Notes/Narratives

On 092917, I responded to the listed address reference a trespassing call. Per the call text, Margarita Romero had called to report people living on the roof of the listed address.

Ofc. Zieminski and I parked our vehicles across the street and walked to the scene.

Upon arrival, I saw a vehicle (black 1997 Audi A4 AZ Plate CBH3073) parked in front of the listed address. As a part of my trespassing investigation, I checked the vehicle by shining my flashlight and saw that it was occupied by a single occupant, a female wearing blue medical scrubs, sitting in the driver seat. She appeared to be asleep and slumped over the wheel. She awoke to the bright light of my flashlight and appeared to have slowed motor movements and heavy eyelids as she woke up. I made contact with her from the passenger side of the vehicle. She verbally identified herself to me as Margarita Romero. Margarita had a thick tongue, slurred speech and bloodshot, watery eyes. I immediately smelled a strong odor of intoxicants. I saw open containers of alcohol in the vehicle. Before I was able to ask any further questions, Margarita turned the engine on (keys were already in the ignition) and began to manipulate the gear shifter. I instructed her verbally to turn the car off and step out of the vehicle. As she stepped out of the vehicle, she lost her balance and fell back to the car. I immediately grabbed onto her to stop her from becoming injured. She leaned up against the car until I was able to guide her to a seated position on the curb. I looked back into the vehicle and located three empty Sierra Nevada Pale Ale beer bottles in plain view. I removed the keys from the ignition.

I continued to investigate the reason for the original 911 call about trespassing while waiting for additional units to assist Ofc. Zieminski and I. Margarita advised that there is an ongoing issue with transient individuals climbing on top of the roof to sleep. She said that she called 911, left the scene, purchased beer and then came back to the scene to wait for officers and to see if she would be able to contact the transients. She stated that while waiting in her car, she drank two beers. Ofc. Zieminski later checked the roof and did not see anyone on the roof, however there was evidence that someone had been on the roof at one point. Margarita continued to tell us that she [REDACTED] that she was not going to be driving and missed a party she was supposed to go to. She stated that [REDACTED] and that she was "Drunk".

Ofc. Zieminski stood by with Margarita while I went to get my patrol car #603 to bring it to the scene. I positioned my patrol car directly in front of Margarita's car, turned on my MVR, set it to record and placed the microphone in my shirt pocket. This video was later uploaded and tagged to this case.

I advised Margarita about Field Sobriety Tests and the reason for a DUI investigation. Margarita became upset and told me that she had called police for help and that she "was not driving". I administered the Walk and Stand and One Leg stand FST's (see the worksheet for details).

I advised Margarita of Miranda, she told me that she understood Miranda Rights. When I asked her if she would answer my questions, she

repeatedly said, "yes or no". I erred on the side of not asking her any further questions as she did not give me an affirmative or negative response. I advised Margarita that she was under arrest for DUI.

Margarita became belligerent and attempted to leave the scene. Ofc. Zieminski and I gently grabbed her arms and advised her that she was not free to leave and that if she continued to try to leave, that she would be placed in handcuffs. We released her and I directed her to the front of the patrol car. She walked to the front of my patrol car and then she tried to leave again. I grabbed her right arm and positioned it behind her back so that I could place her into handcuffs. She resisted and pulled away from me. Because of her non-compliance, defensive resistance and inability to balance herself, I directed her body towards the hood of my car to prevent her from falling backwards and to gain control over her. We were positioned directly in front curb which was a trip/fall hazard because of her resistant movements. I then was able to successfully place her into handcuffs.

Throughout my interaction with Margarita, she continued to be belligerent, called myself and other officers on scene "bitches" and needed me to explain the reason for the DUI investigation multiple times. She told me that she was a "witch" and that she had casted bad juju onto my spirit. She accused officers on scene of targeting her because she was a "brown woman" and made several other references to her being targeted by police for her gender and race, even though she had called for help. She stated that this is the reason why people are taking a knee for the national anthem and why Hispanics don't report to police when they see crime. She stated, "now I know what a black person feels like".

Ofc. Bonanno and Sgt. O'Hara responded to the scene and further assisted in the investigation. See case supplements for further details.

Ofc. Zieminski took photos of the vehicle and the empty containers.

I located Margarita's purse which had her wallet and driver's license in it. I was able to confirm Margarita's identity by her Arizona Driver License.

At the conclusion of the investigation, Margarita was arrested for DUI-Impaired to the Slightest Degree 28-1381A1, DUI BAC .08+ 28-1381A2, DUI BAC .15+ 28-1382A1 and DUI BAC .20+ 28-1382A2. Margarita was cited and released to VIP taxi. Margarita removed the items that she wished to take with her. There were no other items of value left in her car.

Rod's Towing responded to the scene and towed the vehicle away for impound. I advised TWX 100415.

I respond to the area of 1241 North Wilmot , to assist with this investigation and arrived at approximately 0110 hours.

Shortly after arriving, I was introduced to Margarita Romero-Durazzi, by Officer Reece #101587 and told that she was under arrest for DUI. Margarita exhibited frequent mood swings, most of which were in the argumentative stage and she was placed into handcuffs after she attempted to walk away from the arresting officers.

