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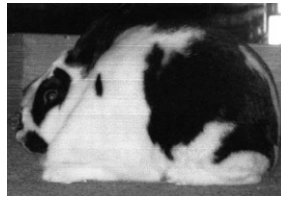
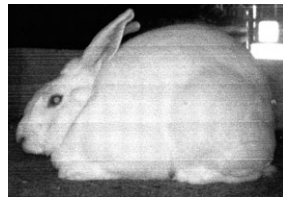

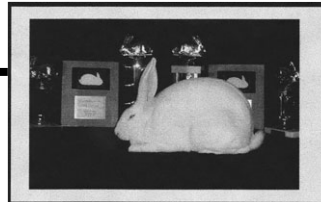

The next winter show will be the third Saturday in February in Watertown, SD. It will be a double open but there will not be a youth show included.. The thinking of several of the people here is that a youth show es the club money as they don't get enough entries to pay the cost of a judge. However, I have found that a couple of the local judges will evaluate the entries for \$1.00 per entry since they are going to be in attendance and exhibiting in the open shows anyway. That allows the youth to compete with their peers. Thus they are not disheartened by those of us that have been doing this hobby for any years. Remember it is the youth that will carry both the ARBA and the New Zealand Federation in the years to come. We have to keep them happy and excited.

Here is hoping that your nest boxes are as full as mine. See you down the road.

New Blue NZ presenter.....

NEW ZEALAND BLUE VARIETY

I have a great admiration and fascination for the New Zealand blues. I thought a little bit of history on the New Zealand Blues might be of interest to you. The NZ Federation accepted in 1931 the Blue New Zealand variety. The ARBA in 1935 voted to take the Blue New Zealand out of the New Zealand breed and make it the Blue Vienna.

I would like to thank Sue Schmidt for all the hard work she has put into the development of the New Zealand Blue's. The work that she has done has helped pave the way for us to continue. She did an excellent job of putting together the standard for the Blue NZ, in which is the standard we are using.

Since I am under the new rules with Stephen Cooper and David Mills and have the COD for the NZ Blues. I will share a little of my background in raising black and blues.

Twelve years ago Charlie Crabtree gave us our first pair of blues. from that pair our original line of blacks began and we have been raising both varieties since. I can't believe it has been this many years that we have been working with them. I dabbled a little in blacks for a short period of time before. Ray Bradway has had a great influence on me; with raising black NZ's all the way back to the early 80's. I remember in 1981 he and his wife Marge had best and best opposite Blacks at the Syracuse New York convention.

This article is about the blue and black variety of New Zealands. My background in genetics goes back to the 1960's (the stone -age) in under-graduate and graduate school in college. It gets pretty scary when I start turning my brain loose on color genetics. I have a great resource in color genetic in my close friends, Kim and Carolyn Shaffer, in which I use frequently.

There are only two actual colors involved in animal coat color, they are black and yellow. White is the absence of any color pigment, there for reflects all light waves from the visible light spectrum. All other colors of fur are the result of the interaction of genes from the black and yellow pigments. These two pigments give rise to the four basic colors black, blue, chocolate and lilac.

The blue rabbit color is controlled by the diluted self recessive genes. Black genes are dominant and chocolate genes being recessive make black the dominant color. Self means that you have the same basic color throughout the whole animal. The genotype for the blue NZ is aaBBdd or aaBbdd. The pair of genes aa represents recessive pair for self, as I have indicated uniform color throughout the body. The BB pair represents both dominate black genes present and Bb pair means you still have a black animal, but it is carrying a recessive gene for brown. When the dd pair shows up this indicates 2 recessive genes for dilute which will give a blue rabbit. Since blue color is caused by a diluted gene one needs mate back to a black animal to maintain a good deep slate blue color.

I hope that gives you an idea of our background and where we are headed. Our goal is to make our specialty showing in 2011, in Indy and our first ARBA showing in 2012, in Kansas.

Be well, stay safe, and SMILE (it makes your face feel good),
and if smiles are good, laughs are even better.

New Year's Resolutions for the Rabbit Enthusiast

As we enter the New Year, I am sure each of you as well as me has established goals for our rabbit hobby. New Year resolutions can be lofty in nature such as winning best of breed at a local, national or convention show, raising that super herd buck, building a new barn, putting in an automatic water system, developing a new breed or variety or just meeting new friends at a rabbit show. When we reach the end of the year our frustration level peaks as we realize we didn't reach those optimistic targets set earlier in the year?

I contend that all rabbit enthusiasts need to identify some New Year resolution(s) for their hobby. In order to improve and remain competitive, every rabbitry needs an aggressive set of goals.

The following are a handful of resolutions that you can set for your rabbitry and/or hobby in 2011.

