BWC Activated - Muted when speaking with Officers

On September 18, 2025 I responded to [REDACTED] in reference to [REDACTED] death.

I arrived on scene and made contact with TFD Ladder 4, who informed me that [REDACTED] was found deceased inside of unit [REDACTED] was pronounced dead at 1909 hours by Dr. Gaither. TFD advised that [REDACTED] was found by property managers during a room check, inside the toilet. TPD advised that [REDACTED] appeared to be a [REDACTED]

I then spoke to [REDACTED], Danielle Bosley. Danielle was advised of her Miranda rights at 1928 hours ("yes" "yes"). Danielle advised that she had checked in to unit [REDACTED] earlier that day, around noon. [REDACTED] is government housing, Danielle is transient. Danielle stated that she was having [REDACTED] and felt as though she needed to [REDACTED]. Danielle went to the bathroom and attempted to [REDACTED]. Danielle stated that she was having what she thought was [REDACTED], when she realized a [REDACTED]. Danielle stated that she got off of the toilet and realized that she had [REDACTED]. Danielle stated that she had no idea that she was [REDACTED]. Danielle then stated that she briefly attempted to render aid to [REDACTED] who she claimed was not moving and not crying. Danielle then stated that she was [REDACTED], at which point she grabbed a [REDACTED] and used it in an attempt to stop [REDACTED]. Danielle stated that she then proceeded to the bed, where she laid down and "tried to be okay". Danielle stated that she attempted to scream for help, but no one came to her aid. Danielle stated that she did not have a working phone to use to call for aid. And Danielle also stated that she was physically unable to walk to the door and open it in an attempt to call for help. Danielle would later claim that she had momentarily "passed out" in the bathroom after [REDACTED]. Then she proceeded to her bed, where she again passed out.

According to Danielle, approximately 2 hours after [REDACTED], property management staff came to conduct their standard room checks. Danielle advised the staff that she [REDACTED] in the toilet. The staff then checked the toilet and found [REDACTED] and attempted to render lifesaving measures.

Danielle would later state that she did not know she had [REDACTED] in the toilet. Danielle stated that she only saw blood in the toilet and did not realize that [REDACTED] was in the toilet until the property management staff found [REDACTED] in the toilet.



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Danielle has an extremely slim build, making it unlikely that [REDACTED] would have gone unnoticed. Danielle stated that she had noticed an [REDACTED], but assumed that she was having [REDACTED]. Danielle has [REDACTED] before, but she stated that she had received [REDACTED] and therefore was unfamiliar with the sensation of [REDACTED] and assumed she was having [REDACTED].

I stood-by with the crime scene and Danielle.

Officer Jackson spoke with witnesses and property management staff, see supplement for further information.

The Child Abuse Unit responded to the scene and took over the investigation.

On 09/17/2025 I responded to [REDACTED] reference a deceased person call. The complainant was reporting that one of their clients [REDACTED] in the toilet of her room. The call text later stated that [REDACTED]. The incident took place in unit [REDACTED].

Upon arrival, Tucson Fire Department Medic 4 was on scene. Ofc Montano (202101) was speaking with them and they had advised that [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased at 1909 hours. I went to unit [REDACTED] and took field photographs of the scene. I observed a deceased [REDACTED] on the bathroom sink counter. I took field photos of room [REDACTED].

Ofc Montano detained the suspect and she was identified as Danielle Bosley. He interviewed her. See main case for more details.

I made contact with Marcellina Rojas, Kristine Lukanuski, Brandi Champion and Allison Chappell. They all advised that they were witnesses to the incident.

I spoke with Kristine. She advised that this location is transitional housing owned by the city of Tucson. Danielle checked into room [REDACTED] at approximately 1200 hours. She did not notice if she appeared [REDACTED] or not. She and the other staff do daily room checks on each resident. At approximately 1800, she checked room [REDACTED]. Danielle answered the door and advised that she had been asleep after [REDACTED]. She then went to the bathroom and observed a large amount of blood in the bathtub. She also saw the toilet bowl was full of blood and toilet paper. She contacted Marcellina at that time and called 911 shortly after. Marcellina arrived approximately 30 minutes later. She checked the toilet bowl and found [REDACTED] inside it underneath the toilet paper. She removed [REDACTED] and began conducting CPR. Tucson Fire Department and police arrived shortly after.

I spoke with Marcellina. She stated that she was at home and received a phone call from Kristine at approximately 1800 hours, advising that a client had [REDACTED]. She told Kristine to call 911 and then began driving to [REDACTED]. When she arrived, she went into unit [REDACTED] and observed a large amount of blood in the bathtub. She observed the toilet bowl was full of blood and toilet paper. She could not see [REDACTED] anywhere in plain view. She put medical gloves on and checked the toilet bowl. She pushed the toilet paper to the side and observed [REDACTED]. She removed [REDACTED] and placed it on the bathroom counter. She changed gloves and applied a new pair. She then began giving CPR. TFD and police arrived shortly after. She stated the first pair of gloves used was placed in the black trash can inside the apartment. The second pair was placed in the blue dumpster near unit [REDACTED].

Allison and Brandi arrived together after being contacted by Marcellina. They observed [REDACTED] and a large amount of blood inside the apartment. They then began assisting Danielle and provided her with a chair to sit in. Brandi advised she had to leave the scene and could not wait for detectives to arrive to be interviewed.



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I spoke with Melinda Levya who is staying in unit [REDACTED]. She stated that at approximately 1800 she heard crying coming from unit [REDACTED]. She said the crying sounded like [REDACTED].

Allison advised that unit [REDACTED] is vacant. She stated there is a resident unit [REDACTED] however I was unable to make contact with anyone there.

Sgt Sullivan was advised. Sgt Morales of the Child Abuse detective unit was advised and detectives responded to the scene and took over the investigation. I also advised Sgt Morales that my body camera battery was dead.

Allison assisted me in viewing security video. At approximately 1100 hours, Danielle checks in. She is wearing a baggy blue shirt and shorts. She was wearing the same clothes as when she was contacted by officers today. In the video I observed that she had [REDACTED] under the shirt [REDACTED] appeared consistent with that of [REDACTED]. Allison advised that she could not upload the video to AXON due to the file size. I took a video on my department issued cell phone of the security video.

I advised Sgt Morales and detectives on scene of this information. I was later relieved by Ofc Holt and left the scene.

This concluded my involvement.

On 09/17/2025, I was assigned as a Professional Staff Investigator (PSI) to the Tucson Police Department's Child Physical Abuse Unit. On the listed date at approximately 2100 hours, I was contacted by Det. Marquedant 102420 and advised that he needed assistance with a [REDACTED] death investigation at [REDACTED]. Det. Marquedant picked me up and drove me to the scene.

Upon arrival, we met with Det. Cavazos 103811 and Sgt. Morales 47531. Patrol Ofc. Jackson 101980 and Ofc. Montano 202101 then gave us an informal briefing.

After the briefing, I was tasked with interviewing the staff Kristine Lukanuski, Allison Chappell, and Marcelina Rojas.

I spoke with Kristine Lukanuski in vacant room [REDACTED]. Our conversation was audio-recorded and has been uploaded to AXON. The summary may not be in chronological order as it was disclosed, please see recording for exact details. Listed below is a synopsis of the interview:

Kristine started room checks around 6:30 pm. When she went to room [REDACTED], she knocked on the door and said "staff!" so the client knows who it is. The client, Danielle Bosley, informed her that she had not set up her kennel for her dog because she just had [REDACTED]. After [REDACTED], she went back to sleep because she wasn't feeling well. Kristine told her that it was fine that the kennel wasn't set up but she still needed to do the room check. Kristine stated that the way Danielle spoke about it, she assumed it was like [REDACTED].

This was Kristine's first interaction with Danielle. Kristine started her shift at 4:00pm which was after Danielle went through the intake process earlier that afternoon. Kristine informed Danielle that she could take a second to get clothes on and get her dog on a leash so she can enter the room and check. Danielle closed the door, took a minute to get her clothes on, then came outside with the dog.

Kristine waited outside while Danielle got dressed. She thought Danielle didn't want her to go in because Danielle kept telling her that she hadn't gotten the kennel ready. While Kristine was waiting, she started to get worried that Danielle was trying



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to hide something. It took her a couple of minutes to open the door and come out. The inn has had drug users stay there and Kristine's first thought was that Danielle was trying to stash stuff somewhere.

Kristine entered the room and went to go look towards the bathroom, which is a common place for people to hide stuff. During room checks, Kristine checks all the areas in the room. She then noticed a spot of blood on the floor near the bathroom. She pushed open the bathroom door and she saw a mound of toilet paper and blood in the toilet. Kristine realized that this was probably more than something she could flush or clean. Kristine then called her supervisor, Marci, and let her know that a client had [REDACTED]. Kristine states that, at this time, she didn't know that there was [REDACTED] in the toilet. She never looked past the toilet paper because she didn't want Danielle to try and tamper with it. Kristine didn't know what to do. Marci told Kristine to make sure Danielle doesn't touch anything in the room. Kristine offered Danielle the opportunity to sit in the room while they waited but Danielle declined. Danielle told Kristine that she would rather wait outside because it was nice outside.

Kristine left Danielle outside and finished her room checks. About 20 minutes later, Marci got to the property and they both went to check the room. Marci asked Kristine to get a bucket and a bag because they thought they were going to have to take stuff out of the toilet. Kristine went to grab the bucket and bag when Marci started to yell for her. Kristine couldn't hear her because she was already by the office. Kristine felt her phone vibrate and it was Marci calling her. Kristine was walking back when she saw Marci come out of the room and told her to "run!". Kristine ran to the room and she saw Marci pull [REDACTED] out of the bathroom and lay it on the counter. Marci told Kristine to call 911. She immediately called 911 and told the dispatcher what was going on. The dispatcher told them to begin CPR. Marci had already started CPR and Kristine remained on the phone with the dispatcher until the firefighters arrived.

Kristine believes that she started her room checks a little early, around 6:20pm. She had done a few room checks before she got to [REDACTED] and believes she knocked on the door around 6:30pm. She believes it was around that time because she called Marci at 6:34pm. .

I asked Kristine to explain the intake process to me. She stated that [REDACTED] gets referrals from different agencies. Kristine believes [REDACTED] referred Danielle to them. There are a few different ways that clients can get referred to them but all clients fill out an intake form. This form is where they get their information and any medical history. The person performing the intake explains the rules and guidelines for the shelter. After that, the client gets to go to their room and the staff leaves them to get settled in. Kristine does room checks at night and that's when she introduces herself, especially to new clients.

