BWC UtilizedBWC Muted During Officer Conversation**

On January 10, 2026, Officer Federico #103073 and I were operating as a two person unit when we were conducting a special check at City Hall (255 E Alameda St). There has been large groups of homeless sleeping on the property overnight. As we were walking around the property, Officer Federico and Officer Reeves #104046 observed a male subject slumped over. I responded over to them and the male appeared to be unresponsive. We moved the male onto his back. I could not feel a pulse on the subject. We attempted to sternum rub the male but he was not responding. As I returned to my patrol vehicle to retrieve an AED, Officer Reeves began CPR.

I returned to the male with an AED and Motor Officer Moreno #51098 began attaching it to the male. Officer Reeves continued CPR. The AED advised against shocking. Officers administered a nasal Narcan on the male but he did not respond. The Tucson Fire Department (TFD) was requested.

While officers continued performing CPR, I noticed two more male subjects close by that were not responding. I attempted to sternum rub both males but they did not respond. A pulse could be felt on both subjects and I could see they were both

breathing. A single dose of nasal Narcan was administered to both subjects with no reaction. Officers located identification cards on the two subjects, which identified them as Jason Dudderar and Wyatt Roos.

TFD arrived on scene and began life saving efforts on the first male as well as provided care to Jason and Wyatt. Jason and Wyatt eventually responded.

I spoke with Jon Garbers. Jon advised the three male subjects had arrived approximately 2 hours ago. There was a fourth male with them that had been smoking but walked away prior to our arrival.

Officer Reeves and I began walking the property looking for additional subjects in need of care. We located a female subject near the courtyard east of the main building. I was able to locate a pulse and she was breathing. TFD responded to evaluate the female. They administered x3 doses of nasal Narcan. I located an Arizona driver's license in the female's backpack, which identified her as lyleese Jones. lyleese woke up after the third Narcan and began screaming. TFD transported lyleese to St. Mary's Hospital (1601 W St. Mary's Rd) with non-life threatening injuries.

Sergeant Ashton #49045 arrived on scene. Lieutenant Schrouder #53665 arrived on scene.

The first male was identified as Jesus Laguna III. There was a bank card in his pockets with his name. Officers verified his identity by his MVD photograph. TFD pronounce Jesus deceased at 2329 hours.

Officers on scene had located burnt straws near Jason and Wyatt. Officer Federico located a broken glass pipe with burnt residue in Jesus' pant pocket. I was advised that one subject made a statement about them snorting powdered Fentanyl. Jason and Wyatt were both transported to St. Mary's Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

Officer Federico contacted Sergeant Mechtel #54171 with the Counter Narcotics Alliance Unit. Officer Federico collected a black "TCL" cell phone that appeared to belong to Jesus. We later placed the cell phone into evidence at EPIC (945 E Ohio St).

Crime Scene was requested and arrived on scene to take photographs.

I contacted the Office of Medical Examiner (OME - Herrera #19, case [REDACTED]). OME arrived on scene and took possession of Jesus's body.

Officer Federico contacted CSARC for next of kin (NOK). A possible [REDACTED], Richard "Rick" Laguna was located in the system. Officer Federico, Officer Reeves and I responded to Richard's last known address. We met with Richard and made the NOK notification. Richard was provided the OME case number and TPD case number.

I searched for Fusus camera's in the area but did not locate any that would view the incident.

Body worn camera utilized and muted to speak to officers.

On 1-10-26 I was working with Ofc Davidson as a two person unit. We along with Ofc Reeves were conducting an area check of city hall (255 W Alameda) due to the large amount of transients sleeping on property.



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Upon arrival Ofc Reeves and I were walking on the East side of city hall. I observed a male slumped over on his knees with his head on the ground. Both Ofc Reeves and I attempted to shake the male awake but did not get a response. We then rolled the male over. Ofc Reeves advised he could not feel a pulse. It did not appear the male was breathing.

TFD was ordered via dispatch for the unresponsive male.

I then returned to my patrol vehicle and retrieved my IFAK. Upon my return Ofc Reeves had started chest compressions on the male. I then administered a dose of Narcan to the male at 2301 hours. Ofc Davidson arrived with an AED. I utilized my trauma sheers to cut the males shirts. We then applied the AED to the male and continued chest compressions. Ofc Reeves, Ofc Moreno and I traded off doing compressions until TFD arrived and took over.

I was advised that two other subjects approximately 5 feet away from the original subject were also unresponsive. The other two males (identified as Jason Dudderar and Wyatt Roos) were breathing but were unresponsive. A fourth subject was located also unresponsive (identified as lyleese Jones).

Both Jason and Wyatt were given multiple doses of Narcan and were resuscitated. I was advised lyleese was given 3 doses of Narcan and was resuscitated. All three subjects were transported to St Mary's hospital.

TFD continued to attempt lifesaving efforts on the first subject but ultimately pronounced the male deceased at 2329 hours.

Upon checking the male I located a wallet in the front right pocket of his pants. A credit card with the name Jessie Laguna was located in the wallet. I located a Jesus Laguna (alias Jessie) in Axon. A photo in axon and a DMV photo matched that of the male.

A broken glass pipe with residue was located in the left front pocket of Jesus. I was advised several other burnt straws were located around the area Jason and Wyatt were found.