1. Take A Genetic Audit – Have you really stepped back and honestly evaluated the genetic foundation of your herd and/or breeding program? Genetic progress can only be made with the right set of genetics in place. If your goal of producing a superior herd buck or changing a genetic trait seems to be elusive, maybe the genetic package you are working from needs to change. Ask another breeder for advice and make a change through an objective assessment of your breeding program.

2. Be A Better Manager – Management encompasses key areas of the operation, including facilities, Nutrition, Health, Sanitation and Genetics. Basically, how well do you connect the dots! Each of the aforementioned key areas of your rabbitry does not stand alone but are intertwined to work properly. If my rabbit facility is not designed correctly for shelter, ventilation and bio-security then my rabbits will not be productive, healthy and safe. Fitting these key areas together in an organized format is all about management.

3. Don't Be Afraid To Use Structured Crossbreeding Programs – Heterosis is defined as the increase in an animal's performance on any given trait above

the average of the parent's performance. It is truly one of the few "free lunches" that Mother Nature provides. This phenomenon can be very dramatic in lowly heritable traits such as fertility. Although, the practice of crossbreeding may be controversial among purebred rabbit breeders, it is a tool available to each of us as breeders to improve our genetic package if used in a structured and well thought out plan.

4. Practice Sportsmanship – We all like to win and when we do it feels GREAT!!!!!! And when we don't it feels, well you know the feeling. Rabbit shows provide the opportunity to display the fruit of our labor in a competitive environment. We get a chance to see how our rabbits stack up against the competition. This is a privilege not a right that each of us as rabbit enthusiasts have in this great hobby. We are fortunate to have trained judges available to evaluate our rabbits but we must be prepared to accept their opinion on that given day. Offer a thank you to a judge the next time you are at a rabbit show. When someone other than yourself wins, extend your hand and congratulate that person. Everyone wins when we honor the success of others.

5. Promote Your Breed/Hobby – Do you like the breed of rabbit you raise? I don't believe any one is raising a particular breed(s) that we do not like or enjoy. What are you doing to promote your breed? Provide a membership form to your breed club to every person who purchases a rabbit from you in 2011. Don't be shy, promote your breed and encourage others to do the same.

6. Volunteer, Volunteer, Volunteer – Get involved with your state and national clubs. It's all about giving back and volunteering your time, skills and talent. Maybe you can write articles, provide leadership as a club officer, be a director, show superintendant, writer at a show or web master. Step up and volunteer your time and talent.

7. Have A Vision – Do you know where you are headed? Everyone wants a top rabbit herd or club. Do you know how to get there? In order to be successful at anything you as a breeder must have a vision or roadmap. Successful clubs are no different, they just involve more people who collectively must oar in the same direction or agree upon a common vision for the overall success of the club.

8. Team Work – There is no I in team! Some individuals may think they have achieved success on their own but in reality there is always someone else or others who played a role or have



contributed to their success. People working as a team, one unit in concert with one another will succeed individually as well as collectively.

9. Integrity – Rabbit sales at some point is inevitable for all of us as rabbit breeders. Represent your herd and breed honestly. Don't sell a sack of lies but rather provide the best quality stock which represents your breed honorably. Help a new breeder get started on the right foot. Provide accurate and timely pedigrees on the rabbits you sell and represent your breed with integrity.

10. Support The American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) – Our parent organization ARBA is the engine and the members provide the horsepower to operate the machine. All rabbit enthusiasts have a responsibility to support their parent organization which protects our privilege to enjoy this hobby of raising rabbits that we love. The smooth operation of any machine is connected to the inner works or parts of the unit. We are the inner works! If the machine sputters, a part(s) are failing, somehow we need to fix the parts and get them working for a common vision. Not every hobby has a great umbrella for support and protection as we do with the American Rabbit Breeders Association. Preserve this privilege and get involved with the ARBA.

I hope this list of resolutions inspires you to set goals to enhance the enjoyment of raising rabbits. There is no time like the present to get started on your goals for 2011.

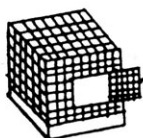

In 40 years He's seen good improvement in New Zealands

I have met a lot of fine people since I showed my first New Zealand White. At the time I never thought I would get so involved with rabbits. It seems I am either showing rabbits or judging rabbits when I should be taking care of my business.

My father told me years ago that if I put the interest in my work that I put in raising rabbits I would be a wealthy man. To me, however, raising winners and the enjoyment I get with rabbits is worth it all. I've been in rabbits 40 years now, and I hope to enjoy them another 40 years.

It would be very hard to imagine how New Zealands have improved in the time I have been raising rabbits. Years back we had a "wooly" problem because breeders before my time introduced Angora blood to improve the fur. Almost every litter produced one or more "woolies" - in other words, a rabbit that had a long wooly coat similar to the Angoras. But after a few years that was spread out and the fur has improved ever since.