Danielle did not request anything during intake however, when Kristine was on the phone with Marci, Danielle requested [REDACTED] because she was [REDACTED]. Additionally, when Kristine was on the phone with 911, the dispatcher asked her to ask Danielle questions. Danielle stated that she didn't know that she [REDACTED] and she thought that it was a [REDACTED] because she had [REDACTED] before. Danielle was telling Kristine that she had [REDACTED] in 2021 and she didn't feel anything. She thought she had to [REDACTED] and she [REDACTED]. Danielle stated that she was [REDACTED].

Kristine stated that Danielle seemed like it was nothing and that's why she didn't really think of anything until Marci pulled out [REDACTED]. When Kristine was asking Danielle questions while on 911, Danielle didn't seem shaken up or upset at all.

After I finished my interview with Kristine, I went to grab Allison in the office. At some point, Danielle asked patrol if she could use the restroom and the office staff allowed her to use their restroom. Danielle left [REDACTED] in the bathroom garbage and Allison was disposing of the trash. Patrol had informed her that it was okay to do so.

I then interviewed Allison Chappell, we spoke in vacant room [REDACTED]. Our conversation was audio-recorded and has been uploaded to AXON. The summary may not be in chronological order as it was disclosed, please see recording for exact details. Listed below is a synopsis of the interview:

Allison was at [REDACTED] when Marci called at 6:59 asking her to come to [REDACTED]. Marci told Allison that Kristine called her and told her that the person in [REDACTED] had [REDACTED], when Marci got to the inn, she realized it was [REDACTED]. Marci then explained to Allison that she attempted to resuscitate [REDACTED]. Allison told Marci that she was on the way. When Allison arrived, the fire department was there. Marci and Kristine were very distraught. Allison had gone into the room to see if she could put the dog in its kennel, that's when she saw [REDACTED]. TFD said it was fine to leave the dog in there and she walked out.



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Allison observed Danielle to be outside holding her dog. Allison stated that she didn't say much when she was there. Danielle was able to move around herself. Allison overheard Danielle deny medical care, she didn't want to be poked.

██████████ shelter prioritizes families. The shelter has minimal requires to stay there and is considered a "low barrier shelter". The goal of the shelter is to meet people where they are at. The shelter even accepts pets.

Allison visually couldn't tell that Danielle was ██████████. There was nothing alarming or unusual during the intake process.

Room checks are a requirement. All clients sign a paper saying that room checks happen at least twice a day.

Allison stated that Samantha Herlien from ██████████ referred Danielle to ██████████. A name card was created with her information and a screenshot of their conversation was uploaded to AXON.

As I was finishing up my interview with Allison, Det. Marquedant knocked on the door. I went outside with Det. Marquedant and he informed me that they had done a walkthrough of the room and wanted to ask Kristine and Marci how ██████████ was laying in the toilet when they had found it. I gave him a brief synopsis of the interviews I had done so far and we decided that I would do a walkthrough of the room before I talked to Marci. I then went back into room ██████████ to let Allison know she can go back to the office and I'll grab Marci in a few minutes.

Upon entering the room, I observed two drops of blood near the doorway. I then saw a bed that was partially made with dark colored bedding. The bed had miscellaneous dog items on it that include a dog bed and dog toys. I also observed a box of blue gloves on the bed. I then observed a dark colored chair on one side of the bed and an unmade plastic dog kennel on the other side of the bed. There is a sink area and a bathroom with a door nearby. You can see blood drops around the sink and the floor of the sink area. I also observed a black trash bag, a bucket, and a blue bag filled with miscellaneous care items on the floor. On the bathroom counter I saw what appears to be ██████████. There was blood on the counter around ██████████. ██████████ was purple in color and appeared to still be covered ██████████. ██████████ was in the bathroom sink. Looking into the bathroom, I saw a trail of blood leading to the toilet and a pair of black gloves near the bathroom entrance. The toilet is full of blood and it appears to have some wet tissue paper in it. The tub also had a large amount of blood in it.

After my walkthrough of the room, I went back to the office to talk to Marci. We walked to room ██████████ where we spoke about the incident. Our conversation was audio-recorded and has been uploaded to AXON. The summary may not be in chronological order as it was disclosed, please see recording for exact details. Listed below is a synopsis of the interview:

A little after 6:30, Marci received a call from the shelter staff. Kristine was doing room checks when room ██████████ disclosed that she had ██████████. Marci didn't know the extent of the situation and was told that it's in the toilet. Marci told Kristine that she was on the way and not to flush anything. Marci got there thinking it was going to be a ██████████. She got gloves, went to the room, and talked to the girl who was sitting outside with her dog. The girl was Danielle. Marci asked her if she was aware that she was ██████████ and when was her ██████████. Danielle stated that she wasn't sure and that she ██████████ in the toilet. Marci then asked Danielle how far along she was, and Danielle stated she didn't know but she left ██████████ in the toilet. Danielle didn't want to go to the hospital or have Marci call anyone for her. Danielle remained outside when Marci went into the room. She put gloves on and went to the bathroom to see. When she walked into the bathroom, there was a pile of toilet paper in the toilet covering the bowl. Marci then asked Kristine to get a bucket so she can put the debris in there. When Marci moved the toilet paper, she saw ██████████. She yelled for Kristine. She then moved the toilet paper and saw ██████████. She grabbed ██████████ out of the toilet and put ██████████ in the sink. ██████████. Marci then went outside the room to call for Kristine. Kristine ran to her. Marci asked Danielle if she had a known that she was ██████████, Danielle said no and that she didn't feel anything. Marci couldn't understand this, she continued to ask Danielle questions. Danielle told her that she ██████████ and went back to sleep. Marci went back into the room to start CPR and Kristine called 911. Marci did compressions and breaths until paramedics showed up.

Marci described that there was only a drop of blood outside the door. Marci remembers seeing a black and blue bag that contained hygiene products on the floor near the sink area. When she looked in the bathroom, she saw that the tub had blood in it. She then described ██████████ position in the toilet. When facing the toilet ██████████ was closest to Marci. She went to grab ██████████ with her left hand and placed her right hand on ██████████, she noticed that the ██████████ so she put ██████████ down and grab ██████████ at the same time. She then took ██████████ to the bathroom counter. She then checked for a pulse. When Marci was performing CPR ██████████

She described [REDACTED] and when she was blowing air into [REDACTED]

Marci called her other staff to ask if anyone knew if Danielle was [REDACTED]. Marci explained that when the intake happened, she didn't look [REDACTED]. Sarah Lynn, who did Danielle's intake, asked Danielle if she was [REDACTED] and Danielle denied being [REDACTED]. Marci believes Danielle got to the inn around 12:30 that day.

Marci remembers [REDACTED] feeling cold. [REDACTED] didn't feel cold but she thinks it was because it was submerged in the water. [REDACTED] was pale and purple. She remembers [REDACTED] fists were closed. She didn't feel a pulse on the neck. She didn't feel any movement. [REDACTED] was lifeless.

Marci offered Danielle to go back in the room to lay down because she was concerned that she was [REDACTED]. Danielle declined. Kristine gave her [REDACTED] and she sat outside the whole time. Marci remembers Kristine asking Danielle questions.

After talking with Marci, I informed Det. Marquedant, Det. Cavazos, and Sgt. Morales of my findings. I then collected copies of Danielle's intake paperwork from Allison. I gave the paperwork to Det. Marquedant.

It should be noted that Kristine, Allison, and Marci appeared to be shocked and distraught throughout my interactions with them. During my interviews with each of them, they expressed concern about Danielle's lack of emotion.

Prior to leaving the scene, I wanted to make sure that the staff had resources to help them process the event. I gave Kristine Victim Services number. Allison and Marci informed me that they had services provided to them by the city and did not need Victim Services or their number at this time.

This concludes my involvement at this time.

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On 09/17/25, I was contacted by Sergeant Morales of the Tucson Police Department Child Physical Abuse Unit reference this incident. Sergeant Morales advised me that we would be responding to [REDACTED] reference a deceased [REDACTED] found in a toilet.

While en route I picked up Professional Staff Investigator Erica Rivera and met with Detective Cavazos and Sergeant Morales as well as patrol officers Jackson (100854) and Montano (202101) at [REDACTED] in the parking lot. Patrol officers Jackson and Montano briefed us on the incident and I learned the following: Danielle Bosley had just been admitted into the short term housing at [REDACTED], a property owned by the City of Tucson under the Housing First program. Danielle was assigned to live in [REDACTED] Danielle is [REDACTED] and prefers the name Danny, however Daniele has not legally changed her name yet and will thus be identified as Danielle in this report. Danielle had checked in around noon and completed the intake with the staff at around 1pm. Danielle was last seen going into the apartment sometime around 1pm. At approximately 7pm, staff did a routine room check as per city policy. When staff knocked on the door, Danielle initially refused entry, citing that her dog was not crated. Staff gave Danielle a few minutes to get dressed and get her dog on a leash and

After the briefing was completed I requested PSI Rivera to interviewing staff from [REDACTED] See her supplement for details about those interviews.

Warrant:

Detective Cavazos and I then obtained a telephonic search warrant (with night time exception approved) from Pima County Superior Court Judge Patricia Green. The warrant was provided to Child Physical Abuse Unit Sergeant Morales and was served at 2313. Detectives knocked and announced and then entered the residence.

I observed the following:

- Blood drops on the floor by the front entrance inside the apartment.
- A black backpack on an arm chair between the bed and the north window.
- Blood on the tile floor in front of the bathroom sink and the bathroom door.
- On the bathroom sink was [REDACTED] with EKG pads placed on the torso. [REDACTED] appeared well formed and [REDACTED], easily recognizable as [REDACTED] that was in the sink. [REDACTED] was covered in blood and other bodily fluids.
- In the bathroom was a trail of blood drops from the toilet seat to the bathroom door.
- Blood on the toilet seat and a large amount of blood and bloody toilet paper in the toilet bowl.
- The bathtub/shower curtain was closed across the bathtub. Behind the shower curtain was a large amount of blood on the floor of the bathtub.
- There was a puddle of coagulated or clotted blood at the head of the bathtub (furthest from the drain) with a trail of blood that lead to what appeared to be two circular bloody smears on both sides of the blood trail. Then a larger and wider blood trail that leads from the two circular blood smears to the drain. There were also multiple blood drops on the side of the wide blood trail towards the exit side of the bathtub.
- A blue duffle bag with hygiene products was on the floor in front of the sinks and in front of the bathroom door
- A light blue backpack was on the top shelf of the closet across from the sinks
- A black trash bag as on the floor in front of the bathroom door
- Inside the black backpack on the arm chair I located numerous medical paperwork dating back several years with Danielle's legal name and some containing [REDACTED] name of "Daniel Azrael"
- There was no paperwork located confirming the latest [REDACTED] or suspecting [REDACTED]
- Paperwork belonging to Nicholas Carrillo was found in the backpack
- A black cell phone in airplane mode was found in the front pocket of the backpack.
- Detective Cavazos found multiple unused [REDACTED] individually wrapped, see his supplement for details
- No blood was located on the bed or it's sheets
- After interviewing Danielle her blue shirt, black shorts, van tennis shoes, boxer shorts, and [REDACTED] bra was collected as evidence as well

Interview with Danielle:



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Detective Cavazos and I interviewed Danielle in the backseat of a patrol vehicle. This interview was recorded on body worn video camera as well as audibly recorded. Refer to the recordings for exact statements, below is a summary of the interview. I re-read Danielle her Miranda warning at approximately 0058 (yes and yes). It should be noted that in the course of the interview I refer to Danielle as Danny as she [REDACTED] requested to be referred to as Danny.

