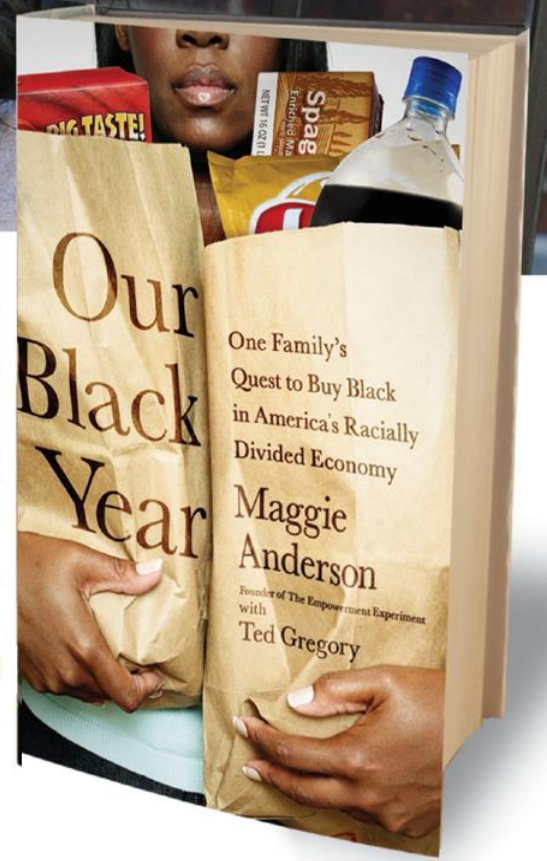

AUTHOR, *OUR BLACK YEAR: ONE FAMILY'S QUEST TO BUY BLACK IN AMERICA'S RACIALLY DIVIDED ECONOMY*

Maggie Anderson converted her University of Chicago JD/MBA; her years working in law firms and Corporate America; her experiences as the former aide to Congressman John Lewis, a direct report to Don Thompson, the first only Black CEO of McDonald's Corporation, a law student of President Obama; and her life as a daughter of Cuban immigrants who came to this country with nothing, worked 60 hour weeks, and raised their children to love America amidst the poverty-, drug- and crime-infested Liberty City area of Miami... into a growing message and movement rallying all those who care about racial and economic injustice and inequality.

In 2009, global media covered Maggie and her family as they lived out her public pledge to “buy Black” exclusively for an entire year. This stand was a major sacrifice. She was threatened. Her mother was dying of pancreatic cancer the whole time and died shortly afterward. She was raising two toddlers. There was no Black owned grocery store. Her historic year AKA “The Empowerment Experiment” resulted in a landmark Kellogg study, curated by Maggie, proving nearly 1 million new jobs could be created if Black owned firms received a small increase in support; her critically acclaimed book, *Our Black Year: One Family's Quest to Buy Black in America's Racially Divided Economy*; tens of millions in revenue for and deposits into Black owned businesses and banks; and an unprecedented media, university, and corporate attention specifically on Black owned businesses, systemic racism in the American economy, and economic inequality.

Millions have shed tears while taking notes as she teaches the victorious yet violent history of Black owned businesses and Black economic unity; preaches about economic justice and empowerment; and shares The Empowerment Experiment, and how it has since changed and ‘saved’ her life, effectively curing her Stage 4 cancer.

For her sustained activism and her hard-hitting speeches, she was chosen by BET and Centric TV as one of “The Most Fascinating Women of 2016”, and the YWCA as “The Women of the Year” for her work countering racism in the economy... Maggie continues to receive numerous honors, proclamations and awards from respected universities, corporations, municipalities and rights groups such as the National Bar Association, the National Association of Real Estate Brokers, Harvard University, New York Life, and many more.

Maggie has a BA from Emory University; and a Juris Doctor (JD) and Master of Business Administration (MBA) from the University of Chicago. She lives in Oak Park, Illinois with her husband of 25 years, John C. Anderson (AB, Economics, Harvard University, 1993; MBA, Finance, Kellogg Graduate School of Management, 1999) and their two daughters, Cori (honors high school student athlete) and Cara (Howard University sophomore).

DESCRIPTION OF EXPERTISE AND PROPOSED DISCUSSION/TOPIC

In 2011, Northwestern University's Kellogg Graduate School of Management completed the landmark study based on Maggie's stand living off Black owned businesses AKA The Empowerment Experiment; and Maggie finished her book, *Our Black Year*, which received rave reviews from icons like Cathy Hughes, Marc Morial and Alfred Edmond, along with *Publishers Weekly*, *Book Today*, *Black Enterprise* and *Library Journal*.

Via the press coverage, the compelling story of the family's stand and sacrifice, and the credibility of the historic experiment, and the acclaimed book, Maggie articulated and proved the importance of self-help economics in the Black community and increased awareness about how the lack of local businesses and professionals leads to the social crises that disproportionately impact Black families and neighborhoods. Her stand and experiment have also created a call to action for corporations and consumers that care about underserved minority communities to work together so that these families, entrepreneurs and neighborhoods can depend less on government intervention to resolve the problems - and to instead drive more direct investment in minority communities via representative and substantive supplier, franchisee, vendor and dealer DEI.

Since her historic stand, study, and book, Maggie has given thousands of speeches and interviews hosted by the most respected corporations, universities, trade/ professional/ rights organizations, and media outlets. Her advocacy has resulted in countless millions for Black owned businesses and banks, and the communities they represent. Millions have shed tears while taking notes as she teaches the victorious yet violent history of Black businesses and Black economic unity; preaches about economic justice and empowerment; inspires more unity and understanding; and shares The Empowerment Experiment, and how it has since changed and ‘saved’ her life as she battles Stage 4 cancer. TED Founder, Richard Wurman, called Maggie “one of the most powerful orators in America”.

When Maggie speaks and lectures, she offers a story and hard-earned wisdom that no one else can. She draws from the unsung story and success of Black owned businesses and neighborhoods in America; Dr. Martin Luther King and the Civil Rights Movement, and how Black entrepreneurship, economic solidarity, and business success helped both; presents the lessons learned from her family's stand, and delivers an inspirational and intelligent message about the possibility and promise of homespun economic empowerment in America, the case for business DEI and supplier diversity, and supporting locally-owned businesses; and teaches the specific cultural, societal and economic importance of successful Black owned banks and businesses, and the fundamental value of inclusion of and investment in Black owned businesses by the government, Corporate, and university/nonprofit sectors.