I think today we find more finished coats than ever before, for two reasons. One is due to good breeding stock. And the breeders are more knowledgeable on how to condition their rabbits.

Type has improved

The type has improved along with the fur. We find more consistency in what the standard calls

for in body type, mainly in depth of body over the hips and loin. Years back if you had a smooth hip you were fortunate. Usually if you found a rabbit with good depth it was rough.

The improvement that has come about has been the work of several good breeders working together. I always give credit to Harry Rice and Don Guthrie for making me the breeder I am today, and for making me very depth-conscious to the degree I neglected and sacrificed other important factors to get those deep rabbits.

I did get deep rabbits that some breeders claimed were too deep. I'll agree I had some that were pinched in the lower hip, but I will say it is a lot easier to raise a flat full hip rabbit than it is to raise rabbits where depth equals width.

There are two faults I see more of today in New Zealands. One is hips that are wider than they are deep. The other is a flat spot behind the neck, or we might say "the rise to the hips starts too late." To me these are severe faults and are strong heredity factors and very contagious.

I realize we can't go overboard on any one or two points in either raising New Zealands or judging them. We must have a rabbit with overall balance and one that is pretty to look at.

Show Tips

You've probably heard or read that show winning rabbits are bred that way, and no amount of special care or secret feed additives will make a great difference. However, many rabbits are fairly equal in their genetic make-up, and it's often condition that makes the difference between first place and the rest of the class. Type, fur, color, markings and all the rest that it takes to have a show winner require that the rabbit also be in tip-top condition.

Condition

Just what makes an animal be in good condition? For that matter, what is good condition in a show rabbit?

Condition involves both fur and flesh. A rabbit in good fur condition has a coat free of molt, that is uniform and clean. A prime fur coat looks that way and stands out even when you're looking at the animal from several feet away.

Rabbits in good flesh condition are firm, smooth and yet not overly fat. The animal has a solid feel to it when you touch it and a real firm flesh conditioned animal will even be difficult to pick up. This firm feeling often has more to do with genetics than exercise, but feeding is also important.

Health

A sick rabbit won't ever reach top show condition. While any diseased animal understandably won't look or feel right, a rabbit with even a mild cold or one that is off its feed won't be in real fit show condition.

It's a good idea to check all your rabbits on a regular basis. Take time to get them out of the cages, check inside the mouth, ears and for any other signs of disease. A rabbit that hasn't eaten its previous days' meal should also be checked over closely.

Clean

While it's especially obvious when a white rabbit is dirty, colored animals won't show at their best when hutch stained either. Since it's usually easier to keep rabbits clean than to clean them up, start by keeping cages and equipment clean.

Try to house herd bucks away from younger show rabbits. You may have to move a buck that is especially clever at spraying urine over its neighbors, or try a solid partition between him and other animals. Some bucks will also spray feeders and other equipment and then rub themselves; so keep a look out for bucks that start to look a little dirty and clean their cages up.

Once an animal is hutch stained you can usually clean them up. It just takes a little time and patience. Clean water on a cloth will remove many minor stains. A mild soap may be needed to remove tougher ones. Be sure to rinse away any soap you do use. Also try to clean animals several days before the show, it gives them time to repair some of the damage you will do to the fur.

Some other products I have used, or seen used to clean coats include; alcohol, Listerine, com starch, com meal and soft pine shavings. It's best to avoid materials you can't completely clean from the coat such as talcum or baby powder.

Show Training

Some of my cattle showing friends like to kid me about what it's like to halter break a rabbit. I even got a "rabbit halter" as a gift from some of these folks once.

Most rabbits will show better if they've been handled several times before the show. Taking time to pose them and to work with the coat will usually pay off. Those breeds that move around the table, such as Checkered Giants, may benefit the most from repeated training sessions. The commercial rabbits, and most others, need some training just to be comfortable when being handled by the judge.

Show Carrying Cages

Have a carrier that fits your breed of rabbit. It should provide enough space for the animal to sit comfortably, but not so much that the rabbit can injure itself when you're driving to the show. Carriers should have adequate ventilation as well.

It's especially important that rabbits not become overheated when in transport, or at the show room. An animal in good condition will soften in flesh and starts to slip coat very quickly after it gets too warm. Remember that even on a cold day the sun gets very hot as it comes through car windows, so shade your animals as much as possible.

Breed for the Shows

Many raisers will breed does to provide youngsters of a certain age for a specific show. These breeders know about what age their animals will prime out and want them at that age for showing. Different breeds, and strains within breeds, mature and prime at different ages. For this reason you need to know the animals you own and breed accordingly.