I read Margarita APS/IC, Verbatim from the ADOT form and requested a (Breath) Chemical Test. Margarita calmed down a bit at this time and said that she understood the form and agreed to submit to the requested test.

Upon completion of a Deprivation Period, I administered the Breath Testing there at the scene. The Breath Testing resulted in a 'Successfully Completed Test Sequence' Breath Strip (0.197 / 0.201 BrAc). It should be noted that during the start up phase, prior to the first test being administered, an 'RFI' was detected and the sequence aborted. I believe this to be the result of not all of the officers turning off their portable radios. This was corrected before the successful test's were achieved and no other errors were detected.

After the Chemical Testing, I removed the handcuffs from Margarita and served the 90-day OOS. I reviewed the Independent Test Notification, Fingerprint requirements and citation with Margarita, as well. Margarita was provided with copies of the paperwork, prior to her F/R.

It should also be noted that Margarita came very close to being booked for this offense while continuing to display mood swings (swearing at the officers) and refusing to provide any way to F/R her (friend, relative, cab). Margarita ultimately agreed to pay for a cab and was released when it arrived.

Margarita made numerous utterances and accusations during this contact. The majority if not all of our conversations and her actions were captured on my BWC. This video should be reviewed in it's entirety and concludes shortly after Margarita finishes a cigarette and flicks the still burning butt onto the hood of the cab that she was getting into. The cigarette was retrieved by Sgt. O'Harra #38876 and safely disposed of.

On 09/29/2017 at 0037, Ofc Reece (101587) and I were dispatched to 1241 N Wilmot Rd reference a trespassing call. Ms. Margarita Romero-Durazzi had called police at 2115 to report that several homeless people were sleeping on the roof of the building.

Upon arrival, Ofc Reece and I parked our vehicles in the Trader Joes parking lot (1101 N Wilmot Rd), which is directly south of the listed address. Ofc Reece and I approached, on foot, the parking lot of the business complex, which is on the west side of the property. There were very little ambient light, but I could see a black sedan car parked next to the curb (not in a parking space). I informed Ofc Reece and we approached the vehicle. Ofc Reece shined her light into the vehicle and I saw a hispanic female in the driver's seat. The female appeared to have been sleeping and woken up from the light. The female slowly moved her hands towards gearshift. I saw her turn the vehicle keys, which were already in the ignition. The vehicle started up and the female moved her hand towards the gearshift. As Ofc Reece spoke with the female, later identified as Ms. Romero-Durazzi, I saw the placard on the side of the vehicle with the name "Margarita Romero Durazzi" on it. I looked into the passenger seat and saw an open alcohol bottle (Sierra Nevada Pale Ale) on the seat. I saw an open 12-pack of Sierra Nevada Pale Ale on the passenger seat floorboards. Ofc Reece directed Ms. Romero-Durazzi to exit the vehicle. I saw Ms. Romero-Durazzi stand up outside the vehicle and then immediately fall back on the side of her car. Ms. Romero-Durazzi appeared unable to stand up. She was directed to sit on the curb.

I asked Ms. Romero-Durazzi to tell me why she called the police. Ms. Romero-Durazzi said that homeless people had frequently been sleeping on the roof, where there is a balcony area that can be accessed by jumping a fence. Ms. Romero Durazzi said that she saw several people walking up the stairs towards the roof as she was exiting the building. She asked them what they were doing and they told her "don't worry about it" and "we're leaving." Ms. Romero Durazzi said she then called police. Ms. Romero-Durazzi said she went to the store and bought some beer, then brought it back to wait for police. I asked Ms. Romero-Durazzi what happened next. Ms. Romero Durazzi appeared to have trouble formulating her sentences. She finally said "I had two beers and I'm drunk."

I stood by while Ofc Reece conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tests. I observed that Ms. Romero-Durazzi was unable to maintain her body position during the instructions, stepped off the line several times during the test, failed to maintain a heel-to-toe step, and did not turn properly during the Walk and Turn test. Ms. Romero-Durazzi had a distinct sway while balancing and put her foot down several times during the One leg Stand test.

Ms. Romero-Durazzi was very argumentative once she was told she was being arrested. She said that she was not driving the car, and therefore

could not be arrested. Ms. Romero Durazzi began to walk away from Ofc Reece. I placed my arm out, blocking her path. I told Ms. Romero Durazzi that she was not free to leave. Ms. Romero Durazzi continued to try and move away from me, so I grabbed her left arm while Ofc Reece grabbed her right arm. Ms. Romero-Durazzi calmed down and we released her arms. Ofc Reece directed her to stand in front of the patrol vehicle. After a few minutes, Ms. Romero-Durazzi walked towards the back of the vehicle and appeared to be attempted to leave the scene. I once again grabbed her arm. I assisted Ofc Reece in placing her into handcuffs. Ms. Romero Durazzi continued to try and pull away from us and had to be held against the vehicle hood.

