# Greetings family of faith!

With Ash Wednesday (March 6<sup>th</sup>) we begin the season of Lent. While we may all be familiar with the idea and practice of "giving something up for Lent,"... ultimately Lent is not a self-improvement project. We don't (or shouldn't!) do things to look pious, or somehow "earn points" with God. Because God already unconditionally loves us, we can instead focus on *deepening* our relationship with God.

Giving up chocolate or sugar or alcohol or meat may indeed be good for our health... but does it draw us nearer to God? Let us honestly ask this Lent...

# What is it, really, that will draw us back into deeper relationship with God and each other?

Lent is all about **reorienting** our lives back to God. We acknowledge the ways in which we have erred, and in Lent we take the journey to **recenter** again on God. And God is eager to walk this road with us!

This Lent we can ask ourselves... When we've become distracted or derailed or otherwise find ourselves "off-path," what practices might help us shift our focus back to God? How might we view life not so much as "us working on ourselves" but on "God working on us?" For we are God's creation, and God continues to tend to us, the work of his hands.

With that in mind, I'd like to suggest a Lenten theme this year of "Cultivating and Letting Go." Think of "God as a Master Gardener."...

Using this imagery, Lent is a season of spiritual gardening, of inviting God to unearth in us what lies fallow, what needs to be tended, and what needs to be pruned away in order for new life to emerge.

This Lent, through worship and other means, we can embrace the literal and spiritual practices of cultivating and letting go.

To get you thinking along these lines, here are two definitions to ponder:

**Cultivate (verb)**: to prepare and use for the raising of crops; to foster the growth of; to improve by labor, care, or study; to refine; to further; to encourage.

Let go (verb): relinquish one's grip on someone or something.

As you worship, study, work, play, and pray in this holy season... let us together ask how God is inviting us to cultivate and let go. And as we do, God promises that new life will emerge!

And be sure to pick up a copy of the Outreach for Hope Devotions (in narthex). These are devotions written by local leaders and pastors from around our Greater Milwaukee synod. May they be a blessing to you as you cultivate your relationship with God this season!
