THE CHILI QUEENS OF SAN ANTONIO

Long before food trucks and trendy pop-ups, San Antonio had its famous Chili Queens - women who brought the city's culture to life through their flavorful dishes. As early as the 1800s, these entrepreneurial women would set up open-air food stalls in the city's plazas, serving hearty bowls of chili con carne to locals and visitors alike.

The Chili Queens weren't just cooks; they were entertainers. Their stalls became lively social hubs, complete with music, laughter, and the smoky aroma of their secret spice blends. They were some of San Antonio's earliest ambassadors, helping to establish the city as a culinary destination.

Though health regulations in the 1930s eventually ended this tradition, the spirit of the Chili Queens lives on in the city's vibrant food culture. Next time you savor a bowl of chili, remember: it's more than just a meal; it's a bite of San Antonio's rich history.

CHICKEN POT PIE SOUP

It's everyone's favorite meal in soup form.

INGREDIENTS

- Cheddar Crust Dippers
- 2 (9-in.) refrigerated pie crusts
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheese (about 4 oz.)
- 2 Tbsp. chopped fresh parsley
- SOUP
- 4 Tbsp. salted butter
- 3 stalks celery, finely diced
- 2 medium carrots, peeled and finely diced
- 2 medium onions, finely diced
- 2 tsp. chopped fresh thyme
- Pinch of turmeric
- Kosher salt and black pepper, to taste
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup white wine
- 6 cups chicken broth
- 3 cups shredded rotisserie chicken
- 1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
- 1/2 cup heavy cream

DIRECTIONS

YIELDS: 4 - 6 servings PREP TIME: 15 mins TOTAL TIME: 35 mins

For the cheddar crust dippers: Preheat the oven to 375°F. Line 2 sheet pans with parchment paper.

- 1. Unroll a pie crust on each prepared sheet pan. Sprinkle the crusts with the cheese and parsley, lightly pressing everything in to adhere. Bake until the edges turn golden, the cheese is bubbling, and the crust is baked through, 12 to 14 minutes. Set aside to cool.
- 2. For the soup: Meanwhile, melt the butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add the celery, carrots, onion, and thyme. Season with the turmeric and a good pinch of salt and pepper. Stir and cook until the vegetables begin to soften, 3 to 4 minutes. Sprinkle the flour over the vegetables, and stir until combined, letting the flour cook for 1 to 2 minutes. While stirring, slowly pour in to wine and chicken broth. Add the chicken and parsley. Let the soup come to a boil and thicken slightly. Stir in the cream, and taste. Adjust seasonings as needed.
- 3. Serve the soup in bowls, breaking the crusts into large pieces to serve on the side.

IT'S THE LAW

You may not park a vehicle...

- In front of a public or private driveway
- Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant
- Within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection, marked or unmarked
- Within 30 feet on the approach to a ... stop sign...

Tex. Transp. Code § 545.302

Texas law defines an unmarked crosswalk as the extension of a sidewalk across intersecting roadways.

FASCINATING FUN FACTS

Here's a round of captivating trivia to share with friends, family, or at your next neighborhood get-together!

The Smell of Rain Has a Name

That earthy smell after it rains is called "petrichor." It's caused by an oil released from soil and plants, which combines with a compound called geosmin, produced by certain bacteria. It's no wonder so many people love the refreshing scent!

Sea Otters Hold Hands When They Sleep

To keep from drifting apart in the water, sea otters often hold hands while they sleep. This adorable behavior, known as "rafting," helps them stay close to their family groups.

There Are More Stars in the Universe Than Grains of Sand on Earth

Scientists estimate there are about 10 times more stars in the universe than grains of sand on all the beaches and deserts of Earth. That's roughly 1 septillion stars—or 1 with 24 zeros after it!

Sloths Can Hold Their Breath Longer Than Dolphins

While dolphins can hold their breath for about 10 minutes, sloths can slow their heart rate and hold their breath for up to 40 minutes. This helps them avoid predators by remaining underwater longer.

The First Computer Bug Was a Real Bug

The term "computer bug" originated in 1947 when engineers found a moth stuck in a Harvard Mark II computer, causing an error. The moth was removed and taped into a logbook, marking the first documented "debugging."

The Shortest War in History Lasted 38 Minutes

The Anglo-Zanzibar War of 1896 between Britain and the Sultanate of Zanzibar holds the record for the shortest war in history. After just 38 minutes, the Sultan surrendered, marking an incredibly brief conflict.

Hot Water Freezes Faster Than Cold Water

Known as the Mpemba effect, under certain conditions, hot water can freeze faster than cold water. Scientists are still debating why this happens, but it's thought to involve evaporation, convection currents, and molecular interactions.

Cows Have Best Friends

Studies have shown that cows form strong bonds with specific herd members, often referred to as "best friends." When separated from their buddies, cows can exhibit signs of stress, proving they're more social than we might think.

Jupiter Has a Moon with More Water Than Earth

Europa, one of Jupiter's moons, is covered in a thick layer of ice, beneath which lies a massive ocean. Scientists believe it contains twice as much water as all the oceans on Earth combined and may even harbor conditions suitable for life.
