VASECTOMY INFORMATION AND CONSENT

This information will help you understand more about the vasectomy: the indications for this procedure, the success and failure rates, the alternative forms of contraception, and the possible complications of the procedure.

WHAT IS A VASECTOMY?

A vasectomy is a minor surgical procedure designed to block the sperm flow from the testicles to the ejaculatory ducts, rendering a man sterile. A vasectomy is a possible option for a patient who desires to have no more children and is considered a permanent form of birth control (sterilization). This procedure can be performed in any man except those with a history of severe bleeding tendency and can usually be done with local anesthesia. Vasectomy is a popular, time honored method of pregnancy prevention because it is simple, safe, and highly effective.

WHAT ARE THE ALTERNATIVES TO A VASECTOMY?

The most popular permanent alternative to a vasectomy is female sterilization by tubal ligation. Tubal ligation requires general anesthesia and carries greater operative risk. Like a vasectomy, tubal ligation is highly effective. Other methods of birth control available include the birth control pill, hormonal implants, depot hormone injections (Depo Provera), hormone patches, barrier methods (diaphragm or condom) with spermicide, vaginal sponge, intrauterine device (IUD), and emergency contraception (morning after method). Each method has its own effectiveness, safety and cost; none are quite as effective as permanent sterilization with vasectomy.

HOW EFFECTIVE IS A VASECTOMY?

While there are no absolute guarantees in any medical endeavor, most large studies show that results with vasectomy are excellent. Late sterilization failure rates vary between 0.04% and 0.08%.

HOW DO I PREPARE FOR THE PROCEDURE?

It is important to avoid aspirin, ibuprofen or other medications that thin the blood for 7 days prior to the procedure. Bathe or shower normally on the day of the procedure. Shave the genitals the day prior to the procedure.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN THE PROCEDURE?

A vasectomy is performed by anesthetizing the skin of the scrotum with a small injection of lidocaine or other local anesthesia. The medication will cause a small, short burning sensation and then the tissue will be numb. A small opening is then made in the skin, and the vas is lifted up with surgical instruments. A small section is cut out and the cut ends are cauterized and tied. Both the right and left vas must be managed in this fashion, and the incisions are usually stitched closed. The entire procedure usually takes 20-30 minutes.

WHAT ARE THE POTENTIAL COMPLICATIONS?

Significant bleeding or infection despite the antibiotics given are the most common complications and occur in <5% of cases. Other possible complications include chronic pain syndrome. Even after a properly performed procedure, about 1% of people develop pain in one or both testicles which doesn't go away after the initial healing period. No one is guite sure why this occurs, but when it occurs it can be difficult to resolve. There are medications and procedures designed to try to improve this pain, but no guarantees of improvement or resolution of the same. A vasectomy does not affect hormone levels, sexual desire, size of the testicles, erection quality, general health, or semen volume significantly. In 1992 a study was published implicating a possible link between vasectomy and prostate cancer. Subsequent well controlled studies have failed to demonstrate any increased risk of prostate cancer in men who have had a vasectomy. Finally, there is the miniscule chance of recanalization, or the body naturally re-opening a passage in the vas deferens and sperm traveling through again. The odds of this occurring are less than 1 in 1,000,000 but would result in a patient being fertile again.

REVERSAL

A vasectomy can be reversed by a technique called vasovasotomy. Vasovasotomy is not guaranteed to restore fertility, even in the best of hands and circumstances, so please make sure you are certain that you do not want to have any more children prior to proceeding with a vasectomy. The overall success rate of vasovasotomy is that 90% men have sperm return to the ejaculate, and 50% achieve pregnancy. Obstruction of the vasa for a prolonged period is thought to impair sperm quality and diminish the chances of restoring fertility as time goes on.
