#### Fresh Start

As the summer heat goes away and the fall breeze comes in, each fall semester feels like a time when we can start anew. It is funny that as the seasons head into the dead of winter, we feel like we are just beginning. We can get all our students to practice that had troubles in the past. We can fill up our schedule with exciting new students. We can try out that new incentive or program that we never have before. If you summer was like mine, I used mine to rest and recharge for the new school year. Now, I feel ready to take on some new things and I encourage you to do the same! This year I am trying out a new lesson format called 20/20/20 lessons. I heard about this on Facebook and decided to jump in with both feet. learn about different composers. These lessons are also great for duets and trios too! Piano can be such a lonely activity for lots of students and I feel that is a huge barrier that a lot of students cannot overcome. That is the main reason why I decided to try this format, it helps make piano more of a social activity. That is what I am trying new this fall. What are you most excited for this year?






#### **RECITAL PROGRAMS**

With the school year getting under way, now is the time when teachers really emphasize the necessity of goal setting with their students. In the music world we are part of, much of that means learning new repertoire and gaining confidence in performing. Participating in SPPTA recitals is a wonderful way to encourage students to grow in both of these areas.

This year sees some changes in the SPPTA recital program. As was experimented with last year, SPPTA is continuing to rotate venues for recitals and will be holding then in diverse and exciting locations including various churches around the Twin Cities, the Landmark Center, and Schmitt Music in Brooklyn Center.

This year also introduces the elimination of required memorization for students to receive participation points to working towards the SPPTA Recital Award Program. Memorization will still be required for students to qualify for nomination to perform in the spring SPPTA Honor's Recital.

We have also restructured the recital fees to make it simpler for teachers and their students. There will now be a flat \$10 registration fee per student.

I hope to see and hear many of your students performing in the coming months!

#### Some History, and a New Face...

What concerto have been played by the most recent competition winners? This question was asked of me by a teacher considering placing a student in this year's event. I only knew the last four years — the years during which I have been helping — so I shared those, and then started digging. What pieces have been played? What composers have been represented? Here's what I found.

Place these titles into a playlist with Spotify or YouTube, and you have hours of fantastic, powerful, expressive piano music composed within the Classical, Romantic, and Contemporary era, and played by orchestras from around the world. For more than 30 years, the winners of SPPTA's Concerto Competition have been fortunate to have an orchestra with whom they, too, can perform their concerto in concert. Thank you, Mississippi Valley Orchestra, for an amazing on-going partnership, and for continuing to keep this opportunity for our students a priority, as leadership and artistic directors have changed through the years.

I am pleased to introduce Ho-Yin Kwok, the new artistic director for the Mississippi Valley Orchestra. He has been finalizing the amazing concert programming for the coming 2017-2018 season, and will be working with this year's concerto competition winner for the May 6<sup>th</sup> concert at Augustana Lutheran in St. Paul. Ho-Yin is described by *Classical Voice of North Carolina (CVNC)* as an "impressive conductor... outstanding in his attention to detail and his command of the big picture." Ho-Yin Kwok was twicenamed Conducting Fellow of Eastern Music Festival in North Carolina, where he conducted the faculty ensemble, Eastern Festival Orchestra, and Guilford Symphony Orchestra. Ho-Yin has previously served as

assistant conductor of Collegium Musicum Hong Kong and assisted its debut in Carnegie Hall of New York City. He also conducted tours with the Hong Kong Baptist University Symphony in Southern China and concerts in Hong Kong Cultural Centre. Other previous conducting positions include conductor of Sacred Heart Canossian College Orchestra and St. Stephen's College Orchestra, with which he made his debut in Großer Musikvereinssaal, Vienna and won 1st Prize in the Summa Cum Laude International Youth Music Festival 2014.

Besides conducting, Ho-Yin is also a keen violinist. As a soloist, Ho-Yin has collaborated with orchestras of the University of Minnesota, University of Iowa, Hong Kong Baptist University, Collegium Musicum Hong Kong, Orchestra of Shenzhen Arts School and Hong Kong Youth Symphony Orchestra. He has performed solo in Hong Kong, Shenzhen, Leipzig, Munich, Vienna, Salzburg, Prague, Minneapolis and other cities around the world. Equally active is his participation as an orchestral player, serving as concert master for many orchestras, and collaborating in multiple ensembles.

Merging the perspectives gained by being concert master of the orchestra, a performing soloist, and artistic director and conductor, Ho-Yin Kwok possesses quite the expertise to offer the talented musician who wins this year's SPPTA Concerto Competition. Register your students through October 15<sup>th</sup>, and plan to attend what always proves to be an amazing event on Saturday, December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017 at the Brooklyn Center Schmitt Music auditorium.
