temperatures. Not all seeds enjoy a heat mat</p> |
