Palm Sunday - April 13 - 11:00 am - Blessing of the 'butarice' and other greenery will be in front of the Center. The procession to the church will follow. During the mass the solemn reading of Jesus' passion according to Evangelist Luke. There will be a gathering for Easter brunch in the Center afterwards.

- On Saturday morning, before Palm Sunday you are invited to make "butarice" in the Center.
- At noon on Saturday there will be **Living stations of the Cros**s (a volunteer in Lemont, Larry Baron is organizing if you are prepared to have a role in it invited to call Larry at 708-662-0478)

Holy Thursday - April 17 - Liturgy in memory of Jesus' last supper with the Apostles. Holy Mass will be at 7:00 pm, followed by a holy hour with Jesus in the 'jail'.

Good Friday - April 18 - At 7:00 pm will be Celebration of the Passion of the Lord.

Holy Saturday-Vigil of Easter – April 19 – We are invited to remember and visit Jesus who was buried on Good Friday. At 2:00 pm blessing of the food (which traditionally entails bread-meat as a symbol of Jeus's body; coloured eggs – symbol of Jeus's blood and also of resurrection, horse radish – Jesus's nails and 'potica'-Jesus' crown). At 7:00 pm will be a special liturgy of the day, concluding with Easter procession, also blessing of the Easter food, followed by a gathering in the Center.

Easter - April 20 - 11:00 am solemn mass of Easter Sunday - Jesus' resurrection.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, will be held during the mass on second Sunday of Easter, April 27, called also Devine Mercy Sunday. Same Sunday as appreciation dinner in the Center.

'**Šmarnice**'- Slovenian devotion to Mary will take place on Sundays in May during the mass (as the last two years) and after the mass singing litanies to Mary with responses will be held.

100 years - Marija Pomagaj picture – June 1 – Rector from Brezje, Fr. Robert Bahcic, will celebrate with us 100 years since Marija Pomagaj picture was installed into the chapel of the first Franciscan monastery along Main Street. We remember also the 80th anniversary of the end of the second world war. People from all over the USA and Canada were gathering at Marija Pomagaj for decades to meet, pray, and gain strength to continue on. These Slovenians were supporting Lemont - with Ave Maria magazine being their connection to Ameriške Brezje. We will remember and celebrate together!

Acceptance of the children who received their First Holy Communion this year will take place on June 8th at 11 a.m. mass. Since the same day is also Pentecost, all those who received Confirmation this, or previous years, are invited as well.

Corpus Christi procession will be held on Sunday, June 15nd -- starting with the solemn mass at 11:00 am at the Lourdes Grotto (weather permitting). After the mass there will be procession with the Blessed Sacrament around 'Lake Bled'. Children are especially invited to participate by bringing flower petals to the procession and laying them before the altars during prayers. All the Slovenian organizations are invited to participate with their banners.

June 15 - Prekmurje Social Club - Father's Day pilgrimage and picnic - Mass will be held at the grotto and followed by Corpus Christi procession - please see above.

June 28 - 29. - Slovenian Sport's Club weekend. The Sunday Mass will be held at the Lourdes grotto.

Slovenian Geneology Society International, Inc

A few years ago, a card index file was found that contained the names of all family members who were sponsored from DP camps in Austria, German and Italy after WWII to the Unites states. The Slovenian Catholic League headquartered in Joliet and NYC, coordinated between the United Nations Relief Agencies and sponsors in the USA. The SGSI last year organized volunteers to enter this data into a database. They are almost 75% done. Many names of SCC families who were refugees from WWII can be found in this database. There will be a pilgrimage to the old St. Joseph Church in Calumet, the former Slovenian parish, which many believe is the most beautiful church in the UP. Eligibility requirements are as follows: Applicants must be between the ages of 18 and 30 by July 1 of the current year, must be high school graduates, must be active in the Slovenian community, specifically the Slovenian Catholic Center community, and must be a member of the Slovenian Catholic Center.

Duties and participation expectations of the Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa include:

- List all Slovenian associations and include dates of active participation and volunteer work (KSKJ, SNPJ, Slovenian Union of America, etc.)
- · List any family members involved in the Slovenian community and any of their contributions
- What does it mean to be part of the Slovenian community to you and how does it impact your life?
- Goals for the next 10 years
- Any hobbies and interests you enjoy doing regularly
- Would you be willing to attend SCC events (such as Koline, Annual Membership luncheon, SCC Picnic, SCC Anniversary, etc.) in the current and following year

Applications are due by June 15 to secretary@slovenian-center.org with the subject line SCC Service Award or dropped off at the SCC.