- Danny got to [REDACTED] around 12 pm on 9/17
- Danny was brought to [REDACTED] by [REDACTED] where she had been staying.
- After getting checked into the room, Danny was preparing to take her dog on a walk to go to the bathroom but had to go to the bathroom herself first
- Danny went to the bathroom and realized she [REDACTED] because there was blood everywhere
- Danny called for help for 2 or 3 hours from her bed but no one heard her
- I asked Danny where she [REDACTED] and she answered "in the toilet in the tub"
- Danny is really freaked out because she didn't know she was [REDACTED]
- "If I had help sooner I might have been able to save [REDACTED] life but I didn't, I didn't have any help"
- Danny does not remember the last time she had a [REDACTED]
- Danny is not [REDACTED]
- Danny last used [REDACTED] in 2018 or 2019, it caused [REDACTED]
- Danny had no suspicion of [REDACTED] she just thought she had to [REDACTED]
- When I asked Danny if she had [REDACTED] or anything else that she thought she could [REDACTED] Danny stated that she thought possibly, but didn't know if was [REDACTED] either. She also has [REDACTED] and just ran out of her medication today
- She gets medical care from El Rio, she used to get care from Banner
- The medication she takes helps [REDACTED]
- Nicholas Carrillo is [REDACTED], Nicholas is why she is homeless now.
- Nicholas might be [REDACTED]
- Danny does not remember the last time she had [REDACTED]
- Danny really thought she was having [REDACTED], a family member once had to have [REDACTED] and she has had similar issues as that family member
- Danny never felt [REDACTED] she just felt [REDACTED]
- Danny has seen doctors at El Rio but they never tested her for [REDACTED] but they were going to have her go for [REDACTED]
- I asked Danny about [REDACTED] we found in her unit, Danny said she took [REDACTED] about 4 or 5 months ago but it came back inconclusive. She hasn't had the time to check since
- I asked Danny to walk me through what happened in the bathroom in greater detail and asked her to tell me the very first thing that happened once she [REDACTED]
- Danny realized something was wrong when she got off the toilet and saw blood in the bowl
- Danny tried to not make a mess while trying to call someone for help
- The bedroom window was open and she screamed out the window for help
- Nobody ever came so she tried to be ok and laid down in bed
- She called from the bed as well and went back and forth from bed to the window but no one ever came or heard her
- Her dog woke her up because staff was knocking on the door doing the room check
- I asked Danny to go back to when she was in the bathroom, and asked her if she ever looked into the toilet
- Danny briefly looked into the toilet and then realized [REDACTED]
- She cleaned her self off with toilet paper and put the toilet paper in the toilet
- When staff did a room search they checked the bathroom and told her there was a [REDACTED]
- After cleaning herself off and putting the toilet paper in the toilet bowl, she tried to get a [REDACTED] from her hygiene bag
- Danny then went and laid down because that was the only thing she could think of
- Staff brought [REDACTED] as well later
- After putting on [REDACTED], Danny went to the bed and called for help through the window, she thinks she passed out in the bed
- The next thing she remembers is the staff at the door
- Because Danny hadn't set up the kennel yet, staff had Danny wait outside the unit with her dog while they checked the unit
- Danny stayed outside near the stairs the entire time and didn't go back inside or anywhere else
- Detective Cavazos asked Danny how blood got into the bathtub

- Danny advised that she stood up and either fell into the tub or laid trying to be ok in the tub, she didn't want to make a bigger mess because she was [REDACTED], she doesn't really remember a lot
- Danny was laying down in the tub because she couldn't sit up
- Detective Cavazos asked if [REDACTED] in the bathtub
- Danny answered that no, she didn't go to the bathtub until after she realized she was [REDACTED] and couldn't make it to get [REDACTED] so she laid in the tub for a minute
- Danny becomes upset when pushed further about [REDACTED] in the bath tub and begins to cry saying that we don't understand that she could have died if it hadn't been for her dog
- Danny is "really fucking scared because I don't know what to do at this point" and said "I tried, I tried to save [REDACTED] and I couldn't, could've died myself and I don't know what to do about it"
- When Danny got off the toilet she thought she saw movement but didn't know so she started screaming.
- By the time she was off the toilet she she couldn't stand so she laid in the bathtub and kept screaming
- Danny didn't even know she was [REDACTED] until she saw [REDACTED]
- When she got up she was going to try to walk to the office but couldn't make it that far
- Danny then fell asleep or passed out in the bed screaming for help
- Danny has a phone but it's not in service, it only connects via Wi-Fi but it's not connected to the apartments Wi-Fi
- After getting out of the bathtub, Danny just saw blood [REDACTED]
- Danny has [REDACTED] before [REDACTED]
- Danny had [REDACTED] in 2022
- [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED]
- Nicholas had assaulted her and forced her to keep [REDACTED] she didn't want to keep [REDACTED]
- She then found out that Nicholas was a registered sex offender and was forced to give her rights away to [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED], she doesn't have any contact or rights [REDACTED]
- I tell Danny tha [REDACTED]
- I again ask Danny again if she saw [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] and she stated "No, I just got told that there was [REDACTED] in there and there was blood. I didn't really want to do anything. I tried to see if I could possibly save [REDACTED] 'cause I thought I saw a heart beat and I didn't"
- When she stood up off the toilet and looked into the toilet, she thought she saw a heart beat but didn't and then fell over the bathtub.
- Danny thinks she hit her head at some point and could hear her dog whining through the bathroom door and her head was against the door
- Danny was wearing the same clothes when she [REDACTED] that she was wearing now
- Danny never checked the water in the toilet to check what she thought she saw moving in the water.
- There was too much blood to check the toilet bowl.
- When She first saw the blood she thought [REDACTED]
- When Kristine came to do the room check she told Kristine she had [REDACTED]
- Danny thought she saw a heart beat but didn't know if it was alive or dead but she knew that possibly there might have been [REDACTED] or not
- I asked Danny again why she didn't try to check the water if she thought [REDACTED] might have been in the water
- Danny answered that she tried but she couldn't stand or do anything
- Danny had been stuck on the toilet for hours screaming
- Danny also laid in bed for hours screaming and passed out multiple times
- I asked Danny what sounds [REDACTED] was making
- Danny answered "I don't know"
- I told Danny that a neighbor reported hearing [REDACTED] crying
- Danny replied that her neighbor in [REDACTED] has [REDACTED], she could hear [REDACTED] crying the entire time she was outside
- Danny hadn't even been in the unit for an hour, maybe closer to 30 minutes before she went to use the bathroom and was then screaming for at least two hours

- Danny didn't go with EMS to a hospital because she had no one to care for her dog
- If Danny had known she was [REDACTED] she would have gone to the hospital before any of this happened and would have been able to find someone to care for her dog
- Danny doesn't want to go to the hospital because she doesn't want to have to pay pacc to get her service animal back
- When asked if finding someone to care for her dog is why she didn't have [REDACTED] at a hospital, Danny states that she didn't even know that she was [REDACTED] and then states "I wasn't even gonna keep [REDACTED] anyway because I can't, I'm homeless. How does that make any sense?"
- She doesn't have any resources to care for [REDACTED] she enough resources to care for herself and her dog.
- She wouldn't have kept [REDACTED] either way "Whether I had [REDACTED] at the hospital or had [REDACTED] in that tub or the toilet. My bad"
- Danny is now more worried about losing her place because of what happened

At approximately 0206 Detective Cavazos and I contacted Judge Green to amend the warrant. Judge Green approved the amendment of the warrant permitting a search of unit [REDACTED], a storage room used by [REDACTED] to isolate clothing per their bed bug quarantine protocol, collection of all clothing currently worn by Danielle, and a forensic download of Danielle's phone, with a search window of 12/17/24 through the current date. After the warrant was amended, I explained to Danielle that the clothing she was currently wearing was included on the search warrant and would be collected. Danny protested but eventually agreed to change into other clothing which was stored in room [REDACTED] per the apartments bed bug quarantine policy. Nothing of evidentiary value was located in Unit [REDACTED] but I did bring out a pair of boxer shorts, a shirt, and pants and boots for Danielle to change into. Danielle refused to wear the boots I had located from unit [REDACTED]. Danielle continually argued about her tennis shoes and I had to warn Danielle several times that the clothing was going to be removed from her if she did not remove it herself and that she would be arrested if she did not comply with the warrant. Danielle agreed to remove the tennis shoes and comply if she could wear the slides from her apartment. I retrieved the slides from the apartment, left the boots in her apartment and collected Danielle's tennis shoes. Officer Friggle arrived and stood by with Danielle in a vacant room to change clothing. Danielle again refused to comply with the warrant, demanding that she keep her [REDACTED]. I again had to warn Danielle that all clothing was listed on the warrant and that if she failed to comply the clothing would be removed from her, and that she would be arrested. Once Danielle had changed completely, she exited the unit and was detained in handcuffs. I advised her that a doctor at the [REDACTED] had ordered that she be brought to Banner South for evaluation and medical treatment. Danielle was transported to Banner South by Officer Holt and Detective Cavazos followed and signed the [REDACTED] paperwork. Refer to Detective Cavazos warrant for details.

OME investigator Hardy (#20) arrived and took custody of [REDACTED] remains. I was advised the autopsy would be performed at 0830 on 9/18/25.

All evidence collected was transported to the Tucson Police Department Main Station at 270 S Stone and was entered into evidence.