Some rabbits mature to be excellent show animals at a young age while others need to be nearing senior weight before they will show well. Select breeders based upon what you want in your breeding herd, and be willing to wait on those animals you suspect will improve with age.

“Secret” Tips

The best tip is sound management. Take good care of your animals and come show time they will do well. There are a few things you can try, perhaps for the fun of doing them as much, or more, than the good they will do.

One thing that several rabbit showmen will do is put some flavored Jell-O in their animals' water. This seems to keep the animals drinking and eating when they undergo the stress from moving to and from shows. Commercial mixes of electrolytes, usually sold to use for young calves or pigs, are also found useful by some rabbit raisers.

A variety of special feeds are used. Some commonly used ones include rolled oats and barley, calf pellets, carrots and apples. Many rabbits also enjoy long stemmed hay or straw.

That “secret” ingredient you'll see some rabbit raisers rubbing into their rabbit's fur is often glycerine. If you do try this dilute the glycerine, that is available at most drug stores, with a good amount of water. It's probably best to experiment with this a bit before you actually use it on a show animal to see if you think it does any good.

How and When to Mate Your Rabbits

According to British rabbit authority Marjorie E.P. Netherway, knowing when and how to mate your rabbits involves a certain amount of guesswork, as well as know-how. She gave some helpful suggestions for solving breeding problems in the July 5th issue of the British animal fancier's magazine *Fur & Feather*.

Two circumstances that make the rabbit breeding process difficult are rabbits' lack of a definite heat or estrus cycle and the differing rates of maturity of the various breeds, Netherway explained. This is further complicated by the fact that rabbits will mate and kindle young before they are fully mature. Immature does often will not care for their litters, however.

The Dutch doe is one of the earliest maturing rabbits, Netherway pointed out, and the giant breeds tend to mature the latest. The average ages to start mating the commercial breeds are 18 to 20 weeks for does and 22 to 24 weeks for bucks.

But some commercial strains of New lealands and Californians have been specifically bred to mature early, she added, so it's important to find out at what age the breeder you buy from begins to mate his animals.

New producers should buy 10 to 12 week old does and 14 to 16 week old bucks, recommended Netherway. That way the rabbits have time to settle into their new surroundings before being bred. Once the new stock has adjusted, mate them according to the breeder's suggestion.

It's important to breed at just the right time, Netherway stressed. If you're too late the doe may become fat and unwilling to breed.

It is not a good idea to use weight as an indicator of maturity either, she cautioned. It's just not reliable. A young doe could be overweight or a mature doe can be underweight.

Receptivity cycle

Sometimes there are clues that a doe is ready to mate, Netherway reported. She may show signs of restlessness and a desire to be with other rabbits. She may rub her chin a lot. The vagina may be congested, moist and purplish in color. This last sign is not necessary for a successful mating.

Although Netherway feels it is not the same as an estrus cycle, she notes that there is a pattern of receptivity in the doe. For one to two days out of every four to 17 days, the doe will not be receptive to mating. Unfortunately, there are no outward signs to indicate when this occurs.

Weather and time of day are other factors to consider in mating rabbits, Netherway said. They will be reluctant to breed in extreme temperatures. In hot, humid weather the best results are likely in early morning or late evening, when it is cooler. It also helps to mate them before they eat.

Netherway listed some basic points to remember on how to mate your animals:

Does should always be taken to the buck cage for mating. Does tend to be territorial and will often fight a buck if he is placed in their cage.

Handle does firmly but gently. Keep toenails trimmed so there is less possibility of the rabbits injuring one another.

Always observe the rabbits closely, to be sure whether or not a mating has occurred. If it appears that they are not going to mate, return the doe to her cage after a few minutes and try again later. Netherway has successfully mated reluctant pairs after a six hour interval.

Some does for no apparent reason are simply uncooperative when it comes to mating. Assisted matings may be called for in such cases, Netherway advised.

To do this, hold the doe's head and shoulders with one hand. Place your other hand under her belly, palm up. Now place her, tail end first, into the buck's pen. Place one finger of the hand under her belly, on either side of the vulva.

When the doe is ready for the buck, her hindquarters will rise and she will throw up her tail. You will be able to feel her rise when she is ready, Netherway asserted. A doe that is still unreceptive will continue to sit with her feet firmly planted on the floor of the cage.

Be careful not to raise the doe too high, but just enough for the buck to conveniently ride her, she added.

Artificial insemination is an alternative to natural matings, but Netherway suggests that it is both expensive and time-consuming.

NEW ZEALAND BLUE VARIETY

By: Al Esterline

I have a great admiration and fascination for the New Zealand blues. I thought a little bit of history on the New Zealand Blues might be of interest to you. The NZ Federation accepted in 1931 the Blue New Zealand variety. The ARBA in 1935 voted to take the Blue New Zealand out of the New Zealand breed and make it the Blue Vienna.

