## Last Chance: Honors and Awards to be held April 26th

Every spring SPPTA holds a one-day event called Honors and Awards Auditions. The purpose of this event is to motivate outstanding students by offering an award and giving them a performance opportunity where they will share the stage and enjoy hearing each other play. Next year the program will change completely so this is the last chance to participa te in this program.

Students who enter play one piece for a judge. Students are grouped into the following age categories:  $4^{th}$  grade and under,  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$  grades, 7th and 8th grades, 9th and 10th grades, and 11th and 12th grades. The best performer in each age group wins a cash award. Awards range from \$60 to \$150. The judge chooses up to three outstanding students in each category to play at the Honors and Awards Recitals, which is held the evening of the auditions.

The literature is chosen from the standard teacher literature. Some examples of pieces chosen by age categories in recent years are:

4<sup>th</sup> Grade and under: J.S. Bach-Short Prelude No. 3 in C minor and Short Fugue in 2 voices; Prokofiev Fugitive Visions, Op. 22, Nos. 1, 3, 5 and 10.; Gurlitt Scherzo in D minor; Pieczonka-Tarantella.

Grades 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup>: Rachmaninoff-Polichinelle Op. 3, No. 4; Schubert-Impromptu, Op. 90, No. 2; Debussy Arabesque No. 2 in G Major; Mozart-Sonata K. 332.

Grades 7th-8th: Bartok-Ten Easy Pieces, No. 1, 5, 6, and 10; Glinka-Variations on a Russian Song; Khatchaturian-Toccata.

Grades 9<sup>th</sup> -10<sup>th</sup>: Chopin-Nocturne, Op. 15, No. 3; Haydn- Sonata No. 50, Mvt. 1; Chopin-Valse, Op. 64 No. 2; Franz Liszt- Concert Etude in Db Major No. 3.

Grades 11<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup>: Rachmaninoff-Prelude in C# minor Op. 3 No. 2; Chopin-Scherzo in B minor; Ravel Sonatine.

The date for this year's auditions is Saturday, April  $26^{th}$ , 2014 and will take place at Schmitt Music Roseville location. The auditions take place from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. Winning students return at 5:00 p.m. that same day for the recital in the Auditorium.

The application form is available on the website and in this newsletter. The postmark deadline is April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014. Send your application with the \$25.00 fee and two stamped envelopes to:

How many notes are in a piano concerto? How many times do you encounter them practicing for a concerto competition? How about if you go in to win? How about after you do win...because now you're preparing for a performance...and this year you're preparing for two! How do you play differently to get ready for your first rehearsal with the orchestra? How about after? Now you're incorporating the conductor's feedback as well. So many notes, so many times. Such intentionality, intensity, and investment to create a musical reward for us to enjoy!

Join us for spectacular music on April 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> to hear SPPTA's Concerto Competition winner, Michael Tang, play the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> movements of Grieg's Piano Concerto in A minor with the Mississippi Valley Orchestra. In addition to this piece, the Mississippi Valley Orchestra and guest conductor Maestro Henry Charles Smith will perform Forsberg– Choral Symphonic on "How Brightly Beams the Morning Star" and Saint-Saëns – Symphony No. 3 "Organ" with soloist Dee Ann Crossley.

Unexpectedly, this final piece also brought with it an amazing invitation. Needing two pianists to play the four hands one piano duet included in the Organ Symphony's orchestration, Mississippi Valley Orchestra approached SPPTA, creating the opportunity for two more of SPPTA's talented students to be on the performance stage. 9th grader Madie Scott, playing Primo, and 7th grader Elliot Fobbe, playing Secondo have eagerly rearranged their schedules to accommodate the required rehearsals and practice needed to seize this unique opportunity, play with the orchestra, and participate in the amazing music! 