I took field photos of the car. I found two more empty Sierra Nevada Pale Ale bottles in the back seat. In the 12-pack box that was on the passenger floorboard, I found a full unopened Sierra Nevada Pale Ale Bottle. I then circulated through the complex, but was unable to locate any homeless people sleeping on the property. I saw a white blanket on the balcony on the roof of the building, but there was nobody present. I informed Ofc Reece that I had not found anyone on the property.

I stood by with Ofc Bonanno as he went through the DUI arrest paperwork. Ofc Bonanno removed the handcuffs from Ms. Romero Durazzi after she calmed down. She then started to escalate again, swearing at Ofc Reece and SGT Ohara (38876), who was also on scene. Before Ms. Romero-Durazzi finished signing all her paperwork, she attempted to leave again. I placed her back in handcuffs and held on to her right arm for most of the rest of our interaction. Ms. Romero Durazzi yelled at all the officers on the scene, claiming that she was being targeted for her race and gender.

Once Ms. Romero Durazzi finished signing her paperwork and a taxi arrived for her, I removed her handcuffs. She continued to yell at officers, including saying "I'm not even drunk anymore," until finally getting into the taxi and leaving the scene.

During my interaction with Ms. Romero-Durazzi, I noticed she had a strong odor of intoxicants, slurred speech, was thick-tongued, and had trouble formulating sentences. She also had watery red eyes, exhibited mood swings with frequent bouts of crying, and had trouble with her balance (swaying/staggering).

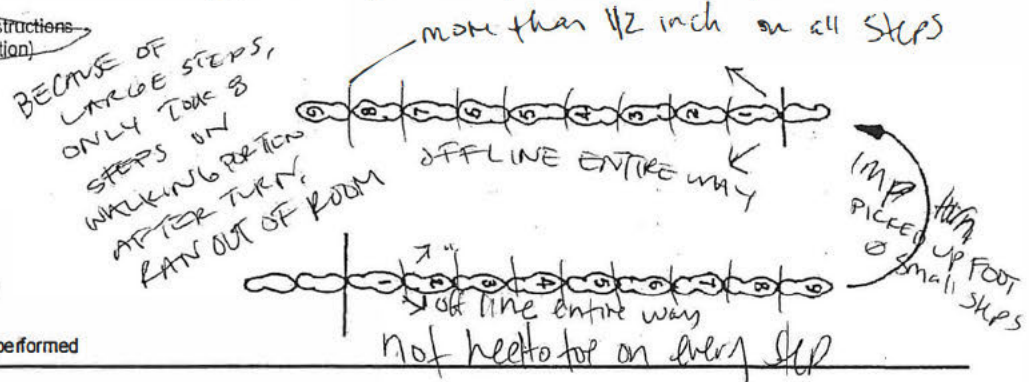

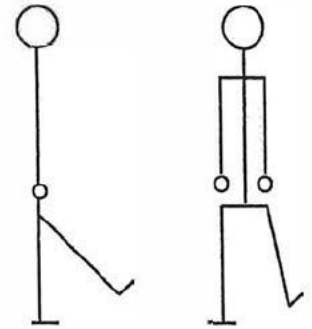

Jeanne Goodblanket and Delphine Goodblanket have been married since 2014 and have lived together at the listed since 2010. No one else lives at the listed and no one else was home.

I was dispatched to [REDACTED] reference a domestic disturbance. Complainant, Jeanne Goodblanket, said her wife (Delphine) was drunk, spit on her, and broke a window. There was also a rifle in the home. As I approached the house on foot I saw Delphine standing on the front porch of the listed. I gave Delphine commands "to come here" while approaching. I heard Delphine say "oh hell no", then run inside, and lock the door. I knocked and announced Tucson Police and stated I was going to kick the door in. I heard Sergeant Holewinski on the radio say Jeanne was going to open the door. Jeanne opened the door for Tucson Police and indicated where Delphine was. I located Delphine at the end of the nearest hallway approximately 20 feet from me. I saw Delphine standing with her body bladed to me with her right hand in her pocket and I could not see her left hand. I commanded Delphine to show me her hands. Delphine continued to stand there in the same position. I withdrew my handgun and pointed it at Delphine. Officer Kosmider took Delphine to the ground. We detained Delphine in handcuffs to her back. I helped Delphine up to her feet and walked to my patrol car #573.

Sergeant Holewinski was on scene.

I spoke with Jeanne who reported she locked herself in a room in her home. Jeanne had been sleeping in that room for a full week because that was the only room with a functioning lock on the door. Jeanne had locked the door and tried to fall asleep. The lights were off and she heard Delphine return home. Delphine started to knock on the door. Delphine forced the door open, which caused damage to the door. Delphine was "drunk" and begun to argue. Jeanne told Delphine to leave multiple times. Jeanne claimed Delphine spat on her and it hit her nose. Delphine showed me a video recording of the incident. Delphine identified her voice and identified Delphine's voice. The video was black because the room was dark, but the audio was clear. In the video I heard Jeanne telling Delphine to leave. Delphine continued to argue. While Jeanne was speaking; in the background I heard someone else gathering spit from the back of their throat and I heard them spit. Since Jeanne was speaking during the spitting sound, it was reasonable to think that Delphine was the one who spit on Jeanne. I heard Jeanne tell Delphine to leave multiple more times. I had Jeanne send the videos to my work email, but they did not go through. I contacted Jeanne to send the videos to me.

