Since its establishment, LWN has become a leading platform for nurturing female football talent and expanding the visibility of women in Malaysian sports.

This year's competition features eight elite teams Kelana United FC, Sabah FA, Selangor FC, Kuala Lumpur FA, KL Rangers FC, Young Tigress, Red Eagles Soccer Club, and MBSJ FC each representing the growing strength and determination of women athletes across the nation.

Promoting fair representation of women in decision making spaces within sports organisations and ensuring that women are not only participants but leaders shaping the future of football in Malaysia.

Awareness and Public Engagement

Amplifying the discourse on the barriers faced by women in sports particularly football including systemic underinvestment, cultural bias, and limited institutional support.

Empowerment Pathways

Highlighting football as a career and leadership pathway for women and advocating for long term support structures for female athletes, coaches, referees, and administrators.
