FAFSA SUMMER SUPPORT

WHAT IS FAFSA?

The FAFSA® is a form filled out by current and future college students in the United States to assess their qualification for student financial assistance. This aid may include grants (which are funds that do not require repayment, such as the Pell Grant and Missouri Access), student loans, or work-study opportunities. The application becomes available annually throughout the academic year and should be submitted by the specified state and federal deadlines.

The Hispanic Development Fund Family College Prep Program Advisors are rigorously trained to stay up-to-date with the latest developments in the FAFSA form and its processes, ensuring comprehensive support for all students and families, regardless of their social security status.

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR APPOINTMENT:

1. FSA ID Login Account for Students & Parent(s)

If the student or parent already has an FSA ID account, please remember to bring all the login credentials. If you haven't set up an account yet, our advisor can help you through the process.

Note: If you have a social security number, it is advisable to create your account at least three days before your appointment to allow ample time for verification.

2. 1040 Tax Forms Year 2022

Filling out the FAFSA involves confirming income based on the parent(s)' 2022 1040 tax returns. For mixed status families, tax information needs to be manually entered in the form.

3. Personal Identification Documents

If a parent's identity does not match during the creation of an FSA ID, they can provide an Attestation & Validation of Identity Form along with a foreign passport or photo ID (Consular Card, Municipal ID, Community ID) and a utility bill.

• All documents submitted for verification or proof of identity must be valid, current, and unexpired.