I would like to thank Sue Schmidt for all the hard work she has put into the development of the New Zealand Blue's. The work that she has done has helped pave the way for us to continue. She did an excellent job of putting together the standard for the Blue NZ, in which is the standard we are using.

Since I am under the new rules with Stephen Cooper and David Mills and have the COD for the NZ Blues. I will share a little of my background in raising black and blues.

Twelve years ago Charlie Crabtree gave us our first pair of blues. from that pair our original line of blacks began and we have been raising both varieties since. I can't believe it has been this many years that we have been working with them. I dabbled a little in blacks for a short period of time before. Ray Bradway has had a great influence on me; with raising black NZ's all the way back to the early 80's. I remember in 1981 he and his wife Marge had best and best opposite Blacks at the Syracuse New York convention.

This article is about the blue and black variety of New Zealands. My background in genetics goes back to the 1960's (the stone -age) in under-graduate and graduate school in college. It gets pretty scary when I start turning my brain loose on color genetics. I have a great resource in color genetic in my close friends, Kim and Carolyn Shaffer, in which I use frequently.

There are only two actual colors involved in animal coat color, they are black and yellow. White is the absence of any color pigment, there for reflects all light waves from the visible light spectrum. All other colors of fur are the result of the interaction of genes from the black and yellow pigments. These two pigments give rise to the four basic colors black, blue, chocolate and lilac.

The blue rabbit color is controlled by the diluted self recessive genes. Black genes are dominant and chocolate genes being recessive make black the dominant color. Self means that you have the same basic color throughout the whole animal. The genotype for the blue NZ is aaBBdd or aaBbdd. The pair of genes aa represents recessive pair for self, as I have indicated uniform color throughout the body. The BB pair represents both dominate black genes present and Bb pair means you still have a black animal, but it is carrying a recessive gene for brown. When the dd pair shows up this indicates 2 recessive genes for dilute which will give a blue rabbit. Since blue color is caused by a diluted gene one needs mate back to a black animal to maintain a good deep slate blue color.

I hope that gives you an idea of our background and where we are headed. Our goal is to make our specialty showing in 2011, in Indy and our first ARBA showing in 2012, in Kansas.

Be well, stay safe, and SMILE (it makes your face feel good),
and if smiles are good, laughs are even better.

New Year's Resolutions for the Rabbit Enthusiast

As we enter the New Year, I am sure each of you as well as me has established goals for our rabbit hobby. New Year resolutions can be lofty in nature such as winning best of breed at a local, national or convention show, raising that super herd buck, building a new barn, putting in an automatic water system, developing a new breed or variety or just meeting new friends at a rabbit show. When we reach the end of the year our frustration level peaks as we realize we didn't reach those optimistic targets set earlier in the year?

I contend that all rabbit enthusiasts need to identify some New Year resolution(s) for their hobby. In order to improve and remain competitive, every rabbitry needs an aggressive set of goals.

The following are a handful of resolutions that you can set for your rabbitry and/or hobby in 2011.

1. Take A Genetic Audit – Have you really stepped back and honestly evaluated the genetic foundation of your herd and/or breeding program? Genetic progress can only be made with the right set of genetics in place. If your goal of producing a superior herd buck or changing a genetic trait seems to be elusive, maybe the genetic package you are working from needs to change. Ask another breeder for advice and make a change through an objective assessment of your breeding program.

2. Be A Better Manager – Management encompasses key areas of the operation, including facilities, Nutrition, Health, Sanitation and Genetics. Basically, how well do you connect the dots! Each of the aforementioned key areas of your rabbitry does not stand alone but are intertwined to work properly. If my rabbit facility is not designed correctly for shelter, ventilation and bio-security then my rabbits will not be productive, healthy and safe. Fitting these key areas together in an organized format is all about management.

3. Don't Be Afraid To Use Structured Crossbreeding Programs – Heterosis is defined as the increase in an animal's performance on any given trait above

the average of the parent's performance. It is truly one of the few "free lunches" that Mother Nature provides. This phenomenon can be very dramatic in lowly heritable traits such as fertility. Although, the practice of crossbreeding may be controversial among purebred rabbit breeders, it is a tool available to each of us as breeders to improve our genetic package if used in a structured and well thought out plan.

4. Practice Sportsmanship – We all like to win and when we do it feels GREAT!!!!!! And when we don't it feels, well you know the feeling. Rabbit shows provide the opportunity to display the fruit of our labor in a competitive environment. We get a chance to see how our rabbits stack up against the competition. This is a privilege not a right that each of us as rabbit enthusiasts have in this great hobby. We are fortunate to have trained judges available to evaluate our rabbits but we must be prepared to accept their opinion on that given day. Offer a thank you to a judge the next time you are at a rabbit show. When someone other than yourself wins, extend your hand and congratulate that person. Everyone wins when we honor the success of others.