Autopsy: The autopsy was performed on 09/18/25 by Dr Paige Peterson. I attended the autopsy and briefed Dr Peterson on the known circumstances. I watched from the observation room while Dr Peterson performed the autopsy. Upon conclusion of the autopsy Dr Peterson advised that she was unable to find any signs of trauma or injuries. Further testing was ordered and would be conducted but as of 09/18/25 there was no determined cause or manner of death. The official record and determination will be made later pending results of the tests. I was provided with a cd of the photographs taken during the autopsy and a blood / DNA patch taken from [REDACTED]. Those items were entered into evidence at the Tucson Police Department Main Station.

On 10/02/25, I received the OME Autopsy reports. I uploaded the reports to evidence.com. I reviewed the reports and noted the following (refer to records in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary

- The body is that of [REDACTED]

Follow up interviews:

Adrian Bueno: On 9/22/25, I interviewed Adrian Bueno, [REDACTED] Adrian is [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] Refer to recording in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Adrian works Monday through Fridays from 0700-1730
- Adrian is aware of an incident at unit [REDACTED] but doesn't know exactly what happened.
- On Wednesday 9/17/25 Adrian was leaving work around 1730
- Marci left at about 1645, Erica and Lexi left around 1700
- Adrian was doing a routine fire walk around the complex, walking through the inside of the property.
- The south building was supposed to be kept empty due to a Russian roach infestation
- Adrian was around [REDACTED] when he heard someone screaming from [REDACTED]
- The scream was "the most horrific fucking scream" he had ever heard, it sounded like a "witches scream" followed by a dog howling
- Adrian contacted Erica about someone being in [REDACTED] and Erica said that Marci (Marcellina) approved it
- Adrian left work and went home
- Adrian started hearing that something had happened that night in [REDACTED] and remembered hearing the scream and wanted to tell me what he had heard
- Adrian knows there is someone in [REDACTED] but doesn't know if they were home at that time
- It was about 1645 or 1700 when he heard the scream and then contacted Erica
- Erica and Lexi were upstairs on the adjacent building doing an intake with another new resident
- The scream was from an adult, it was not [REDACTED]
- The only time Adrian has heard a similar scream was when he witnessed [REDACTED] get hit by a trolley at the Winter Haven Christmas light event. He was right next to [REDACTED] when [REDACTED] was hit and the scream from [REDACTED] sounded very similar
- Adrian is not allowed to enter the units per policy unless he has a work order to fix something inside
- The only people Adrian noticed outside at the time was Erica and Lexi, no residents were outside
- Adrian didn't call 911

Melinda Leyva: On 9/22/25, I interviewed Melinda Leyva, a resident at [REDACTED] Refer to recording in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Melinda lives in [REDACTED] with [REDACTED]
- Melinda had gotten home around 1800 hours with [REDACTED]
- Melinda stopped at the office first, then got to her unit at about 1815
- Melinda was carrying all her bags and pushing a stroller with [REDACTED] inside
- Melinda did not know anyone was inside [REDACTED], a previous tenant was a woman with [REDACTED] but had moved out
- Melinda entered her apartment leaving the stroller with [REDACTED] outside
- Melinda out down her bags inside the apartment
- Melinda heard [REDACTED] crying from outside the apartment and went to [REDACTED] in the stroller
- [REDACTED] was not crying but she could still hear [REDACTED] crying
- [REDACTED] cry sounded like distress
- When she first heard the cry and thought it was [REDACTED] she thought maybe something had bit her or hurt her
- The crying lasted maybe a minute or two
- Melinda went into her apartment and could not hear the crying anymore
- Kristine had done a room check with her room around 7pm



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- Melinda left her apartment around 7 or 715 and saw Danielle sitting outside with her dog, and staff member was on the phone, TFD arrived a few minutes later
- Danielle did not say anything, she was just holding her dog, face to face with the dog
- Danielle seemed unemotional, just staring into space
- Melinda heard a staff member say that they found something
- Melinda had not consumed any alcohol or drugs or anything that would impair her memory or make her hear anything that wasn't there
- Melinda heard on Thursday that a [REDACTED] had heard screaming come from the apartment prior to her hearing [REDACTED] crying
- Nobody has told Melinda what to say or what not to say and no one has made any promises or threats about her talking to police about what she heard.

Erica Dallo: On 9/22/25, I interviewed Erica Dallo, [REDACTED] Refer to recording in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Erica does intakes for new residents at [REDACTED]
- The housing at [REDACTED] is transitional and limited to 30 days, but can be expanded to 60 days for certain circumstances
- Danielle was dropped off by [REDACTED] on 9/17/25 along with her dog and belongings
- Danielle told Erica that she was [REDACTED] during the intake and was dealing with [REDACTED]
- When asked during the intake, Danielle disclosed that she was [REDACTED]
- There was no discussion of [REDACTED], it's not a question they ask verbally but it is a question on the questionnaire that applicants fill out
- Danielle had checked that she was [REDACTED] on the questionnaire
- Danielle had [REDACTED] but was not enough for her to ask if she was [REDACTED]
- After the intake another coworker, Sarah Shearl, asked Erica "is that [REDACTED]" Erica told the coworker she didn't really think so
- Danielle was skinny, looked like she had been homeless for a while
- They went over the intake paperwork and went over the rules of the property
- They put some of her belongings into a "hotbox tent" in [REDACTED] for bed bug protocol
- Erica helped Danielle carry her dog kennel to unit [REDACTED] and that was the last she saw of Danielle that night
- While speaking to Erica I noticed a security camera monitor showing the security camera feeds, Erica pointed out a camera that captures Unit [REDACTED] and advised that there was no audio recording done by the cameras
- Erica estimates that Danielle was probably done moving into unit [REDACTED] by about 1330
- [REDACTED] staff told Erica that Danielle's dog had been abnormally aggressive on 9/16 and that was one of the reasons she couldn't stay there anymore
- Erica believed the dog was still acting aggressive on 9/17
- Erica wonders if the dog knew Danielle [REDACTED] and was being protective of her
- After Danielle's intake, Erica helped with another intake
- Erica didn't see Danielle walking the property or again after she went to unit [REDACTED] around 1330

Sarah Shearl: On 09/24/2025, I performed a telephonic interview with [REDACTED], Sarah Shearl. The interview was recorded and uploaded to evidence.com. Refer to recording in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Sarah was working at [REDACTED] on 9/17/25 and saw Danielle when she arrived at [REDACTED]
- Sarah immediately recognized that Danielle was [REDACTED]
- Sarah has [REDACTED] herself
- Sarah noticed that Danielle was thin but had [REDACTED]
- Danielle did not appear to be in any distress or pain



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- Sarah had very minimal contact with Danielle
- Sarah left for lunch shortly after Danielle arrived and when she came back from lunch break, Danielle was placing belongings in the hot box in unit [REDACTED]
- Sarah thinks she said hi and introduced herself but isn't sure
- Sarah did not ask Danielle about [REDACTED] or say anything about it
- Sarah thinks she probably would have mentioned that she suspected Danielle [REDACTED] to Erica but she isn't sure
- Sarah was 100 % positive that Danielle [REDACTED] the moment she saw Danielle arrive
- Sarah doesn't think she did a fire walk that day, she didn't remember going by [REDACTED] after 1300
- Sarah never heard screaming coming from the apartment and no one told her that day about anyone screaming in [REDACTED]
- Nobody has told Sarah what to say or what not to say and no one has made any promises or threats about her talking to police about what she heard.
- I asked Sarah if she could pass my phone number on to her coworker "Lexi" Sarah advised that Lexi was working that day and handed her the phone to talk to me

Alexis Austin: The interview with Alexis (Lexi) Austin was recorded on the same recording as Sarah's interview, refer to that recording in evidence.com for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Lexi is [REDACTED]
- She worked at [REDACTED] from 0730 until 1145 then returned to [REDACTED] from 1300-1545 or 1600
- She very briefly saw Danielle when she arrived at Wildcat but Lexi was on her way to handle an incident on another property so she didn't pay any attention to Danielle
- Lexi helped Erica with an intake that after 1300 but did not hear any screaming or talk to anyone about any screaming from [REDACTED]
- Lexi left the property around 1545 or maybe 1600, no one told her about any screaming coming from [REDACTED] at that point either.

Nicholas Carrillo [REDACTED]: Nicholas Carrillo is currently incarcerated in Arizona Department of Corrections. Nicholas was incarcerated on 06/23/2025 and is currently service a sentence of 0.75 years.

Brandi Champion: On 09/24/25, I contacted Brandi Champion and conducted a telephonic interview with her which was audibly recorded and later uploaded to evidence.com. Refer to the recording for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- Brandi is [REDACTED]
- Brandi was at a Ward 3 meeting with Allison Chappell when Allison was got a call from Marci about what happened at [REDACTED]
- Allison left immediately, Brandi followed a few minutes later
- Brandi arrived at about 1905 and saw TFD was on scene but no police had arrived yet
- Brandi saw Danielle sitting down, hugging her dog
- Brandi asked Danielle if she was ok and Danielle said she was
- Brandi went into apartment [REDACTED] and saw [REDACTED] on the sink counter with the pads from TFD on its chest
- Brandi took a picture of [REDACTED] on her cell phone and also took a picture of the bathroom and toilet on her phone
- Brandi sent me the three pictures she took on her phone
- Marci texted Brandi pictures that she had taken of [REDACTED] when she found it in the toilet. Brandi sent me those pictures as well.
- Brandi was told by Marci and Kristine that Danielle claimed to have [REDACTED] but she does not believe Danielle's recounting of the incident
- [REDACTED] didn't look like [REDACTED]
- Brandi also doesn't believe Danielle's account because [REDACTED]
- In Brandi's experience [REDACTED], it takes a few minutes [REDACTED]
- Brandi also doesn't believe there was enough blood in the toilet for [REDACTED] in the toilet



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Maricella second interview: I called Maricella again and spoke to her over the phone with some follow up questions. The interview was recorded and later uploaded to evidence.com. Refer to the recording for exact statements, below is a summary of that interview.

- When Maricella entered the bathroom the toilet paper inside the bowl was white and dry
- Maricella moved the dry white toilet paper over to the side of the bowl and the toilet paper became saturated with the bloody water
- Maricella immediately saw [REDACTED] sticking out of the water with [REDACTED] in the drain of the toilet
- Maricella put one hand under [REDACTED] and took two pictures of [REDACTED] before taking it out of the toilet
- Maricella picked up [REDACTED] came up out of the toilet with [REDACTED] as well
- Maricella placed [REDACTED] in the sink
- Maricella sent the pictures to Brandi but has deleted the pictures from her own phone

Video surveillance:

On 09/22/25, I requested Technology Investigations Unit CSO Garcia (105120) assist me with this investigation by downloading the video surveillance from [REDACTED] for times between 11am and approximately 7:16pm when Officers arrived on scene. I was advised later that same day that the video footage was obtained and uploaded to evidence.com. It should be noted that the video footage is motion activated so there are gaps in time between the video clips. Also per CSO Garcia the time stamp on the video footage was 1 second slower than the current time.

