The Greatest Commandments and the Greatest Love

As We Gather

When you were growing up, there was most likely a time where your parents said, "Do this." You heard them say it. You knew they said it. Yet for whatever reason, you did not do the "this" they asked you to do. Were there consequences? If there were, you can probably recall those consequences even today. Even though there were consequences, did you still know they loved you? That's what today is all about. God tells His children in the Old Testament Reading, "Do this"—the greatest commandment. Jesus also points out the second great commandment in our Gospel. None of us has kept those commandments perfectly. That is where the Epistle comes into the picture, reminding us of God's greater love when He sent Jesus to the cross. Have we disobeyed Him? Yes. Has He ever stopped loving us? The cross answers that question. He never has stopped loving us; His love for us is so great.

Forgive us, Lord.

Pastor: We have been called by the Word of God: love the Lord your

God "with all your soul."

People: We confess that our mind, will, and emotions are often

drawn away from You and to things that will not last.

Forgive us, Lord.

Pastor: We have been called by the Word of God: love the Lord "with

all your might."

People: Instead of loving You with all our might to build Your

kingdom up, we use it to build things around us that will

not last. Forgive us, Lord.

Pastor: Our Lord Jesus reminds us that there is a second great

commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

People: Lord, we confess we turn a blind eye to our neighbors.

There are those all around us struggling to get through the

day, and we walk past them without even a second

thought. Forgive us, Lord.

Pastor: Then I ask you before God, who searches the heart: do you

confess that you have sinned against God and one another in

thought, word, and deed?

People: I confess that we have failed to keep the two great

commandments by what we have done and what we have

failed to do. Heavenly Father, I do not deserve Your

forgiveness, but ask for it because of the greatest love ever

shown at the cross.

Pastor: Although we all have failed to keep these two great

commandments, God was moved with compassion, and He sent His Son to die for you on the cross and rise again that you might be forgiven. Therefore, in the name and at the command of my Lord Jesus Christ, I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the ♣ Son and of the

Holy Spirit.

People: Thank You, Lord, that Your love for us is greater than we

can understand or deserve. Help us, by Your Holy Spirit, to

amend our sinful ways and seek to walk in Your ways.