I was forced to get Delphine's biographical information from Jeanne because Delphine refused to identify herself.

Officer Kosmider told me Delphine invoked her rights and did not want to speak about the incident. Delphine made unsolicited statements that she was assaulted by Jeanne. Delphine claimed Jeanne kicked her in the lower back area. Delphine showed an area of her lower back area that had some sort of bruising. The bruising did not look recent. I took field photos of Jeanne, Delphine (claimed injury to lower back area), the damaged door, and overalls of the scene. I collected buccal swabs of Jeanne's DNA and collected DNA from Jeanne's nose. Later I placed them into evidence. I gave Jeanne a Victim's Rights form and advised her how to obtain an order of protection. Jeanne did not wish to speak with Victim Witness and she told me she has had prior contact with EMERGE. Jeanne claimed she would contact EMERGE on her own.

I notified Delphine she was under arrest for Assault No Injury DV, Criminal Damage DV, Disorderly Conduct DV, and Obstruction Refusing True

I was dispatched to [REDACTED] to assist Ofc. Gutknecht reference a domestic violence incident. The call text indicated that the subject, Delphine Goodblanket, had spit on her partner, Jeanne Goodblanket. Delphine had also allegedly broken a window. We were advised that there was a rifle locked up in the house. We did not have any information about where the gun was at, or if there was anyone else in the house.

When we arrived Delphine was coming outside. Ofc. Gutknecht ordered Delphine to walk toward us and talk to us. Delphine refused and ran back into the house, locking the door behind her. Ofc. Gutknecht began knocking on the door. At the same time Sgt. Holewinski was on the phone with Jeanne and she agreed to come out and open the door for us. Ofc. Gutknecht asked Jeanne where Delphine was, and she pointed down a hallway.

I followed Ofc. Gutknecht into the hallway. When I entered the hallway Ofc. Gutknecht was approximately 7-10 feet away from Delphine. Delphine was leaning against a hallway wall and had her body bladed towards us. Delphine's right arm was towards us and her hand was in her pocket. Delphine's left arm and hand were hidden from us behind her body. There was a bedroom door behind Delphine that was open.

I heard Ofc. Gutknecht order Delphine to take her hands out of her pockets. Delphine did not respond. I drew my handgun and pointed it at Delphine and ordered her to show us her hands. Delphine again did not reply. She maintained a bladed stance and did not respond to commands at all. I feared that Delphine either currently had a weapon concealed either in her pocket or behind her, or that Delphine would retreat into the bedroom and retrieve a weapon before Ofc. Gutknecht was able to detain her. I decided to close quickly with her. I rushed forward at Delphine and tackled her to the ground with my left arm around her upper body. I continued giving Delphine verbal commands to show her hands and then to put her hands behind her back. Once on the ground Delphine complied and was detained in handcuffs without injury. I then walked Delphine out to Ofc. Gutknecht's patrol vehicle. Delphine made a statement that she believed I had tackled her because she is "a dyke."

I advised Delphine of her Miranda rights. Delphine refused to answer whether she understood her rights. I asked Delphine for her name and date of birth, then informed her she was lawfully detained and required to provide that information. Delphine sat without speaking at all. I advised Ofc. Gutknecht of this information. During a search of Delphine, Ofc. Gutknecht located a small knife in her pocket. I notified Sgt. Holewinski and he responded. I stood by until Ofc. Gutknecht cleared the scene. This concluded my involvement in the case.

On 10/11/2017 I responded to 2750 South Kolb Road: GIANT reference an armed robbery.

Upon arrival at 0213 hours I contacted the clerk, Miguel Martinez, who stated he was assaulted by the suspect during the robbery.

Miguel said he was outside cleaning pump #4 on the eastern side of the store when a male approached him asking if the store was "open"? Miguel said he answered "yes" and was asked for a "pack of Cool 100's". Miguel stated they walked into the store and he noticed the male had put a "jersey" over his head covering his face. Miguel stated he then walked behind the register and got the pack of cigarettes out to ring them out. Miguel said the male told him "Give me everything in your register" as Miguel rang up the cigarettes. Miguel stated the male had his right hand in his pocket at this point. Miguel stated he tried to tell the male he needed to "cancel the transaction" since he had rang the cigarettes up already but the male told him "Hurry up, you're taking too slow!" Miguel stated the male walked behind the counter next to him and using a closed fist punched Miguel once with his left fist. Miguel stated he was hit on the right cheek causing a small cut on his lip. Miguel stated he was able to open the register after being hit and the male reached into the cash drawer grabbing the cash tray. Miguel said the male was not wearing gloves and he walked out the eastern door opening it with his left hip. Miguel stated the male ran south and across Kolb Road east on 38th Street but he lost visual of the male shortly after that. Miguel advised approximately \$75.00 was taken in cash.

Miguel stated he did not want medical attention at this time. Miguel described the male as 508 600/Medium build/35 40 years old/wearing black long sleeve shirt and black pants. Miguel said the male may have had a slight limp but could not say for sure. I provided Miguel a Victim notification form for himself and a Victim notification form for the store.

