A Message from Pastor Jaime

The Bible can be a barrier for a lot of people of faith.

It's large, intimidating, and can be confusing! Even the large print can be pretty small. Many people are wary to read these texts, carry bruises from their upbringing, or simply don't have enough information for the stories to make any sense. You might sometimes wonder: Why do we call this The GOOD Book?

Some of us are wrestling with the stories of the Bible in our new Bible study: How to Read the Bible. This summer, our evening worship services will be another opportunity to experience the "good" in The Good Book – learning and



relearning how ancient stories relate to our stories here and now.

Stories help us make sense of our lives. Through stories, we get to know one another better. Stories reveal more than just facts. When we hear someone's story, we learn something about what really matters to them. Maybe we learn something about how their stories relate to our stories.

The Bible works that way, too.

One way to describe the Bible is the story of God and God's people. But that's not a story that ends with the last word of the Bible. That story continues today, in our lives.

Reading the ancient stories we find in the Bible can help us think about our own stories as God's people. The Bible doesn't just teach us about God. The Bible teaches us some things about ourselves, too!

This summer during our Tuesday evening worship services, we are going to look at some people and their stories from the Old