5. Promote Your Breed/Hobby – Do you like the breed of rabbit you raise? I don't believe any one is raising a particular breed(s) that we do not like or enjoy. What are you doing to promote your breed? Provide a membership form to your breed club to every person who purchases a rabbit from you in 2011. Don't be shy, promote your breed and encourage others to do the same.

6. Volunteer, Volunteer, Volunteer – Get involved with your state and national clubs. It's all about giving back and volunteering your time, skills and talent. Maybe you can write articles, provide leadership as a club officer, be a director, show superintendant, writer at a show or web master. Step up and volunteer your time and talent.

7. Have A Vision – Do you know where you are headed? Everyone wants a top rabbit herd or club. Do you know how to get there? In order to be successful at anything you as a breeder must have a vision or roadmap. Successful clubs are no different, they just involve more people who collectively must oar in the same direction or agree upon a common vision for the overall success of the club.

8. Team Work – There is no I in team! Some individuals may think they have achieved success on their own but in reality there is always someone else or others who played a role or have



contributed to their success. People working as a team, one unit in concert with one another will succeed individually as well as collectively.

9. Integrity – Rabbit sales at some point is inevitable for all of us as rabbit breeders. Represent your herd and breed honestly. Don't sell a sack of lies but rather provide the best quality stock which represents your breed honorably. Help a new breeder get started on the right foot. Provide accurate and timely pedigrees on the rabbits you sell and represent your breed with integrity.

10. Support The American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) – Our parent organization ARBA is the engine and the members provide the horsepower to operate the machine. 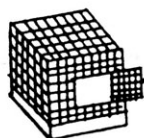

In 40 years He's seen good improvement in New Zealands

I have met a lot of fine people since I showed my first New Zealand White. At the time I never thought I would get so involved with rabbits. It seems I am either showing rabbits or judging rabbits when I should be taking care of my business.

My father told me years ago that if I put the interest in my work that I put in raising rabbits I would be a wealthy man. To me, however, raising winners and the enjoyment I get with rabbits is worth it all. I've been in rabbits 40 years now, and I hope to enjoy them another 40 years.

It would be very hard to imagine how New Zealands have improved in the time I have been raising rabbits. Years back we had a "wooly" problem because breeders before my time introduced Angora blood to improve the fur. Almost every litter produced one or more "woolies" - in other words, a rabbit that had a long wooly coat similar to the Angoras. But after a few years that was spread out and the fur has improved ever since.

I think today we find more finished coats than ever before, for two reasons. One is due to good breeding stock. And the breeders are more knowledgeable on how to condition their rabbits.

Type has improved

The type has improved along with the fur. We find more consistency in what the standard calls

for in body type, mainly in depth of body over the hips and loin. Years back if you had a smooth hip you were fortunate. Usually if you found a rabbit with good depth it was rough.

The improvement that has come about has been the work of several good breeders working together. I always give credit to Harry Rice and Don Guthrie for making me the breeder I am today, and for making me very depth-conscious to the degree I neglected and sacrificed other important factors to get those deep rabbits.

I did get deep rabbits that some breeders claimed were too deep. I'll agree I had some that were pinched in the lower hip, but I will say it is a lot easier to raise a flat full hip rabbit than it is to raise rabbits where depth equals width.

There are two faults I see more of today in New Zealands. One is hips that are wider than they are deep. The other is a flat spot behind the neck, or we might say "the rise to the hips starts too late." To me these are severe faults and are strong heredity factors and very contagious.

I realize we can't go overboard on any one or two points in either raising New Zealands or judging them. We must have a rabbit with overall balance and one that is pretty to look at.

Show Tips

You've probably heard or read that show winning rabbits are bred that way, and no amount of special care or secret feed additives will make a great difference. However, many rabbits are fairly equal in their genetic make-up, and it's often condition that makes the difference between first place and the rest of the class. Type, fur, color, markings and all the rest that it takes to have a show winner require that the rabbit also be in tip-top condition.

Condition

Just what makes an animal be in good condition? For that matter, what is good condition in a show rabbit?

Condition involves both fur and flesh. A rabbit in good fur condition has a coat free of molt, that is uniform and clean. A prime fur coat looks that way and stands out even when you're looking at the animal from several feet away.

Rabbits in good flesh condition are firm, smooth and yet not overly fat. The animal has a solid feel to it when you touch it and a real firm flesh conditioned animal will even be difficult to pick up. This firm feeling often has more to do with genetics than exercise, but feeding is also important.

Health

A sick rabbit won't ever reach top show condition. While any diseased animal understandably won't look or feel right, a rabbit with even a mild cold or one that is off its feed won't be in real fit show condition.