Sergeant Alexander #43116 responded to the scene.

Officers circulated the area locating a possible suspect northeast of the GIANT behind Big O Tires. The male that was contacted fled from officers and after a brief chase was caught by a canine unit at 7140 East 42nd Street (dog bite). The Subject caught provided the name Paul Herbert but was later identified as Jose Herbert and found to have a felony warrant for his arrest. Jose was transported to St Joseph's hospital where he was treated for a dog bite and later booked for his unrelated warrant and paraphernalia. (cases #1710110093/ #1710110090)

I performed a show up with Miguel who advised he 'could not be sure' if the male was the suspect.

The store manager, Brad Lahti, arrived and reviewed the video of the incident with me. I was able to take several still pictures of the video for the officers with the subject on 42nd Street to help identify the subject. From the video I could see the suspect did not have scars/marks/tattoos or jewelry on and there was no clear view of the suspects head. I could see a white shirt under his long sleeve shirt and gray Van type shoes. Brad advised he would make copies of the video for me to collect as soon as possible.

I was dispatched to the area of Golf Links and Kolb to assist in searching for an armed robbery suspect. The suspect description we were provided was a black male wearing all dark clothing that had a black jersey over his face, and had implied he had a handgun.

I heard Ofc. Pederson advise that he'd seen a matching individual behind the Big O Tires. The air unit picked the suspect up and advised he was south bound on Kolb approaching 38th. I was on 38th at the time and turned north bound on to Kolb. I observed a male, eventually identified as Jose Herbert, riding his bicycle south bound on Kolb on the east side of the road. I noted that Jose was dark skinned, had on dark clothing, and a dark piece of clothing in his right hand. I drove north bound on Kolb towards Jose and activated my emergency lights and then siren. Jose made eye contact with me, but continued riding south bound passed me and then turned right on to east bound 38th. I followed behind for a short time, then had to drive through an alley before I was able to contact him again at Malvern/Tamara. I drove up alongside Jose and ordered him loudly to get on the ground. Jose made eye contact with me and told me that he hadn't done anything. I gave multiple additional orders for him to get on the ground, but he continued riding away.

Jose turned left on to east bound 42nd St. and then pulled into the driveway at 7410 E 42nd St. Jose approached the front door. I continued giving commands and pointed my handgun at Jose. I then saw Ofc. Pedersen's K9 running at Jose and he ran into the carport. I observed the K9 bite Jose. After the dog was off, Jose put his right hand into his pocket. I again pointed my handgun at Jose and ordered him to show me his hand, which he did. I then assisted Ofc. Stout with detaining Jose in handcuffs. I requested TFD assistance. I noted that Jose had minor bite punctures on his lower left arm and left hand and a large hole in his upper left arm. I requested Ofc. Stout get gauze from his ifak to treat the large bite, however by the time he returned TFD was arriving on scene. TFD wrapped the wounds, and advised that Jose needed stitches. They also advised that his vitals were in range and that he was stable, and that we could transport Jose to a hospital for stitches ourselves.

While walking out of the carport to be treated by TFD I noted that Jose had a syringe hanging out of his left pocket. I secured that. I later located a piece of burnt foil in his pocket. I provided these items to Ofc. Stout to place into evidence.

When Sgt. Alexander arrived on scene I briefed him of the situation and was relieved as IC on scene. I remained on scene until instructed to respond to the main station. I conducted a recorded interview. See that interview as well as BWC for further details. This concluded my

On 10/11/17, I was en route to secure for the night when the alert tone came out reference a convenience store robbery at 2750 S Kolb. The reporting party/victim called 911 to report he was assaulted and robbed. The complainant provided the following suspect description; African American male, 30-35 years of age, and dressed in all black. No weapons were seen and the suspect left with the money holder [drawer]. The suspect was last seen running eastbound on 38th Street.

K9 Officer Pedersen 47242 announced over the air of a male in black clothing riding a bicycle behind the Big O Tires [7140 E Golf Links]. Officers attempted to stop the bicyclist at Golf Links and Kolb, and the subject continued riding as he crossed over from the east side of the street to the west side on S Kolb Road. Officers activated their emergency lights an attempt to stop the bicyclist and subject continued refusing to stop. I observed the bicyclist was very motivated and determined to get away from officers. I observed an officer pull alongside the curb and parallel with the subject as he rode on the sidewalk refuse to stop at 38th and Kolb. The bicyclist made an eastbound turn onto 38th Street from Kolb at which time I followed the bicyclist on 38th Street. The bicyclist made the first right hand turn into an alleyway heading south. I gave loud verbal commands for the subject to "stop," and he continued through an easement that intersected with Marvin and Edward. I was unable to follow the bicyclist due to large poles impeding my direction of travel.

At this time, I realized I had not activated my BWC. The subject was apprehended a short time later. I did not witness the apprehension of the subject. I notified Sgt Alexander 43116 of not turning on my body camera. I was not part of the incident until I started following the subject on 38th Street. I cleared the call and assisted with another high priority call.

Once on scene, I started my BWC.