On 09/23/25, I reviewed the footage obtained by CSO Garcia and noted the following.

1. "South Center" camera.

This camera records west along the southern walkway of the apartment complex. At the far end of the sidewalk, apartment [REDACTED] the incident location, is clearly seen. This is the only camera the records Unit [REDACTED]

- Danielle is seen walking with her dog at approximately 1208 with staff towards unit [REDACTED] Danielle goes into the unit with her dog and then leaves the dog in the unit to go back towards the office walking behind the staff member. Danielle makes several trips to apartment [REDACTED] between 1208 and 1243. Danielle is seen carrying duffle bags, a dog kennel, backpack and multiple other items into unit [REDACTED] with the assistance of the staff member.
- In file **D01_20250917123906.mp4**, at approximately 1239, Danielle is seen walking towards the office, a clear visual of her face is recorded and [REDACTED]. Danielle has a thin / slender frame, but [REDACTED]. The blue t shirt [REDACTED] while lying loose around her arms and shoulders.
- Danielle and staff are seen taking Danielle's hamper and duffel bag into unit [REDACTED] at about 1240 and then talk outside of unit [REDACTED] for a few minutes.
- In file **D01_20250917124341.mp4** at about 1243 Danielle is seen walking to unit [REDACTED] alone.
- Adrian Bueno is seen walking rounds through the apartment complex parking lot and along the sidewalks from 1641 through 1706
- In file **D02_20250917165850.mp4** at about 1658 Adrian is seen getting trash out of the back of a City of Tucson white pickup truck parked near a dumpster and in front of the camera Adrian does not appear to hear or react to anyone screaming
- In file **D02_20250917172833.mp4** at about 1728 Kristine is seen taking trash to the dumpster in the corner of the parking lot nearest unit [REDACTED] Kristine does not appear to notice any one screaming or react to hearing screaming,
- In file **D02_20250917172858.mp4** another staff member joins Kristine at the dumpster throwing trash away, she also does not seem to hear any screaming or react to any screams
- In file **D02_20250917172916.mp4** the two employees leave out of view of the camera
- In file **D01_20250917175440.mp4**, at 1754 hours, Melinda Leyva is seen walking towards her unit [REDACTED], pushing a stroller with [REDACTED] walking next to her. There is no video footage of Melinda entering her apartment or approaching the door.



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- In file **D01_20250917183023.mp4** at 1830 hours, staff is seen knocking on the door to unit [REDACTED]
- In file **D01_20250917183133.mp4** at 1831 hours, staff is at the door which appears to be cracked open and then closes. Staff waits outside the door
- In file **D01_20250917183339.mp4**, at 1833, Danielle is seen standing outside of the unit with her dog. Staff is not visible in the footage
- In file **D01_20250917183422.mp4**, at 1834, Staff is now outside of the unit appearing to be talking on her cell phone. The apartment door is open
- In file **D01_20250917183427.mp4**, at 1834 staff walks away from unit still on phone.
- In file **D01_20250917183544.mp4**, at 1835 the staff member returns to the apartment
- In file **D01_20250917184056.mp4**, at 1840 the apartment door is still open, staff member is knocking on the door to unit [REDACTED] north of unit [REDACTED]
- In file **D01_20250917185545.mp4**, at 1855 two female employees enter the apartment
- In file **D01_20250917185804.mp4**, at 1858 the original staff member can be seen running towards unit [REDACTED] with a trash bag
- In file **D01_20250917185929.mp4**, at 1859, both staff members are outside of the apartment talking
- In file **D01_20250917190004.mp4**, at 1900 staff are seen exiting unit [REDACTED] and reentering [REDACTED]
- In file **D01_20250917190032.mp4**, at 1900 one staff member is inside unit [REDACTED] and one is outside [REDACTED]
- In file **D01_20250917190503 .mp4**, at 1905 TFD pulls into the parking lot
- In file **D01_20250917190603.mp4**, at 1906 TFD begins to enter unit [REDACTED]

There is no footage of Danielle entering the apartment after she exits for staff to check the unit at approximately 1833 and the door remains open as well. There is a dark shape behind a large white City of Tucson work truck that remains throughout the time period, possibly Danielle or her dog.

None of the other cameras show any visual of apartment [REDACTED]

Cellphone search: On 09/25/2025, I received the cell phone download report from the Tucson Police Department Forensic Electronic Media Unit. I took custody of the physical cell phone as well. A search through the phone and the download revealed the following:

Videos:

- A 15 second video timestamped 09/16/2025 at 2035 hours, The video shows Danielle laying in bed on her side. A captions reads "Evening mood" the video pans down from her face to focus on her stomach which is exposed by her t shirt being pulled up to her chest. The video focuses on her stomach for approximately 14 seconds. Nothing is said but Danielle can be heard breathing and her stomach extends with her breathing.

Pictures:

- A picture time stamped 9/16/2025 at 2012 hours. Danielle is laying in bed, lifting the front of her t shirt up to expose [REDACTED] while she looks into the camera.
- A picture time stamped 09/16/2025 at 1630 hours. Danielle is standing in front of a bathroom mirror taking a selfie. She is wearing a blue t-shirt that is [REDACTED] but baggie everywhere else
- A picture timestamped 09/13/2025 at 2212 hours, Danielle is standing in front of a bathroom mirror taking a selfie. She is wearing a grey t shirt with a logo that says "Bingham" on the front. She is lifting the bottom of her shirt and exposing [REDACTED]
- A picture time stamped 07/30/2025 at 0930. Danielle is taking a bathroom mirror selfie. Danielle is topless with one hand covering her chest and the other hand holding the phone. Danielle's [REDACTED]
- A picture timestamped on 7/12/2025 at 2326 hours. A picture of Danielle laying down, her face is not visible, but a black t shirt is pulled up to the chest with one hand between the belly and chest. [REDACTED]

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- A picture timestamped 05/26/2025 at 0320 hours. Danielle is taking a bathroom mirror selfie. The mirror is covered in steam or condensation, Danielle is nude with one hand covering her chest. Though the mirror is blurred with condensation [REDACTED] is visible in the picture

Messages:

- In a Facebook message between Danielle (Screen name [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] on 7/13/2025 at 08:32pm [REDACTED] writes "And if you're [REDACTED] you really can't be here anyways shocker I know it don't I"
- On 09/01/2025 at 0939am, in a Facebook message between Danielle (Screen name [REDACTED] and [REDACTED], Danielle wrote "Yikes ! I am partially afraid that when this individual gets out of prison, the first thing that they're going to do is try to drag me down further in their life, come to find out they ditched probation when they were on documented paperwork stating they were supposed to be there, they asked their mom for a greyhound , and got me [REDACTED] and I damn near [REDACTED]"

TFD Interviews: On 09/24/2025, I contacted TFD and was advised that the four TFD personnel that had responded to [REDACTED] on 09/17/2025, James Kelaher, Welsey Bell, Cam Welander, Jonathan Black, would not all be back on duty at the same time until Tuesday 9/30, but they would be available for interviews. On 09/30/25, Detective Cavazos and I met with Captain Kelaher (#32804), and fire fighters Wesley Bell (50996), Cam Welander, Jonathan Black, and Heriberto Gonzalez (105942) at TFD station 4. Refer to recordings for exact statements, below is a summary of the interviews I conducted with Captain Kelaher, and firefighters Gonzalez and Bell. Refer to Detective Cavazos supplement for his interviews with Cam Welander, Jonathan Black and Chad Munn.

TFD Captain James Kelaher (TFD employee #32804)

- On 9/17/25, Station 4 were dispatched at [REDACTED] for a report of [REDACTED]
- Upon arriving they were directed to [REDACTED] by staff who were there
- Captain Kelaher noticed a female sitting with a dog outside the door to [REDACTED]
- He noticed a couple drops of blood by the front door and a significant amount of blood drops on the floor between the sink and the bathroom door
- Captain Kelaher then viewed a female standing near by [REDACTED] on the counter. The female had stopped doing CPR at this point
- Captain Kelaher asked the female if she had ever felt a pulse or seen any signs of life, the female told him she had not
- Firefighters Welander and Black began assessing [REDACTED] airway and initiating care
- Captain Kelaher put the EKG monitor leads on [REDACTED], the reading was "asystole"
- Captain Kelaher asked the staff member how long they had been there but he never got an answer
- Captain Kelaher asked a when she had been called to intervene and the staff member said about 630pm
- Captain Kelaher noted it had been over 30 minutes since staff first became aware of [REDACTED] and they decided to withhold any further resuscitation
- Captain Kelaher noted [REDACTED] was very cold to the touch, the skin was "pruned" from the exposure to the toilet water
- [REDACTED] was no longer considered a viable patient so they ceased resuscitation
- They then evacuated the room and waited for police to arrive
- Staff told Captain Kelaher that the female (Danielle) had been processed by the staff to stay at [REDACTED] about 4 or 5 hours before they called 911
- Captain Kelaher and paramedic Munn turned their attention to Danielle to check for [REDACTED]



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- Danielle told Captain Kelaher that 2 hours earlier she had to [REDACTED] and noticed [REDACTED] but she didn't have a cell phone to call for help and she could walk down to the office for help either
- Captain Kelaher was not sure how Danielle finally got help or got 911 called for her
- Danielle was assessed by TFD and she reported that she was no longer [REDACTED]
- Danielle's vitals were stable and was advised to go to the hospital for treatment and evaluation but she refused
- Captain Kelaher told Danielle about possible complications and concerns and she continued to refuse treatment
- TPD then arrived and took over the scene
- I asked clarifying questions about the care given to [REDACTED]
- Captain Kelaher advised that no CPR, either chest compressions or rescue breaths or any other type of oxygen was performed by TFD
- The pads on [REDACTED] only read the heart electrical signals, they never used a AED or delivered a electrical shock to try to restart [REDACTED] heart.
- When Captain Kelaher arrived, [REDACTED] was on the counter between the sinks, [REDACTED] was in the sink on the left and [REDACTED] head was near the wall, and it's feet at the edge of the counter
- Danielle never told Captain Kelaher what happened in the two hours between when she had to [REDACTED] and when TFD arrived, she just said she couldn't make it to the office.
- Danielle never reported losing consciousness or passing out to TFD
- Danielle denied recent drug or alcohol use
- Danielle seemed more concerned about her dog and didn't want PACC coming to take her dog if she went to the hospital and denied having any medical needs
- Staff told Captain Kelaher that when they entered the bathroom they saw the blood in the toilet and the inside of the toilet bowl was covered in toilet paper. When staff moved the toilet paper they saw [REDACTED] then she removed [REDACTED] and began CPR
- Captain Kelaher did not enter the bathroom, he didn't want to disturb the scene

