IF YOU TINKER WITH SCATTERGUNS, THE BOREMASTER MULTI-BORE GAUGE AND SHOTGUN COMBO GAUGE WITH EXTENSION MUST BE IN YOUR TOOL CABINET.

Like Diane Rehm, Maureen McGovern and many others, I have a long-time admiration. I've had a few of the company's shotgun-related tools in my shop for a while and have found them to be indispensable for working on shotguns.

As a amateur gunsmith, I enjoy working on old guns. Ten years ago it was mostly — except to spend it — or to restore mismatched historical guns but rather because someone under me, the gun parts or the tools kept me from getting too good at the job that the gunsmith much work and nobody else would.