I was later summoned back to the scene to assist with transporting the subject to the hospital for a K9 bite. The subject was identified as Paul Herbert with a DOB of [REDACTED]. Herbert was placed in the back of my car. I noted Herbert's arm was wrapped up and officers advised Herbert possibly needed stitches from the dog bite wounds. Before leaving and unprovoked, Herbert made a statement, "Could have prevented this." I transported Herbert to St Joseph's Hospital where he was admitted as a patient. Staff loosely sutured two puncture wounds. During this time, I utilized police databases to determine the real identity of the subject as Jose Ricardo Herbert with a DOB of [REDACTED]. Physical markings [tattoo's] and picture accurately identified the subject. Jose told me several times that he was sorry for causing the inconvenience. I conducted a records check on Jose and revealed a felony warrant out of Maricopa County Sheriff's Department. The warrant was confirmed and served on Jose.

On October 11th, 2017 I was circulating in the area of Marvin and Edwards in an attempt to locate a suspect from an armed robbery. The suspect was described as a black male, wearing all black clothing, using a black long sleeved shirt to cover his face, and he implied he had a hand gun.

I heard Officer Pedersen advised over the radio that he had seen a male matching the description riding his bicycle southbound on Kolb, approaching 38th street. The air unit maintained visual of the male as he traveled through an alley near my location. I saw the male exit the alley at Marvin and Edwards. I observed the male was wearing dark clothing and had a black piece of clothing with long sleeves in his right hand. I activated my emergency lights and siren while behind the male. The male looked backwards at me but would not stop. I continued to follow the male and he turned east bound onto 42nd street. I followed the male in my patrol car until he rode his bicycle into the driveway of 7410 E. 42nd and got off of his bike, running into the carport. I exited my patrol car, which I left in the roadway, and approached the male while pointing my hand gun at him. I gave the command to lay down on the ground. I saw Officer Pederson's K9 running at the male and saw the dog bite him on his left arm. Officer Kosmider and I approached the male, and Officer Kosmider told him to keep his hands where we could see them. The male complied and we detained him in handcuffs. The male was eventually identified as Jose Herbert.

I observed small punctures to Jose's left hand, left forearm, and a large hole near the bicep of his left arm. Tucson Fire was requested. While waiting for paramedics I retrieved my IFAK to administer first aid, but when I had returned Tucson Fire was on scene. Tucson Fire treated the wounds and advised they would not need to transport Jose immediately because his vitals were stable, but he would need stitches.

I photographed the location with my department cell phone. I took overall photographs and photographs of where the bicycle was left, as where as the location in the carport where the bite occurred. Officer Kosmider supplied me with a capped syringe, as well as a piece of burnt foil and a small plastic baggie that had been found in the Jose's pockets. I took custody of those items until relieved by Officer Jackson, who submitted them into evidence.

I was told to respond to the Main Station and 270 S. Stone to conduct a recorded interview. I conducted the interview and tagged the MVR footage from my vehicle to the case.

On 10/11/17 I responded to the Shell station located at 2750 S Kolb Rd, in regards to a robbery call out. Upon arrival I attended a briefing given by the officers that were on scene. Once the briefing had concluded I was tasked with conducting a recorded interview the victim, Miguel Martinez. Sgt. Peterson (37962) from the Office of Professional Standards was also present for the interview with Miguel. The following is a paraphrased summary of the interview with Miguel.

Miguel stated that he is employed at the Shell and that he was working during the robbery. Miguel stated that the suspect approached him while he (Miguel) was outside at the gas pumps and asked if the business was open. Miguel stated that he informed the suspect that the business was open, at which point the two of them walked inside the store. Miguel stated that as soon as they went inside the suspect lifted his shirt up over his face. Miguel stated that the suspect asked for a pack of cigarettes, and as soon as he rang up the cigarettes, the suspect demanded all the money in the cash drawer. Miguel stated that he told the suspect that he needed to cancel the transaction before he could open the cash drawer. Miguel stated that the suspect accused him of taking too much time at which point the suspect punched Miguel in the face with a closed fist. Miguel did not have any injuries from the punch. Miguel described the suspect as a African American male 35 to 40 years old, 5'8" to 6' 160 to 200 pounds. Miguel stated that the suspect was wearing all black clothing. Miguel stated that the suspect smelled like beer and was possibly intoxicated. Miguel stated that he would be able to ID the suspect if he saw the suspect again. I then asked Miguel about the show up that was conducted with the person who had been detained. Miguel stated that the show up took place 15 minutes after the robbery occurred. He then stated that he was about 10 to 15 yards away from the person who the officers had detained. Miguel stated that it was dark out when the show up took place and that the suspect keep looking down. Miguel stated that the person who was detained was wearing shorts and not jeans like the robbery suspect was. Miguel stated the nothing about the persons face in the show up reminded him of the person that robbed the store. Miguel stated that he believes that the person how was in custody was the person who robbed the store because he ran from the police and the only time that someone runs from the police is when they do something wrong. The audio from the interview with Miguel was uploaded into DIMS. Refer to the audio for futher details.

