




Why have we produced these maps?


### What is Countryside Stewardship Mid Tier (MT)





### How can anyone mitigate the Issues

- ▶ What are flood plains and are they worth preserving? <u>A National Geographic View</u>. (13)
- ▶ With all the different bodies reporting and monitoring the Cuckmere flood plain there is clear evidence that concerns are real see <u>page 4</u> and <u>page 3</u>.
- What mitigation can be done the allow the development of the Grosvenor proposal, without pushing the water to other vulnerable areas?
- ▶ Why has river level monitoring been stopped at <u>Hellingly</u>? (14)
- ▶ Will the development of 2500 dwelling and other associated building in the Grosvenor proposal change the Government <u>flood plain category</u>? (15)
- ▶ With both <u>Southern Water</u> (16) and <u>Southeast Water</u> (17) only supplying 8% of their water from reservoirs does the proposed development leave them in a position of shortage and possible contamination?
- Does this <u>Friends of the Earth</u> have any credence? (18)
- A short film provided by Southern Water called <u>The Drip</u> shows how the water cycle links everything together. (19)
- ▶ Will any mitigation further increase flooding up stream at Hellingly? see previous slide.
- Perhaps a solution may be had if this is taken seriously as an option <u>Sewage scaremongering and the</u> red herrings of costing (20)