Heriberto Gonzalez (TFD Employee #105942)

- Heriberto responded to [REDACTED] in Medic 4 and arrived after Ladder 4
- When he arrived Captain Kelaher was walking out of the apartment and told him the patient inside was deceased
- Heriberto walked towards the unit and saw a woman (Danielle) leaning over a railing by [REDACTED]
- Danielle didn't seem to be in pain, but kept asking them to turn off the lights from the trucks because they were bugging her
- Heriberto saw two city employees in the apartment as well as two firefighters
- The apartment was small so he didn't step inside, the other firefighters were not actively resuscitating [REDACTED]
- Heriberto began evaluating Danielle, and asking to check her vitals
- Danielle was refusing to be assessed or have her vitals taken
- Danielle was very quick to make sure they knew she [REDACTED]
- They got Danielle a chair to sit in and that's when her dog began yelping and crying at them, they didn't want to get bit by the dog while taking Danielle's vitals so they separated the dog from Danielle temporarily.
- They ended up taking her vitals, they seemed stable
- They tried to convince Danielle to go to the hospital but she refused any care or to be transported
- Danielle said this was not the first time she had [REDACTED] and that she felt fine
- Danielle said that she had been screaming for help while in the apartment but no one ever came
- Heriberto overheard on scene that [REDACTED] staff had checked on Danielle and found the trail of blood to the bathroom, and then found [REDACTED] submerged in water under toilet paper. Staff then did compressions until Ladder 4 arrived on scene and took over and that [REDACTED] skin was "prune" from being submerged in water

Wesley Bell (TFD Employee #50996) Detective Cavazos joined me as I interviewed Wesley

- Wesley was the driver for Ladder 4 as they responded to [REDACTED]
- Wesley's drove the Ladder truck while everyone else was prepping the tools and equipment needed

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- Wesley was the last one in the apartment, Captain Kelaher, Cam Welander and Jonathan Black were first in the apartment.
- As soon as Wesley stepped into the apartment everyone else was leaving so he walked out too.
- Wesley took a few steps, maybe 10 feet, into the apartment but never entered the sink area or the bathroom
- Wesley never interacted with Danielle or [REDACTED] staff members
- Wesley did notice that Danielle was very nonchalant and only concerned about the dog
- Based off of past calls that were similar, Wesley expected to see Danielle be distraught or upset but she wasn't
- Wesley did not move or bring anything into the apartment

I received two PCR's one for Danielle and one for [REDACTED]. The PCR's were uploaded to evidence.com. See evidence.com for exact details of the reports, below is a summary of those reports.

- On 3/25/24, TFD engine 13 and TFD paramedic 13 were dispatched at 1439 hours to 1250 S Pantano Rd Tucson, AZ 85710 (QuikTrip) for a [REDACTED] call
- TFD arrived at 1444 hours
- Danielle was lying on floor of the bathroom with [REDACTED] on the floor"
- Danielle advised that she had learned she was [REDACTED] in September of 2024 and had not been receiving [REDACTED]
- Preparations were under way to place Danielle on a gurney when [REDACTED]
- Preparations were changed to [REDACTED]
- Within 2 minutes Danielle felt [REDACTED]
- Approximately 1 minute later Danielle [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED] on scene or during transport
- Danielle agreed to be transported to a hospital, TFD transported Danielle and [REDACTED] to Tucson Medical Center, 5301 E Grant Rd, Tucson Arizona, for [REDACTED]



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- Transport started at 1504 hours and arrived at TMC at 1539 hours
- The report noted [REDACTED]
- The report noted "Crew member of Engine 13 held [REDACTED] en route as [REDACTED] did not feel ready to [REDACTED] herself"
- TFD transferred care of Danielle and [REDACTED] to TMC staff and went back in service at 1605 hours.
- TFD advised TMC nurses that Danielle advised she was [REDACTED] and used [REDACTED] prior to leaving

DCS History:

Danielle had a previous DCS case IN10494737 documenting Danielle [REDACTED] at the QT on 3/25/24, TMC called in the DCS report after [REDACTED] was ultimately removed from Danielle's custody permanently [REDACTED]. There was an additional DCS case documenting [REDACTED] at Banner Desert Medical Center in Mesa Arizona also [REDACTED]

Body Worn Video Camera review:

On 10/04/2025, I reviewed the body worn video camera of all officers that responded to the incident. I noted that during Officer Montano's body worn video footage, as he interviewed Danielle, she told Officer Montano at approximately 1927 hours "I didn't know what was going on. Um, I didn't know what was going on with my body. All I knew was I was trying to [REDACTED]. And next thing I know there's [REDACTED] underneath me." Officer Montano then read's Danielle Miranda Warning. Officer Montano then asks Danielle if she saw [REDACTED] in the toilet, and Danielle states "Yes, I think at one point I, I had was not all the way here, I think I might have tried to check to see if it was breathing"

When asked if she tried to take [REDACTED] out of the toilet she stated "I wasn't able to stand to even try, I was like on the floor in the tub trying to breathe. I don't, I don't really remember a lot." When asked if she tried to grab [REDACTED] Danielle answered "I tried the CPR so you can move it, but it wasn't breathing, so I didn't know what to do at that point and I was still [REDACTED] while trying to do that too. S, I, I don't really remember a lot. I know I don't remember like crying or anything or like a heartbeat. I just remember trying to see if [REDACTED] was even alive, realized I was [REDACTED] and then kind of fell over." "And once I fell over I think I did pass out at that point because my head hurts. I might have hit my head on the bathroom door. Once I was conscious I grabbed [REDACTED] because I was [REDACTED] on the floor." Danielle later tells Officer Montano that she didn't recognize [REDACTED] versus [REDACTED] because she had [REDACTED]. This statement is inconsistent with her known medical history of having a [REDACTED] in a QT bathroom.

Medical Consult with Doctor Woolridge

On 10/03/25, I attended a medical consult with Dr Woolridge, [REDACTED]. I provided Dr Woolridge with the autopsy reports and briefed him on the known and reported circumstances. Dr Woolridge also reviewed the pictures taken of the scene by crime scene and officers/detectives. Dr Woolridge advised that he would prepare a consult report on [REDACTED] letter head.

On 10/08/2025, I received the consult report from Dr Woolridge. I uploaded the report to evidence.com. See report in evidence.com for exact statements below is a summary of that report.

Dr Woolridge noted that the following in his assessment

- "quantity of blood staining suggest [REDACTED] occurred in the bathtub and [REDACTED] was transferred to the toilet."
- "The 23 yo female [REDACTED] noted in interview that there was a heartbeat and was indicated movement in the toilet water suggesting such."
- "Adjacent resident noted hearing [REDACTED] cry ~ 1 hour prior to discovering the deceased [REDACTED]"

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- "These events suggest that [REDACTED] and lived for an unknown amount of time [REDACTED]
- "The above events and the fact that the 23 year old had undergone [REDACTED] indicate that [REDACTED] understood the physical needs of [REDACTED] intentionally transferred [REDACTED] to the toilet and failed to seek help for [REDACTED] The subsequent death of [REDACTED] was therefore directly contributed to by the delay in delivering care or seeking outside help in a timely manner."

On 10/23/25, I had another consult with Dr Woolridge regarding what possible needs [REDACTED] would require immediately after [REDACTED] Dr Woolridge amended his original consult and added the following:

- "Phonation (crying), as mentioned previously, serves as a clinical indicator of viability following [REDACTED] by demonstrating respiratory effort. Subsequent respiratory failure following [REDACTED] is a primary contributor to [REDACTED] death. (Lee, et.al, 2020). Supporting [REDACTED] through the [REDACTED] process necessitates warming and stimulating [REDACTED] to ensure ongoing respiration. These activities are often intuitive to a [REDACTED] and is performed through simple handling and holding of [REDACTED] In the absence of such [REDACTED] activities, apnea (lack of breathing) becomes more likely. Adding to this contribution to [REDACTED] death is the issue of hypothermia. Hypothermia directly contributes to apnea (respiratory failure). (Lei, 2023). In this situation, [REDACTED] placed in water well below body temperature would result in a rapid development of hypothermia. As hypothermia is known to cause apnea (respiratory failure) this event accelerated respiratory failure and [REDACTED] death. Considered collectively, the failure of [REDACTED] to administer the routine care events of: lack of drying, lack of stimulation, lack of warming, directly contributed to the death of [REDACTED]

On 09/17/2025, I was assigned to the Child Physical Abuse Unit. I was contacted by Sgt. E. Morales at approximately 2049 hours and was advised to respond to [REDACTED] reference an ongoing child abuse investigation.

Initial Observations

I arrived on scene at approximately 2135 hours. The location was [REDACTED] which is a hotel that was converted into city housing. There was patrol vehicles parked in the parking lot. I observed a uniformed officer standing by outside of unit [REDACTED] which was a ground level unit, on the southwest corner of the complex.

Briefing

I made contact with Officers J. Montano and J. Jackson. Det. B. Marquedant and Sgt. Morales arrived on scene shortly after. Officers Montano and Jackson provided a briefing. I was advised of the following, which is summarized/paraphrased to my understanding:

- The created at 1901 hours. Officers arrived on scene at 1916 hours. Tucson Fire Department Med 4 had arrived on scene and determined [REDACTED] to be deceased at 1909 hours.
- DCS was contacted reference the incident (10734333).



