Letter from the President

Promoting your Studio

Do you have a marketing budget? What do you do to market your studio? If you do none of the above, then you are like most piano teachers that rely on word of mouth alone. There are some marketing ideas that don't cost a lot of money. Here are a few ideas you could try in your studio.

Get a Website

If you don't have a website for your studio, there are lots of easy to use and cheap options out there like Weebly. com, Squarespace.com, or webnode.com. Websites are important because this is how most people find services today. When their friends tell them about your studio, you want them to be able to find you online, so they can contact you and sign-up for lessons. Most websites are free to try and then require a small monthly subscription fee. Having your own domain name is important too, and some of the site above offer a free domain name for the first year with a subscription.

Facebook

You can also create a Facebook page for your studio. It is easy to start too, you just need some photos of yourself and your studio. Then just invite all your friends to like your page and keep posting new content. If you want to get into advertising, Facebook is a great place to start. You can reach new people on Facebook for as little as \$2 a day. You set the overall budget too, so you can spend as much or as little as you would like.

Recitals

Have you ever thought of using your own recitals to market your studio? Try some new ideas for your recitals that are fun for both the performers and the audience, that keep bringing your students back and will help spread word of mouth even more when your current students brag about how fun their recitals are. A Cheering Recital, who can have the loudest cheering crowd in the audience? Have your students bring many friends and family and see who can cheer the loudest at the end of their performance. Your students will feel like rock stars and the audience will have fun cheering as well! You could also try some new audience participating pieces with your students, Wendy Stevens has some pieces that involve the audience. An Artwork Recital, have your students create or find art that captures their performance piece. Then project that art while they are performing their piece. Lots of students are artistic in other ways and they would love to show them off!