Once the interview was completed, Sgt Peterson and I walked the suspects path of flight from the business in search of any possible evidence. Sgt. Peterson and I found nothing of evidentiary value during the search of the area. This concludes my involvement in this case.

On 10/11/17 I was assigned to the Robbery Unit when I was contacted by Sgt. Woolridge and directed to respond to 2750 S. Kolb for a robbery investigation.

Upon arrival at 2750 S. Kolb, the Giant station, I received a briefing from Sgt. Woolridge. I learned that an unknown male suspect contacted the victim clerk outside while he was cleaning up and asked for cigarettes. When they went inside the business the suspect pulled his shirt over his head and demanded all the money from the register. When the suspect felt the victim was too slow he came behind the counter and punched the victim one time in the face. The victim got the register open and the suspect took the cash drawer. The suspect left on foot southbound on Kolb. The victim sustained minor injuries.

A description was broadcast and officers responded to the area. A person was located northeast of the business who ultimately ran from officers before being detained. He sustained a police K9 bite and was transported to St. Joseph's hospital.

After the briefing I was directed to go interview the person who was detained at the hospital. Sgt. Kerlin with OPS was present for the interview as well. Once at the hospital I was advised by Ofc. Ortiz #49565 that the suspect had lied about his name, providing the name "Paul Herbert." Ofc. Ortiz was able to determine the suspect's true name was Jose Herbert [REDACTED]. The suspect had not been told that we knew his real name before I interviewed him. He was detained in a hospital room at the time of the interview, which was audio recorded. The interview began at 0608 hrs and ended at 0652 hrs. The following is a summary of the interview, refer to the transcript for details. See Sgt. Kerlin's report for details of his portion of the interview, his questioning dealt with Herbert's interaction with officers just before and during his arrest.

JOSE HERBERT INTERVIEW

I asked Jose his name and he stated "Paul Herbert" with a date of birth "[REDACTED]". After asking basic biographical information I read him the Miranda warnings. He replied "yes" he understood them and then answered questions. Jose complained about being in pain throughout the interview.

He said that he was in the area of Golf Links and Kolb with a friend. He described the friend as a "white guy" and said he goes by the name "Britain." He said that he was basically homeless at this time. He said that while he was by the "Grease Monkey" an officer drove by and shined his spotlight on him. He said that he was on a bicycle. He said that the police helicopter was in the area too and he figured the police were looking

for someone.

I asked Jose if he was wearing the same clothes all night and he said that he was. He said that he was wearing the same clothes for several days. I explained to Jose that there had been a robbery at the Giant station. I then told him that I knew what his real name was and that he had a felony warrant. He asked if we thought he did the robbery and stated that he did not. I asked why he ran from police and he said that he ran because he didn't want to be "in the middle of all that." When I asked again if he changed his clothes he said that he had not but then stated "obviously somebody that has something against me gave you my description." He did not seem to realize that the clothing description from the robbery did not match what he wearing. I asked Jose how tall he was and he said 6'. Jose said that he used both meth and heroin in the past. I asked Jose if he was willing to provide a DNA sample for exclusion in the investigation. He said that he would give his DNA to prove that he was not involved in the robbery. I collected a DNA sample from Jose. He acknowledged that he ran because he had a felony warrant for drugs.

END INTERVIEW

After completing the interview I spoke with Det. Keating who had interviewed the victim. Herbert was not charged with the robbery at the time of this investigation. The victim did not properly identify him during the show up and he didn't match the suspect description given right after the robbery. He was wearing different clothing, including his shoes. He did not have any of the money taken during the robbery. He stated that he ran because he knew he had a warrant. He denied any involvement in the robbery. In addition the victim stated the suspect smelled strongly of alcohol and Herbert had no odor of alcohol on him or his breath.

I had no further involvement in this investigation on 10/11/17.

I then observed a subject wearing all dark clothing come out of the alley directly south of Golf Links. The bicyclist then rode south in the north bound lanes of Kolb. I put my spot light on the subject, and directed officers to the subject.

I observed several marked patrol units approach the subject with their emergency lights on. One stopped directly south of the bicyclist, but the subject failed to yield and continued south past the marked patrol cars. On October 11, 2017, I was called and briefed about a robbery that occurred at 2750 S. Kolb.

I called Detective Poulos and Keating and requested that they respond to the scene.

Upon our arrival, we were briefed by Officer Ramos. He advised that the suspect had entered the business and demanded money from the register.

At one point, the suspect struck the victim in the face.

Dog Unit Officer Pedersen found a subject who matched the description of the suspect. The suspect fled from the officer as he tried to make contact with him. Officer Pedersen's dog bit the suspect as he fled.

The suspect was transported to St. Joe Hospital for treatment.

I assigned Detective Keating to interview the victim and Detective Poulos to interview the suspect at the hospital.

See supplements for interviews. It was learned that the suspect fled from Officer Pedersen because he had a felony warrant.

I responded to the area of Golf Links and Kolb reference an armed robbery. The caller reported a black male wearing all black assaulted him and robbed him. The male was last seen running across Kolb eastbound into the neighborhood. Minutes later Officers arrived and advised the suspect implied a weapon during the robbery. The Officer also said the male was covering his face with a black jersey.

