Bourbon County LHEAT, led by Rachel Carpenter, has a vision to create lasting solutions to improve the quality of life in Bourbon County. The last two years has led to bringing people together around this shared vision.

The LHEAT's proudest accomplishments include implementation of a county wide transportation program, laundry of love initiatives, and meeting residents housing goals. The CHW's were instrumental in assisting 137 individuals meet housing goals of finding safe housing or shelter, obtaining necessary household supplies, and other. Without the strong partnerships between organizations, and bringing people together with lived experience to share their story, none of this would have happened.
