What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to receive donations or funding and organise fundraising activities:

- Names and contact details
- Addresses
- Donation history
- Tax payer information (for Gift Aid purposes)

We collect or use the following personal information for the prevention, detection, investigation or prosecution of crimes:

 Video recordings of public areas (including indoor and outdoor spaces) Information relating to health and safety

We collect or use the following personal information for **service updates or marketing purposes**:

- Names and contact details
- Addresses

We collect or use the following personal information to **comply with legal requirements**:

- Health and safety information
- Safeguarding information

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a "lawful basis" for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible <u>lawful bases</u> in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are set out in brief below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. Read more about the right of access.
- Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. Read more about the right to rectification.
- Your right to erasure You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. Read more about the right to erasure.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to **receive** donations or funding and organise fundraising activities are:

 Public task – we have to collect or use your information to carry out a task laid down in law, which the law intends to be performed by an organisation such as ours. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure and the right to portability.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information **for the prevention, detection, investigation or prosecution of crimes** are:

- Legitimate interests we're collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:
 - Property on the land owned by Colwall Orchard Trust has been vandalised and attempts to break in has resulted in

damage to door locks. The CCTV system will be both a deterrent and where necessary provide evidence which can be used by the relevant authorities.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information for **service updates or marketing purposes** are:

- Consent we have permission from you after we gave you all the relevant information. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object. To be clear, you do have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.
- Legitimate interests we're collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:
 - Colwall Orchard Trust has a membership of around 200 people. We send out regular emails regarding activities pertinent to the activities of the Group and also run a number of events during the year whereby we need to contact the membership for information purposes and to recruit volunteers to help with the running of such events.

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to **comply** with legal requirements are:

 Legal obligation – we have to collect or use your information so we can comply with the law. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to erasure, the right to object and the right to data portability.

How long we keep information

CCTV recordings will be kept for 7 days, except where we need to keep a part of a recording for any of the purposes previously mentioned, e.g. Legal or Health and Safety.