A cellphone was located in Jesus' left pant pocket. The cellphone was collected as evidence.

There were no cameras in the area where the subjects were located. I did observe a camera on the southeast side of the building.

I contacted Sgt Mechtel was advised via phone call. Sgt Ashton responded and was advised.

Crime scene was ordered via dispatch. Crime scene arrived and photographed the area.

Ofc Davidson contacted OME. OME responded and collected the decedent.

A next of kin was located (identified as Richard Laguna). Richard is Jesus [REDACTED].

We then responded to Richard's residence and completed the NOK notification.

Narrative

On 01/10/2026, I was in full uniform, in a marked patrol vehicle, and conducting a special check at 255 E Alameda, City Hall, when I contacted multiple subjects trespassing.

I observed multiple subjects camping and sleeping near the No Trespassing signs and began contacting them advising them of City Hall hours. I then observed a subject on his knees, bent over, with his face pressed against the concrete. I announced, myself as Tucson Police and got no response. I attempted to move the subject and again got no response. I then rolled the subject to his side and heard what sounded like gasping breaths. I attempted to sternum rub the subject and again got no response. I tried checking for a pulse at the carotid, brachial, and radial artery and could not palpate one.

I then begin CPR on the subject while additional officers were requested to bring an AED and NARCAN. I did CPR on the subject until the AED was set up on the subject and it advised to stop. I did several rounds of CPR, rotating between several other officers until TFD responded to the scene and took over life saving measures.

While doing CPR on the original subject, I observed 2 other subjects who were laying down, unresponsive, and appeared to overdosing as well. After TFD took over lifesaving measures on the original subject, Jesus Laguna, i checked for a pulse on the additional subjects and was able to locate one. Sternum rubs however, gave no response from the additional patients. TFD was advised of the additional patients.

An area check of the immediate area of City Hall yielded an additional female subject. This subject had a friend who advised he believed she was extremely intoxicated and she had been passed out for about an hour. An attempt to rouse the subject was unsuccessful and she appeared to be in the same state as the other patients. TFD began life saving measures on the female, providing 3 doses of nasal narcan before the could be roused.

I attempted to follow-up with the female subject, lyleese Jones, however she either legitimately could not recall any of the information or was evasive in answering questions.

This concludes my involvement in this incident. NFI

I responded to City Hall at 255 W. Alameda reference a person suffering from an overdose. Officers were on scene and found a person unresponsive. They soon found three other subjects suffering from drug overdose. Upon arrival I brought up an AED (defibrillator).

I found officers with one subject; they had applied another AED and were performing CPR. There were two other males unresponsive on the ground. I gave a nasal NARCAN to Ofc. Moreno (51098) who administered it to one of the males. The two males were later identified as Wyatt Roos and Jesus Ricardo.

Within a few minutes both Wyatt and Jesus both gained consciousness. Wyatt started flailing around but listened to commands and stayed seated. Jesus, however, refused to cooperate and kept disrupting the scene. He had to be handcuffed and taken to my patrol vehicle.

The Tucson Fire Department arrived to treat the subjects, including a fourth that was found nearby.

Unfortunately, the first subject was pronounced deceased. Another was transported to the hospital. Wyatt was examined but refused to be transported. Jesus was examined and requested to be taken to Saint Mary's Hospital.

On February 13, 2026, I was contacted by Sergeant Z. Mechtel 54171 who directed me to respond W. 29th St. and S. 7th Ave. to interview Jason Dudderar. Detective J. VanNorman 31575 had issued an attempt to locate reference this case. A South Tucson Police Officer was in contact with Dudderar. When I arrived, Dudderar was sitting on the sidewalk not in handcuffs. I introduced myself and Dudderar said he would talk with me.

I interviewed Dudderar at the trunk of my department vehicle. The interview was recorded. The following is a synopsis of the interview. For details, see the recorded interview. I explained to Dudderar he was not under arrest and did not have to talk with me. He is homeless and the address 702 S. 6th Ave. is a mailing address. Dudderar went to City Hall with a male named Matt (unknown last). When they arrived, they went to the east side of City Hall. Jason (unknown last), [REDACTED] (unknown last) and Brandon (unknown last) were there. There were also two older males there and they told them not to be using the pills. He thinks [REDACTED] who said she was [REDACTED] and Brandon were together. Dudderar, Jason and [REDACTED] went to the north side of City Hall by the tables and smoked a blue (counterfeit Oxycodone pill) together. Dudderar had the pill they smoked. He then snorted a small amount of fentanyl powder [REDACTED] had given him. Dudderar said he does not remember anything until was given Narcan and woke up. People were attending to Jesse (unknown last). He did not see Jesse or Matt use any drugs. Dudderar described [REDACTED] as a Hispanic female, [REDACTED], 5'9" tall, 140 pounds, "with a larges butt" and long black hair in a bun. He saw no scars, marks or tattoos. He described Brandon as a white male, 20 years old, 6'0", 160 pounds with short blonde hair. He did not see any facial hair, scars, marks or tattoos. This was the first time he met [REDACTED] and Brandon. I showed him the picture of lyleese Jones that was in the attempt to locate flyer. He said that is the person he knew was [REDACTED]
