A Message from Pastor Jaime

Just over half of Americans - 51 percent - say they'd like to read the Bible more. That's according to survey results released this year by the American Bible Society.

Maybe you are one of those people. The start of Advent on November 30 marks the beginning of a new church year. So maybe that could be a "new church year" resolution: To read the Bible more.

But maybe you wish that reading the Bible was a little easier. In a book called "The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life," a pastor named Adam Hamilton encourages those of us who want to read the Bible more to start with five verses a day, and work our way up to five chapters a week. He also offers some ideas for how to listen for God to speak as we read the Bible.

That can be hard, especially because the Bible was written in a culture very different from ours, by people different from us in many ways. The Bible contains words and names we struggle to pronounce. It describes rituals and traditions that don't make sense to us. The Bible is long, and heavy, and has small print and pages that can be hard to turn.

Despite that, daily Bible reading is a practice for me – and not just for the purpose of preparing sermons. I want to hear God speak. Here's a practice I use almost every day.

You can remember it by the acronym SOAP.

- S: Scripture. Choose a short scripture passage. If you're keeping a journal, maybe write down a verse or two.
- O: Observation. In your own words, what stood out to you from this passage? What might God be trying to say to you? (Notice that word "might." It's OK if you're not sure!)
- A: Application. How might this passage apply to your life, or our life together as a church?
- P: Prayer. Thank God for speaking to you through this
 passage, or let God know if you're having trouble hearing. Ask
 God for greater understanding, or to help you apply the
 passage to your life.

After I've studied each day's passage on my own, and listened for what God might be saying to me, I open my devotional and read someone else's perspective on that same passage. You might also find a friend to read along with you, so you can share your observations with each other. We get the most out of Bible study when we read scripture together with others.
