Speedmuffin was an American Rock band formed in 1994 from Asbury Park NJ.

Following the release of their self-titled debut album $^{[1][2]}$, produced by Joseph DeMaio Jr.[$^{x][citation \, needed]}$ of Shorefire Recording the band, gained notoriety and began performing on the Budweiser WRAT 95.9 $^{[3]}$ (Greater Media) Concert Series for Concerts East Inc $^{[4][x]}$ and Swing Street Legend Entertainment.

They were best known as the opening act for <u>The Aquanettas</u> ^[5] <u>Blue Oyster Cult</u> ^{[6][7]}, <u>Buck Cherry</u>, ^[8] <u>Big</u> Wreck ^[9] and Jason Bonham ^[10].

Speedmuffin gained attention with their 1994 appearance on TV 34 [10][11] and interview with Rokazine.com [12][12], they were soon filling Concert halls and performing to packed houses on the Jersey Shore. They came to the attention of Fox, Rothschild, O'Brien & Frankel Attorneys at law [1] [14] and were back in the studio making demos for RCA Records, Atlantic Records and Polygram, before forming their own label "Mere

Plankton Records" in 1997 [citation needed] Shortly after the completion of their last studio recording tragedy struck the band when lead singer Joe "Bonz" Bonczek died in an accident. After the band's set back, Speedmuffin finally came to an end in 2003 after their last show with Jason Bonham at the Tradewinds in Sea Bright NJ.[a] where they finally disbanded.

They were part of the <u>Jersey Shore</u> sound for nearly a decade and one of the last bands to play <u>CBGB</u>.^[17] Speedmuffin's original recordings are set for re-release through <u>Apple Music</u> in mid-2017. Singles are currently available through <u>Microsoft</u>. [18] and <u>iTunes</u>.