It's a good idea to check all your rabbits on a regular basis. Take time to get them out of the cages, check inside the mouth, ears and for any other signs of disease. A rabbit that hasn't eaten its previous days' meal should also be checked over closely.

Clean

While it's especially obvious when a white rabbit is dirty, colored animals won't show at their best when hutch stained either. Since it's usually easier to keep rabbits clean than to clean them up, start by keeping cages and equipment clean.

Try to house herd bucks away from younger show rabbits. You may have to move a buck that is especially clever at spraying urine over its neighbors, or try a solid partition between him and other animals. Some bucks will also spray feeders and other equipment and then rub themselves; so keep a look out for bucks that start to look a little dirty and clean their cages up.

Once an animal is hutch stained you can usually clean them up. It just takes a little time and patience. Clean water on a cloth will remove many minor stains. A mild soap may be needed to remove tougher ones. Be sure to rinse away any soap you do use. Also try to clean animals several days before the show, it gives them time to repair some of the damage you will do to the fur.

Some other products I have used, or seen used to clean coats include; alcohol, Listerine, com starch, com meal and soft pine shavings. It's best to avoid materials you can't completely clean from the coat such as talcum or baby powder.

Show Training

Some of my cattle showing friends like to kid me about what it's like to halter break a rabbit. I even got a "rabbit halter" as a gift from some of these folks once.

Most rabbits will show better if they've been handled several times before the show. Taking time to pose them and to work with the coat will usually pay off. Those breeds that move around the table, such as Checkered Giants, may benefit the most from repeated training sessions. The commercial rabbits, and most others, need some training just to be comfortable when being handled by the judge.

Show Carrying Cages

Have a carrier that fits your breed of rabbit. It should provide enough space for the animal to sit comfortably, but not so much that the rabbit can injure itself when you're driving to the show. Carriers should have adequate ventilation as well.

It's especially important that rabbits not become overheated when in transport, or at the show room. An animal in good condition will soften in flesh and starts to slip coat very quickly after it gets too warm. Remember that even on a cold day the sun gets very hot as it comes through car windows, so shade your animals as much as possible.

Breed for the Shows

Many raisers will breed does to provide youngsters of a certain age for a specific show. These breeders know about what age their animals will prime out and want them at that age for showing. Different breeds, and strains within breeds, mature and prime at different ages. For this reason you need to know the animals you own and breed accordingly.

Some rabbits mature to be excellent show animals at a young age while others need to be nearing senior weight before they will show well. Select breeders based upon what you want in your breeding herd, and be willing to wait on those animals you suspect will improve with age.

“Secret” Tips

The best tip is sound management. Take good care of your animals and come show time they will do well. There are a few things you can try, perhaps for the fun of doing them as much, or more, than the good they will do.

One thing that several rabbit showmen will do is put some flavored Jell-O in their animals' water. This seems to keep the animals drinking and eating when they undergo the stress from moving to and from shows. Commercial mixes of electrolytes, usually sold to use for young calves or pigs, are also found useful by some rabbit raisers.

A variety of special feeds are used. Some commonly used ones include rolled oats and barley, calf pellets, carrots and apples. Many rabbits also enjoy long stemmed hay or straw.

That “secret” ingredient you'll see some rabbit raisers rubbing into their rabbit's fur is often glycerine. If you do try this dilute the glycerine, that is available at most drug stores, with a good amount of water. It's probably best to experiment with this a bit before you actually use it on a show animal to see if you think it does any good.

How and When to Mate Your Rabbits

According to British rabbit authority Marjorie E.P. Netherway, knowing when and how to mate your rabbits involves a certain amount of guesswork, as well as know-how. She gave some helpful suggestions for solving breeding problems in the July 5th issue of the British animal fancier's magazine *Fur & Feather*.

Two circumstances that make the rabbit breeding process difficult are rabbits' lack of a definite heat or estrus cycle and the differing rates of maturity of the various breeds, Netherway explained. This is further complicated by the fact that rabbits will mate and kindle young before they are fully mature. Immature does often will not care for their litters, however.

The Dutch doe is one of the earliest maturing rabbits, Netherway pointed out, and the giant breeds tend to mature the latest. The average ages to start mating the commercial breeds are 18 to 20 weeks for does and 22 to 24 weeks for bucks.

But some commercial strains of New lealands and Californians have been specifically bred to mature early, she added, so it's important to find out at what age the breeder you buy from begins to mate his animals.

New producers should buy 10 to 12 week old does and 14 to 16 week old bucks, recommended Netherway. That way the rabbits have time to settle into their new surroundings before being bred. Once the new stock has adjusted, mate them according to the breeder's suggestion.

It's important to breed at just the right time, Netherway stressed. If you're too late the doe may become fat and unwilling to breed.

