Code of conduct

6. All Members must behave professionally at all times in connection with our events and follow the reasonable rules, policies, directions and other practices required by The Multicultural Professional Network or any venue hosting the event.
7. The MPN is committed to providing a harassment-free and inclusive environment at all events. Discrimination, harassment, violence, or intoxicated behaviour will not be tolerated.
8. In registering for The Multicultural Professional Network in-person events, Members also agree to adhere to the relevant government health and work safety advice in the location of where the event is held