Selection process for Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa:

- Applications are due by June 15.
- All submitted applications are reviewed to ensure that applicants meet the eligibility requirements.
- The Young Adult Service Recognition committee reviews all eligible applicants and nominates the top
 applicants for Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa to the SCC General Board.
- The SCC General Board votes and determines the Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa for the coming year. Up to 2 applicants, 1 of each gender, can be selected each year. This is based on the applications received each year.
- The selected candidates will be notified after the SCC General Board vote to have pictures taken and to provide further information about the rest of the process.
- The Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa will be announced at the SCC picnic on the second Sunday in August.
- The Gospodična / Gospod / Gospa will be honored at the SCC Anniversary celebration on the second Sunday in November

DOUGH INGREDIENTS

500 g all-purpose flour (4 cups or 17.7 ounces)
5 g active dry yeast (1 1/2 tsp) or 10g (1 tbsp) fresh yeast
2 tbsp sugar
270 ml milk (9.5 ounces)
2 egg yolks (40g or 1.4 ounces)
65 g melted butter (2.3 ounces)
1/2 tsp salt

WALNUT FILLING INGREDIENTS

300 g shelled walnuts (10.5 ounces)
60 g floral honey (2.1 ounces)
3 tbsp sugar
75 g heavy cream (2.7 ounces)
1 tbsp butter
1 tbsp rum (optional)
1/4 tsp ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp bio lemon zest
2 egg whites (medium)
2 tbsp sugar (for egg whites)

TOOLS/EQUIPMENT

Bundt cake pan (24cm/9in) or 2 loaf pans 10x25 cm (4inx10in)
Small bowl
Large bowl
Stand mixer (optional)
Food processor
Electric Mixer
Rolling Pin



METHOD

Brush

1) PREPARE THE PANS

• We traditionally bake potica in a cake pan called "Poticnik". It's similar to a bundt cake pan, so you can use that or use a loaf pan. Grease with butter or lard and set aside.

2) KNEAD

- In a small bowl knead together yeast, sugar, and lukewarm milk. Set aside for 10 minutes for the yeast to grow. In a large bowl combine all-purpose flour, yeast mixture, and egg yolks. Knead for a minute, then add melted butter and salt. Knead for about 10 minutes by hand or use an electric mixer and knead until the dough is nice, soft and elastic, for about 5 minutes (using a mixer). Cover with cling film and set aside for about 50 60 minutes or until doubled in size.
- *TIP: If the dough appears to be stiff and not elastic at all, add up to 2 tbsp of milk into the mixture. You can also substitute 1/3 of the butter with lard.

3) WALNUT FILLING

- Put the walnuts in a bowl of a food processor and pulse for a few seconds at a time until the walnuts are fine. Transfer to a large bowl. In a saucepan combine heavy cream, floral honey, sugar, butter, rum (optionally), lemon zest and ground cinnamon. Place over medium-high heat, bring to a boil, then pour over the walnuts in a bowl. Stir to combine to get a nice walnut filling. Set aside for the mixture to cool to room temperature. In a separate bowl beat the egg whites with sugar to get stiff peaks. Fold the egg whites into the walnut mixture and stir to combine. The walnut filling mixture should be light, yet stirred well.
- *TIP: If the walnut filling seems too liquidy, add a tsp of breadcrumbs. If the filling seems too dry, add 1 tsp of heavy cream.

4) PREPARATION AND ROLLING (THE CLASSIC WAY)

- Preheat your oven to 190 °C / 375 °F. Generously dust your working area with flour. Roll the dough into a 40 cm x 35 cm / 16-inches x 13.5-inches rectangle, thickness 0.5 cm or 0.2-inch. Using an offset spatula, spread the walnut filling in an even layer over the dough. Starting at the shorter edge nearest you, tightly roll up into a tight log. Brush off any excess flour. Transfer the potica roll to the prepared pan so that the seam is looking upward. Make sure that the ends of the log are tightly pressed together or the potica won't be as pretty and the filling will spread out while baking.
- *TIP: if you decideed to cut off the excess dough on the edges, you can bake it separatley on a baking sheet. The length of the log must be double the length of the round bundt cake pan

5) PROOFING (CLASSIC WAY)

• Cover the potica with a towel or cling film and let stand at room temperature until doubled in size, about 45 - 55 minutes.

6) OVERNIGHT PROOFING

• If you want to proof the potica overnight, you first need to leave out the first bulk proofing. Once you knead the dough, leave it to rest at your working surface for about 15 minutes, then roll the dough into a rectangle and spread the walnut filling over the dough. Roll, transfer to your prepared pan. Cover with cling film or towel and place in the fridge to proof for about 8 - 12 hours. Then, place the cold potica into your preheated oven to bake.

7) BAKE AND SERVE

- Using a brush, gently brush the potica with lukewarm milk. Use a skewer to poke holes all over the top of the potica all the way through to prevent air bubbles from forming and separating the filling from the dough. Transfer the potica to the preheated oven. Bake for 45 minutes at 180 °C / 355 °F. Then lower the heat to 160 °C / 320 °F and continue to bake for 20 25 minutes or until the nut roll is puffed and golden brown. Let cool slightly, for about 5 minutes, then invert onto a wire rack and remove the pan. Leave the potica to cool, then sprinkle with icing sugar and serve.
- *TIP: If you are baking Potica in a convection oven the baking time is slightly different. First, bake for 45 minutes at 165 °C / 330 °F, then reduce the heat to 140 °C / 285 °F and continue to bake for 20 25 minutes.
