On May 06, 2023, at approximately 2214hrs, I (Officer Arriola 50756) was in full uniform and driving a marked police vehicle. I was at the traffic light of 6 Ave and Irvington, facing west preparing to make a southbound turn, onto 6 Ave.

As I made the southbound turn and attempted to go into the #1 lane, I had to move over to the #2 lane in order to avoid a collision with a large pick-up that was stopped in the #1 lane of southbound lanes, facing northbound. As soon as I passed the pick-up I made a U-turn and pulled alongside the pick-up in the left turn lane. I called out to the male and told him that he was in the wrong lane and it appeared that he did not understand what I was saying in English, so I repeated it in Spanish. The male said ok and nodded his head. I told him to turn to avoid a collision with oncoming traffic. As the pick-up turned it slowed in the intersection and made a wide turn onto the #2 lane of westbound Irvington.

I activated my overhead emergency equipment and conducted a traffic stop at 100 W. Irvington. The pick-up was displaying AZ license plate 1EVL9. I made contact with the male driver, Saul Salazar. Saul appeared nervous and fidgety. I asked him if there were any firearms in the vehicle and he said, yes. I told Saul to tell me where the firearm was and to leave his hands on the steering wheel. Saul said that it was in the center console and moved his hands towards it. I told him not to reach and he placed his hands back on the steering wheel. I asked him if he had an identification and he said, no. I then had Saul exit the vehicle so I could speak to him further and away from the firearm.

Once outside of the pick-up, I checked Saul for any weapons. I asked him if he has an Arizona driver's license and he said, no. I asked if he had any type of identification even if it was from Mexico and he said, yes. Saul said that his wallet was in the center console. I asked him if I could retrieve his wallet and he said, yes. I went into the pick-up and opened the center console. I was able to locate a brown wallet that was resting on top of a black handgun that was not in a holster. The handgun was with the handle up and the barrel facing the backseat.

I asked the driver if I could retrieve his identification from his wallet and he said, yes. Inside his wallet there were two identifications, both issued in Mexico. Both identifications had the name of Saul Isaias Del Cid Salazar. Saul stated that he had no Arizona identification and does not know if he has permission to be in the United States.

I made telephonic contact with the registered owner of the pick-up, Francisco Irigui. Francisco said that the pick-up was his and that told Saul to wash it. I asked him if there was anything in the pick-up that belongs to him that Saul could potentially get in trouble for. Francisco said that he left his gun in the center console and described it. Francisco said that he was currently in Mexico and that he could not respond to retrieve his pick-up.

Sergeant Valenzuela called Border Patrol in an attempt to get his legal status. Border Patrol said that Saul would have to be transported to their station. Taking Saul to the station would unnecessary prolong the investigation and he was not transported. Sergeant Valenzuela contacted the TPD Gun Crime Intelligent Unit and Detective Aguilar responded.

At the conclusion of Detective Aguilar's interview, it was determined that Saul would not be charged for the firearm. The firearm was removed from the vehicle and later submitted into evidence for safekeeping. NFI

Narrative

On 05/06/23 while assigned to the Gun Crimes Intel Unit, I was called out to assist with this case. Ofc. Arriola had conducted a traffic stop and the driver was identified as Saul Del Cid-Salazar. Salazar was not in the country legally and he admitted there was a gun in the vehicle. Upon my arrival I made contact with the officers and was given a short briefing. I interviewed Salazar the following is a brief synopsis of his statement for full details refer to the recording. Miranda warning at 2307 hours "Si and no se." The interview was in Spanish but will be documented in English.

- Drove his bosses vehicle. He had asked his boss for permission to borrow the truck to visit a girl.
- Boss was currently in Mexico.
- When officers pulled him over he told them there was a gun in the vehicle.
- He knew there was a gun in there because his boss always has the gun in the center console.
- Did know it was a .40 caliber.
- Has never used or fired the gun.
- He is not here legally and did not have any papers to be here.
- Only had a Mexican drivers license in his possession as a form of identification.
- Lives in Tucson with a friend and has been in the US for a few months now.
- Claimed he had never been arrested.
- He did move the gun when he cleaned the truck.
- Does not have a gun of his own and knows he is not allowed to own or posses a gun in the US.

It was confirmed that the vehicle and gun belonged to Francisco Iriqui. Officers spoke with Iriqui, who confirmed Salazar worked for him and had been given permission to borrow the vehicle. No arrests were made in the case and the gun was placed into evidence for safe keeping. NFI...