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- [REDACTED] was identified as Danielle Bosley.
- Witnesses were identified as Kristine Lukanuski, Marcellina Rojas, Allison Chappell, Brandi Champion, and Melinda Leyva.
- Today around noon, Danielle checked into the city housing and interacted with Kristine, who was a city employee. Danielle was assigned unit [REDACTED]. Danielle was alone.
- Around 1800 hours Kristine did a routine check and knocked on Danielle's door.
- Danielle answered the door and appeared groggy. Danielle advised Kristine that she had [REDACTED].
- Kristine saw blood in the bathroom and toilet. Kristine called her coworker, Marcellina. Marcellina was off property and took about 30 minutes to arrive.
- Marcellina put gloves on began looking through the toilet. Marcellina saw [REDACTED] in the toilet. Marcellina pulled [REDACTED] out and put [REDACTED] on the counter, then began CPR.
- Kristine called 911, Allison, and Brandi.
- Prior to Danielle checking into the city housing, Kristine had asked Danielle medical questions. Danielle had not disclosed [REDACTED].
- DCS had advised that Danielle had been [REDACTED]. Danielle previously [REDACTED] in a QT bathroom on a previous occasion.
- Danielle had been advised of her Miranda Rights by Ofc. Montano and had responded yes and yes.
- Danielle stated to police that she did not know she was [REDACTED]. Danielle had been experiencing [REDACTED].
- Two hours after checking into the city housing, Danielle had gone to [REDACTED]. Danielle saw [REDACTED] in the toilet, then jumped off the toilet.
- Danielle saw [REDACTED] in the toilet and tried to render aide. Danielle was [REDACTED], so she held [REDACTED] to herself and laid down in bed for one to two hours.
- Danielle was unable to get up until the staff knocked on the door and saw [REDACTED].
- Danielle was currently on [REDACTED].
- Danielle stated [REDACTED].
- Danielle did not have a phone.

I walked up to unit [REDACTED], where an officer was standing by outside. The door was open. I observed Danielle was seated on the sidewalk near a stairwell. Danielle's dog was leashed to the railing of the stairwell.

It should be noted that throughout my time on scene, I interacted with the dog a significant amount. The dog was a large dark colored dog. I observed the dog was extremely friendly and well-tempered.

Search Warrant

I contacted Pima County Superior Court Judge Patricia Green, with Det. Marquedant standing by as a witness. I applied for a telephonic search warrant, including the nighttime exception, which was granted.

Search Warrant Service

Danielle had been moved to the back of a patrol vehicle. I advised Danielle that I had obtained a search warrant.

By the stairwell, where Danielle had been seated, there was a light blood splotch.

The warrant was served at 2313 hours, by knocking and announcing. Sgt. Morales was present for the service of the warrant. Crime Scene Specialist N. Devitt was present and took overall pictures, the apartment was searched, and additional photographs were taken.

Upon entering the apartment, I observed the apartment was a studio apartment, with a bed, chair, two dressers and a TV in the living room. The living room led into a sink area with two sinks, a mini fridge, microwave and an area to hang clothes. To the right of the sink area, there was a door leading to a toilet and bathtub/shower.

In the apartment, through the search, I observed the following, which appeared significant:

- The apartment appeared recently moved into, as bags and containers were still packed up.



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- There were few blood droplets in the living room.
- In the sink area, there was blood droplets leading from the bathroom to the sink.
- A deceased [REDACTED] was laying on [REDACTED] back, on the counter, between the sinks. [REDACTED] and was placed in the sink to the left of [REDACTED]
- There was a black metal chair, black bucket and blue duffle bag on the floor next to the sink.
- In the bathroom, there were blood droplets on the floor.
- The toilet had a significant amount of blood in it and bloody toilet paper. There were droplets on the seat, consistent with watered down blood. There was a blood droplet on the wall to the right of the toilet.
- A smeared bloody footprint could be seen near the base of the toilet to the right.
- The bathtub had a large amount of blood in it as well. There appeared to be projectile blood droplets in the opposite end of the tub as the drain. [REDACTED] was next to the projectile blood droplets.
- A bloody footprint was next to the [REDACTED], as well as smearing, consistent with someone squatting. The dried blood was then seen flowing towards the drain without additional smears.
- The bed was still made with the top left corner of the comforter pulled down. There was a large dog bed, metal kennel door, dog supplies and a box of gloves on the bed.
- CSS Devitt and I inspected the bed sheets and did not locate any blood.
- I located four unopened [REDACTED], in a black bag, which was in a plastic bag on the sink counter.

See Det. Marquedant's supplement for further regarding the search. I contacted OME.

Danielle Bosley

Det. Marquedant and I conducted an interview with Danielle, who was seated in the back of a patrol vehicle. Danielle was not detained in handcuffs. Det. Marquedant stood outside the rear opened driver's side door. I sat in the driver's seat with the partition opened. I observed Danielle did not have a large amount of blood on her. Danielle [REDACTED] preferred to be called Danny. I observed Danny had many inconsistencies in her statement. Danny became emotional during the interview. Danny made several statements reference her primary concern being her dog going to PACC, and [REDACTED] possibly having a chance of survival, if it had gotten help. Danny made statements that she did not want [REDACTED] and could not take care of [REDACTED]. Danny also stated she laid down in the tub after [REDACTED], while wearing the same clothes she was wearing, which I found improbable due to the lack of blood on her clothing.

A significant statement Danny made was "If I had help sooner, I might've been able to save [REDACTED] if I, but I didn't. I didn't have any help."

Danny was later asked if she didn't want to go to the hospital after having [REDACTED], due to having no one to take care of her dog. Danny replied, "No. It's because I don't want to have to sit here and pay to get my service animal back." Danny would have not trusted anyone at the hotel with her dog.

Danny later stated, "The most I have is resources for my dog and myself. There's no way I would've even been able to keep [REDACTED] either way. Whether I had [REDACTED] at the hospital or had [REDACTED] in that tub. Oh, the toilet, my bad."

See Det. Marquedant's narrative for details or the recording.

Warrant Amendment

Det. Marquedant located a cell phone in the apartment during the search. I contacted Judge Green and requested an amendment to the search warrant, which was granted and Det. Marquedant stood by as a witness.

Det. Marquedant and I briefly viewed security footage, to see what belongings Danielle had with her, when she arrived at the hotel. Det. Marquedant and I searched Danielle's belongings, which were located in a communal storage unit [REDACTED] which was covered under the amended search warrant. A change of clothes was located for Danielle.

[REDACTED]

I contacted the [REDACTED] and obtained an [REDACTED] from PA Khensouri at 0245 hours. After Danielle's clothes had been collected and she had changes, Danielle was advised she was going to [REDACTED]. Danielle began screaming

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in reference to her being separated from her dog and was pulling away from officers. I assisted in maintaining control of Danielle's left arm, until she was detained in handcuffs, by Ofc. T. Holt.

Ofc. Holt transported Danielle to Banner South. Once Danielle was at the Banner South Emergency Room, I went to [REDACTED] and completed [REDACTED]. I returned to the Banner South and turned the [REDACTED] in. I advised Danielle that detectives had a search warrant to forensically download her phone. I advised her that without her phone's password, there was a possibility that her phone would be damaged. Danielle eventually provided the password, which I provided to Det. Marquedant with the password. [REDACTED] was documented under TPD Case P2509180018.

09/18/2025

On 09/18/2025 I attended the autopsy which was conducted by Dr. Peterson. I left the autopsy prior to its completion to attend a forensic interview for a separate investigation.

Search Warrant Return

I went to Pima County Superior Court and returned the search warrant to Pima County Superior Court Judge Scott McDonald. I turned the search warrant into the clerk's office, where it was assigned search warrant number [REDACTED]. I later scanned and uploaded a copy of the warrant into evidence.com.

09/30/2025

Tucson Fire Department Station 4

On 09/30/2025, Det. Marquedant and I went to TFD Station 4 (2102 N. Dragoon St.) to speak with the firefighters, who were on scene the day of the incident. I spoke with Firefighter Cam Welander #48711, Paramedic Chad Munn #49344, and Paramedic Jonathan Black #36635 each individually in a computer room. The interviews were recorded utilizing Axon Capture.

Cam Welander

Cam Welander advised me of the following, which is summarized/paraphrased, unless in quotations:

- Cam remembered going to a call for service at [REDACTED] on 09/17/2025.
- The call came out as possibly [REDACTED] problems. Cam was in the backseat and getting ready with the gear, while the CPT read the call.
- The call type was urgent; However, those calls sometimes turn out [REDACTED] so you never know. Also, sometimes the information in the call is wrong.
- Cam and his crew walked in with everything they needed to [REDACTED] and take care of [REDACTED]
- When Cam went on scene, there was a woman who ended up being [REDACTED] huddled in the corner holding a black German Shepherd. The woman didn't make eye contact and had her head down. Cam initially thought it was just someone holding the dog.
- When Cam walked inside, there were a couple of city workers, since it is a city housing project. The staff members briefly talked to Cam and his crew.
- The first city worker on scene said she went into the restroom, and there was a big pile of toilet paper, and under the toilet paper, there was [REDACTED]. The city worker took [REDACTED] out and put it on the counter, in between the two sinks.
- Cam saw [REDACTED] was laying between the two sinks with the arms spread all the way out. [REDACTED] which was in one of the sinks.
- [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED]. "It looked like a Halloween scene."
- Cam started assessing [REDACTED] and touched it. [REDACTED] was cold to the touch, "Which for us is an immediate indication that it may be beyond reviving."



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- The [REDACTED] pads were put on and were attached to [REDACTED]. The heart rhythm came up "Asystole." It was then determined that [REDACTED] was just a non revivable [REDACTED] right then."
- Asystole means a strict flat line on the monitor with no heart rhythm. [REDACTED] also had no pulse.
- [REDACTED] was holding the dog outside the apartment, huddled in a corner by the stairs. [REDACTED] was kneeled in a corner with her arms around the dog's neck.
- Cam did not see [REDACTED] face and just saw hair. Cam did not have any interaction with [REDACTED], and he saw the captain interacting with her later in the call.
- Cam and his partner John's role are to go straight to the patient. Cam did not initially think [REDACTED] was part of the scene and thought she was just holding the dog.
- Cam was in the room for about five minutes, while assessing [REDACTED] and talking to staff.
- When Cam exited the room, he saw that [REDACTED] was now sitting in a chair against the wall. Cam never saw [REDACTED] go back into the room.
- When Cam arrived on scene, he never saw any staff member rendering aide.
- One of the staff members met TFD outside and gave a story as they went to [REDACTED] and the other staff member was already inside the room. Both staff members were emotionally worked up.
- Cam did not see any emotion from [REDACTED], since she was just sitting there with her head down. [REDACTED] was just quiet.
- Cam does not remember leaving anything on scene besides the pediatric monitor electrodes on scene. Cam thinks he probably took his gloves off when he came back outside. It is possible that Cam left gloves on the counter though, after feeling for a pulse.
- Cam took a peek into the toilet room, but he did not analyze anything.
- Cam believes the captain probably looked in the bathroom, to assess the scene.
- When the call came in, Cam was told it was [REDACTED]. Cam is not a doctor, but [REDACTED] looked closer to [REDACTED]