I circulated the area along with several other Police Officers and the Air Support Unit. While circulating I noticed a male wearing what appeared to be all black riding his bike on Golf Links road. I put my spot light on the male and he appeared to try and evade me by riding his bicycle quickly behind the "Big O Tires" on the south east quad of Kolb and Golf Links. I relayed my observation to Air Support who located the suspect a short time later. Air Support said the suspect was riding south on Kolb against traffic. Air Support advised moments later that an Officer tried to stop the suspect but he failed to yield and proceeded to flee from Officers on his bicycle. One Officer who had visual of the male advised via Police radio that the suspect matched the description of the robbery suspect.

I caught up with the two Officers and male suspect near Tamara and Marvin. I could see the two patrol Officers driving behind the suspect with their lights and sirens on. I advised the Officers that I was behind them warning them of a possible K9 deployment. I got another look at the male and noticed he was holding a dark piece of clothing in his hand which seemed consistent with the report that the robbery suspect was covering his face with a black jersey. The male road his bike east on 42nd Street from Marvin where I was able to drive along side of him shouting a K9 warning through my open passenger window. The suspect continued to ride his bike away from me and the other Officers. During this time Air Support was above pointing its spotlight down at the suspect. When the suspect approached 7140 E 42nd he veered his bike off the sidewalk toward the residence. He eventually bailed off the bicycle and started running into a carport. The residence had a car parked in the carport and appeared to be an occupied residence. Deep in the carport I could see a residential door that appeared to lead into the residence. I exited my patrol car and shouted a K9 warning. The suspect did not stop on the K9 warning so I opened the driver side door of my patrol car and deployed Bolt to apprehend the suspect. When I opened the door I intended to put a leash on Bolt before I sent him however he was able to get around me. During the phase where we attempted to stop the suspect Bolt had seen the suspect and essentially locked in him. Bolt chased the male into the carport and made contact with him in the front of the vehicle that was parked in the carport. I drew my gun and began to advance to a position where I could see Bolt and the suspect. When I reached the threshold of the carport I could see the suspect was still on his feet while Bolt was biting his left arm. I gave the suspect multiple commands to get down on the ground but he refused. He was yelling at me to get the dog off of him. I attempted to force the suspect down onto the ground but I was unable to do so due to the suspects size and the small area we were working in. I could see both of his hands and I knew Ofc Kosmider was holding lethal coverage so I opted to holster my handgun and remove Bolt from

the suspects arm. After removing Bolt I started walking back holding him by his collar but I was unable to move all the way back due to the Officers blocking my egress. The suspect suddenly walked toward me putting his hand forward and Bolt bit his hand. Bolt was directed to let go and did so with in a couple seconds. I was able to back all the way out and secure Bolt. Ofc Kosmider and Ofc Stout detained the suspect moments later.

I walked Bolt back to my patrol car and secured him. TFD was ordered to treat the suspect. I walked up to the suspect who was seated in the carport. I noticed his arm had a 4 5 inch cut that would likely require stitches on his left arm. He also had some smaller punctures on his hands. I noticed the shirt that I originally thought was black was purple. Under the orange street lights the purple was difficult to differentiate from black. The suspect was a native American male but his skin was dark in tone and could pass for an African American male especially in the lighting conditions we were operating under.

Ofc Kosmider advised me he had his BWC operating during the incident. He was able to pull up the footage on his cell phone for Sgt Alexander and myself. I briefly viewed it but did not watch the entire video. I briefed Sgt Alexander of my involvement. I remained on scene while Robbery and Professional Standards responded to further the investigation. I was told during this time that the clerk was unable to positively identify the suspect and the suspect we detained was likely giving a false name. Eventually I gave a statement to Professional Standards regarding my involvement in this incident.

The following day I was advised the suspect we detained was identified as Jose Herbert. Herbert was wanted on felony charges out of Maricopa County.

I deployed Bolt to apprehend the suspect for the following reasons:

Herbert matched the description of an armed robbery suspect. He was seen a short distance away from the robbery scene with in minutes of the robbery occurring and attempted to evade me. Herbert refused to stop for Officers who were following him with lights and sirens activated. Herbert was being followed by Air Support with a spot light. Herbert was running from Police despite overwhelming odds that he would be captured. This lead me to believe that he was likely running for something other than just a civil traffic bicycle violation. Herbert veered towards a residence that had indications it was occupied. I could see a car parked in the carport. The yard was well kept and there were no for sale/rent signs of any kinds in the front yard. He eventually bailed off the bicycle on foot and ran towards a residential door deep in the carport. He was also moving towards the end of the car which was a few feet from the door which would have provided him a tactical advantage if he were planning an ambush. He posed a threat to the residents at 7140 E 42nd Street and too Officers who would eventually need to intervene in Herbert's flight from law enforcement. At this time I had given two seperate K9 warnings that I felt he could hear and he refused to stop. I made the decision to deploy PSD Bolt to apprehend him however I wanted to put a leash on him in case one of the two Officers mistakenly chased the suspect. When I opened the door Bolt was able to get passed me and chased after the suspect, both Officers had remained near their vehicles knowing the K9 may be deployed.