It is not a good idea to use weight as an indicator of maturity either, she cautioned. It's just not reliable. A young doe could be overweight or a mature doe can be underweight.

Receptivity cycle

Sometimes there are clues that a doe is ready to mate, Netherway reported. She may show signs of restlessness and a desire to be with other rabbits. She may rub her chin a lot. The vagina may be congested, moist and purplish in color. This last sign is not necessary for a successful mating.

Although Netherway feels it is not the same as an estrus cycle, she notes that there is a pattern of receptivity in the doe. For one to two days out of every four to 17 days, the doe will not be receptive to mating. Unfortunately, there are no outward signs to indicate when this occurs.

Weather and time of day are other factors to consider in mating rabbits, Netherway said. They will be reluctant to breed in extreme temperatures. In hot, humid weather the best results are likely in early morning or late evening, when it is cooler. It also helps to mate them before they eat.

Netherway listed some basic points to remember on how to mate your animals:

Does should always be taken to the buck cage for mating. Does tend to be territorial and will often fight a buck if he is placed in their cage.

Handle does firmly but gently. Keep toenails trimmed so there is less possibility of the rabbits injuring one another.

Always observe the rabbits closely, to be sure whether or not a mating has occurred. If it appears that they are not going to mate, return the doe to her cage after a few minutes and try again later. Netherway has successfully mated reluctant pairs after a six hour interval.

Some does for no apparent reason are simply uncooperative when it comes to mating. Assisted matings may be called for in such cases, Netherway advised.

To do this, hold the doe's head and shoulders with one hand. Place your other hand under her belly, palm up. Now place her, tail end first, into the buck's pen. Place one finger of the hand under her belly, on either side of the vulva.

When the doe is ready for the buck, her hindquarters will rise and she will throw up her tail. You will be able to feel her rise when she is ready, Netherway asserted. A doe that is still unreceptive will continue to sit with her feet firmly planted on the floor of the cage.

Be careful not to raise the doe too high, but just enough for the buck to conveniently ride her, she added.

Artificial insemination is an alternative to natural matings, but Netherway suggests that it is both expensive and time-consuming.

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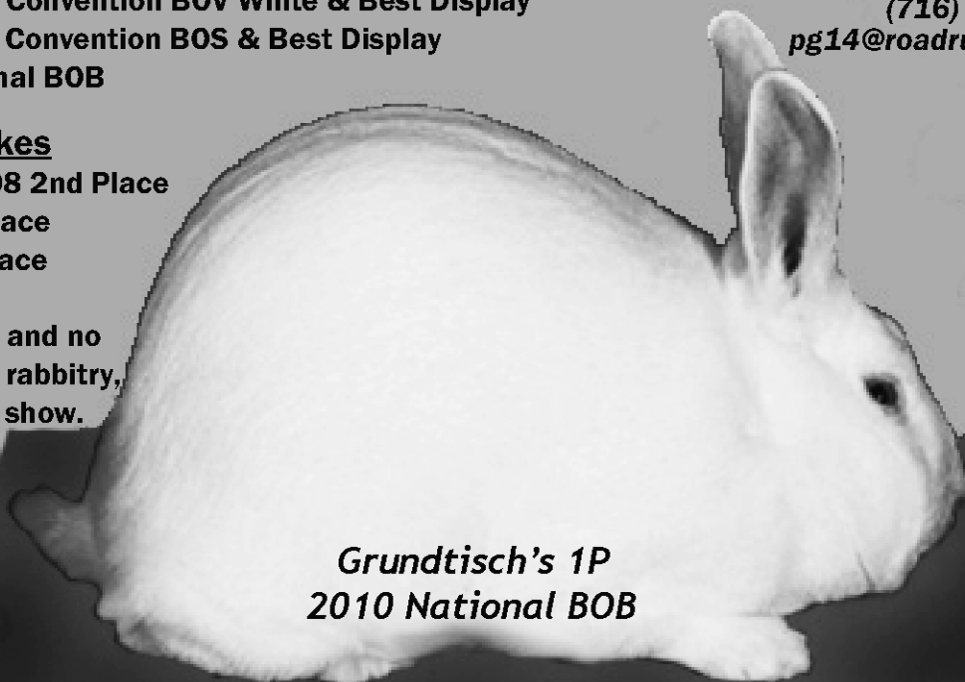

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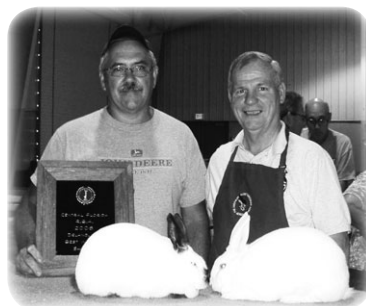
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