Chad Munn

Chad Munn advised me of the following, which is summarized/paraphrased, unless in quotations:

- Chad remembered going to a call for service on 09/17/2025 at [REDACTED]
- When the call came out, Chad and his crew were preparing for [REDACTED]. They later got an update that [REDACTED] was in the toilet. Chad was not aware of the timeframe.
- Chad's crew was following Ladder 4 to the scene and Ladder 4 arrived first. Chad was in the parking lot, when he was told over the radio that it was a [REDACTED]
- Chad went to see if there was any additional help needed.
- The patient was sitting outside the apartment on the ground.
- Chad went to assess the patient, and the patient [REDACTED]. Chad did not get into details with the patient about the event, as he was more concerned with patient care.
- Chad asked if the patient had any pain or medical problems. Chad assessed vitals and found the vitals were within normal limits.
- The patient denied any pain and said [REDACTED] was minimal, and nothing they were concerned about.
- Chad always offers transport, and the patient denied transport.
- The patient had "No real emotion in one direction or another."
- The patient seemed aware and not under the influence of any substances. The patient's interactions seemed normal, besides not making eye contact and staring off into the distance.
- The patient's speed and appropriateness of the responses, during the interaction seemed normal.
- The patient was clothed, and Chad did not see any obvious blood on the patient.
- The patient was not holding themselves or physically indicating they were in pain.
- Chad talked to the patient for about half the time Paramedic 4 was on scene.
- Chad never went inside the apartment or talked to the staff members.
- Chad was expecting an emotional reaction from the patient, but there was no real emotion displayed.
- The patient did not go into detail about [REDACTED]. The information Chad received came from other people.



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- Other members from Ladder 4 talked to the patient.
- Chad rides in ambulance Paramedic 4.

Jonathan Black

Jonathan Black advised me of the following, which is summarized/paraphrased, unless in quotations:

- Jonathan remembered going to a call for service on 09/15/2025 at [REDACTED]
- The call came in possibly as [REDACTED] but may have come in as something more generic like [REDACTED]
- Jonathan thinks they knew they were going into a possible [REDACTED]
- Jonathan was riding in Ladder 4.
- When Jonathan got on scene, he saw two ladies there. Jonathan did not know if the ladies were [REDACTED] or caseworkers.
- [REDACTED] was already outside.
- The two workers directed them into the bathroom.
- [REDACTED] was on a dual sink outside the toilet room, laying on the counter. [REDACTED] was in the sink to the left. Jonathan believes [REDACTED].
- Jonathan began to assess [REDACTED] was cold and there were no signs of life.
- Jonathan was told [REDACTED]. Jonathan thought [REDACTED] still looked viable.
- Jonathan went for his stethoscope right away to make sure there was no pulse.
- There was no pulse. [REDACTED] was put on the monitor and was asystole.
- Jonathan didn't go into the bathroom. Jonathan glanced into the bathroom but didn't really look.
- Jonathan didn't talk to the workers there or know their role.
- It looked like people had been on scene for a while. It felt to Jonathan, like he was there just to verify or pronounce.

- There was no airway intervention. The only thing left on [REDACTED] were the electrodes, but [REDACTED] was moist, so they might've come off.
- Jonathan thinks they cleared their used gloves off scene. Jonathan thinks they were using black gloves.
- Jonathan did not interact with [REDACTED] outside. Jonathan thinks the captain might have.
- [REDACTED] had a "Business as usual" demeanor. [REDACTED] did not appear distraught, but Jonathan had thought time had passed.
- Jonathan thinks he was inside about five minutes. Things lingered, since the medics showed up after them.
- Jonathan did not think too much about [REDACTED]
- [REDACTED] looked viable.
- [REDACTED] did look older.
- Jonathan was working with Cam that night.
- Jonathan felt like he was just a witness to what happened.
- Chris the captain, Cam and Jonathan were the main ones who went inside.

On 09/17/2025 I responded to [REDACTED] reference a deceased person call. The complainant was reporting that one of their clients [REDACTED] in the toilet of her room. The call text later stated that [REDACTED] was less than [REDACTED] and that it was [REDACTED]. The incident took place in unit [REDACTED].

Upon arrival, Tucson Fire Department Medic 4 was on scene. Ofc Montano (202101) was speaking with them and they had advised that [REDACTED] was pronounced deceased at 1909 hours. I went to unit [REDACTED] and took field photographs of the scene. I observed a [REDACTED] on the bathroom sink counter. I took field photos of room [REDACTED].

Ofc Montano detained the suspect and she was identified as Danielle Bosley. He interviewed her. See main case for more details.

I made contact with Marcellina Rojas, Kristine Lukanuski, Brandi Champion and Allison Chappell. They all advised that they were witnesses to the incident.

I spoke with Kristine. She advised that this location is transitional housing owned by the city of Tucson. Danielle checked into room [REDACTED] at approximately 1200 hours. She did not notice if she appeared [REDACTED] or not. She and the other staff do daily room checks on each resident. At approximately 1800, she checked room [REDACTED]. Danielle answered the door and advised that she had been asleep after having [REDACTED]. She then went to the bathroom and observed a large amount of blood in the bathtub. She also saw the toilet bowl was full of blood and toilet paper. She contacted Marcellina at that time and called 911 shortly after. Marcellina arrived approximately 30 minutes later. She checked the toilet bowl and found [REDACTED] inside it underneath the toilet paper. She removed [REDACTED] and began conducting CPR. Tucson Fire Department and police arrived shortly after.

I spoke with Marcellina. She stated that she was at home and received a phone call from Kristine at approximately 1800 hours, advising that a client had [REDACTED]. She told Kristine to call 911 and then began driving to [REDACTED]. When she arrived, she went into unit [REDACTED] and observed a large amount of blood in the bathtub. She observed the toilet bowl was full of blood and toilet paper. She could not see [REDACTED] anywhere in plain view. She put medical gloves on and checked the toilet bowl. She pushed the toilet paper to the side and observed [REDACTED]. She removed [REDACTED] and placed it on the bathroom counter. She changed gloves and applied a new pair. She then began giving CPR. TFD and police arrived shortly after. She stated the first pair of gloves used was placed in the black trash can inside the apartment. The second pair was placed in the blue dumpster near unit [REDACTED].

Allison and Brandi arrived together after being contacted by Marcellina. They observed [REDACTED] and a large amount of blood inside the apartment. They then began assisting Danielle and provided her with a chair to sit in. Brandi advised she had to leave the scene and could not wait for detectives to arrive to be interviewed.

I spoke with Melinda Levya who is staying in unit [REDACTED]. She stated that at approximately 1800 she heard crying coming from unit [REDACTED]. She said the crying sounded like [REDACTED].

Allison advised that unit [REDACTED] is vacant. She stated there is a resident unit [REDACTED], however I was unable to make contact with anyone there.

Sgt Sullivan was advised. Sgt Morales of the Child Abuse detective unit was advised and detectives responded to the scene. and took over the investigation. I also advised Sgt Morales that my body camera battery was dead.

Upon arrival on 09/22/2025, I met with Marcellina Rojas and [REDACTED] who consented to the download of the video surveillance. I was not able to locate a model number for the system in the settings tab.

I took photographs showing the video surveillance system with 10 working camera views. I also captured a live view displaying the system time at 09/22/2025 12:41:06, which I compared to the current time in my photograph at 09/22/2025 12:41:07, noting a time offset of 00:00:01 slower than the current time.

The system retains video recordings starting from 08/26/2025. I downloaded cameras D01_South Center, D02 Southwest, D03_Office, D04_Office Parking because the cameras were facing the area of the incident location. I downloaded 3069 video files, LOG files and the video player covering the period from 09/17/2025 11:00 to 19:20 hours system time. I took a photograph documenting the date and time range of the videos collected. The video was available in DEFAULT, MP4, AVI formats, and I downloaded the files onto a USB storage device using the DEFAULT Format which saved the video in MP4. I attempted to download a sample clip using D04_Office Parking using the MP4, and AVI options. The system error out multiple times when attempting to download video in AVI format and I was not able to collect a video with an AVI format.

I viewed some of the videos to verify its operation. The video was then uploaded to Evidence.com, and Detective Marquedant was notified.

Charges were presented to PCAO and a warrant now existed for Danielle after [REDACTED] was discovered deceased in a toilet at a City of Tucson Housing First complex. Officer Harrison (101683) and I first circulated in the area of Fort Lowell/Stone and Fort Lowell/Oracle where Danielle was believed to be staying, but she was not located. I next contacted an associate of Danielle's (Bethany Bryant) via telephone, but she denied having a relationship with Danielle and claimed to know nothing of her whereabouts. I next attempted phone contact with another associate (Hayden Harris), but he did not answer the phone. Officer Harrison and I then drove to Hayden's residence at [REDACTED], but he was either not home or would not answer the door. After exhausting all avenues, Hayden finally contacted me on my department issued cell phone. I asked Hayden to put Danielle in contact with me under the guise of a plausible stratagem in which I would return her phone to her. Danielle's phone had been taken as evidence during the initial investigation. Danielle eventually met with Officer Harrison and I at 1909 S Craycroft. She was taken into custody and her warrant confirmed/served. Detective Marquedant was advised and responded to explain charges to Danielle and the legal process moving forward.

I played no role in the initial investigation. I never questioned Danielle or anyone else regarding the original criminal incident. My role in this investigation was limited to locating Danielle and booking her into Pima County Jail. NFI. See BWC footage for further details.

On 01/26/2026, Officer McCully and I began attempts to locate Danielle Bosley in reference to this incident. Detective Marquedant had sent an attempt to locate via email for her and we were aware she had a felony warrant for child abuse. We first circulated the area of E. Fort Lowell and N. Stone due to her being known to be in the area but she was not located. I had called Detective Marquedant to request additional information if it was available. He provided information on known associates to include Hayden Harris. Officer McCully first called Hayden but he did not answer. We went to Hayden's residence at [REDACTED] however no one answered the door.

Hayden later contacted Officer McCully via phone and stated he would tell that Danielle to contact Officer McCully. She did so and a ruse was utilized in order to get her to meet us at 1909 S. Craycroft at 1700 hours. We responded there at that time, contacted her outside the Circle K and detained her without incident. Detective Marquedant was advised and responded. Danielle's warrant was confirmed and served. I collected her hoodie, two earrings, headphones in charging case and an ankle bracelet which I later submitted at the Midtown Police Substation. Officer McCully transported and booked Danielle into Pima County Jail.
