INDOOR PISTOL PRACTICE

Combine dry fire and laser dots to sharpen your handgun skills

As ammo costs rise, keeping your handguning skills in shape doesn't mean breaking the bank if you practice drills that emphasize repetition and increase muscle memory. It could be as simple as drawing and pointing your unloaded handgun over and over; however, there is one problem. Doing that you're never sure if your aim is accurate.

Enter the Pistolero PistoLaser, designed to reveal if you are hitting your mark during such practice sessions. It's basically a laser pointer that fits into the barrel of your handgun. From the pointer (or spud as it is called) a wire extends to the trigger. At the end of the wire is a small trigger switch so when the trigger is pulled, the laser shoots out and you immediately

know if you are on target or not. You will be surprised because the laser doesn't lie.

The PistoLaser comes in five color-coded caliber spuds in .22, 9mm/357, .40, .44, and .45 calibers. Installation is simply a matter of screwing on the laser nose cone to the appropriate spud and adjusting the switch to the trigger.

The gear is housed in a plastic case with foam padding and includes the trigger switch, batteries and an adjustment wrench, all extremely easy to set up within mere minutes. The PistoLaser is also useful for practicing clearing drills in home defense scenarios in low-light settings so that you are always prepared. (\$250; www.shotguncombogauge.com) — James Card
