SPPTA Meeting

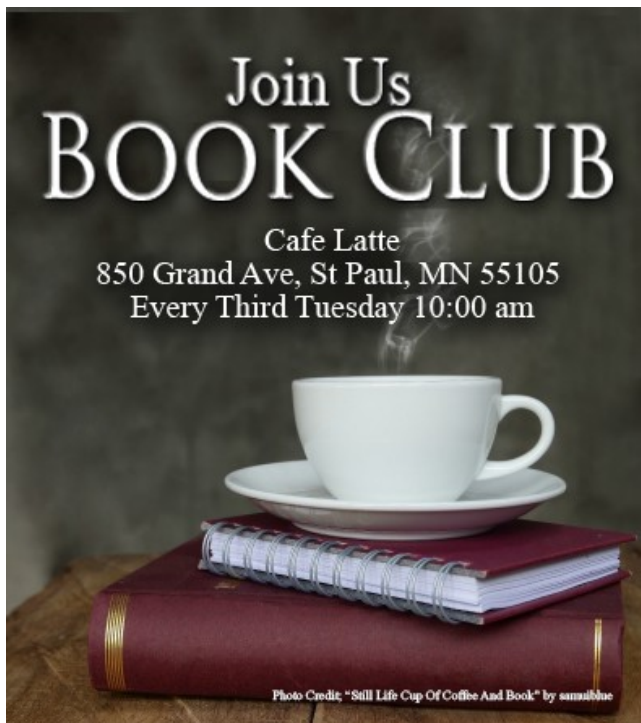
Highlights from September 8

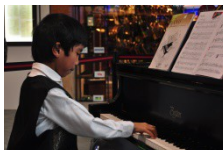

Concerto Competition -- Minor changes...Major Difference

News Flash -- if you have not entered a student into SPPTA's Concerto Competition before, now is the time! Here are three changes to encourage your involvement and your student's participation. First of all, the registration fee has been reduced to \$50 per student. Secondly, the winners' cash prize amounts have been increased so 3rd place receives \$100, 2nd place - \$150, and 1st place - \$250 plus a solo performance with the Mississippi Valley Orchestra. And the final bonus is time. Since the competition is not scheduled until December 5th, first Saturday in December, you even have additional weeks to prepare.

Registration is currently open, and the deadline is October 15th. The registration form and competition guidelines are in the SPPTA Handbook as well as on the SPPTA website under the Programs for Students tab. All participating students receive two valuable critiques from the highly qualified judges adjudicating the preliminaries. These critiques serve to simultaneously congratulate the student on their musical investment which allowed them to participate in the event, and supply additional feedback and perspective to encourage the student's ongoing musical growth. So help us spread the word...we're looking forward to an amazing day of music, with a full list of contestants, and an auditorium filled with individuals eager for a treat!

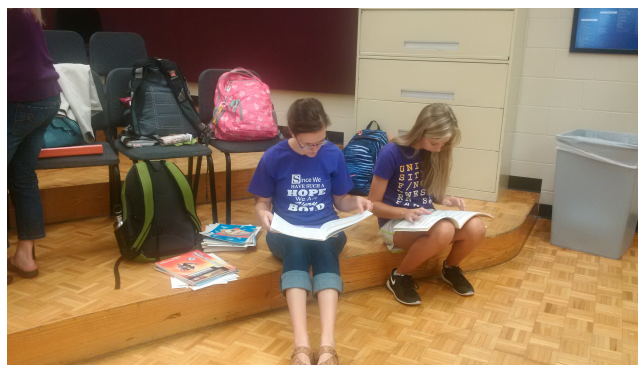
It is a delight to be able to build into the lives of these students with resources, education, and encouragement. Sue articulated well, the
