The Honor's Recital will be held on Sunday, June 10th at St. Catherine's; teachers who have had students nominated to perform will receive an email in May which they can reply to to register. Thank you to all the teachers and their students who have participated the recitals for this year!

This season of recitals has experienced many wonder performances from a wide range of ages and abilities, from little 5-year-olds who have just been playing for a few months, to advanced high school students who are preparing for college auditions, to adult students who have decided to enrich their lives with not only learning to play music but perform it as well. No matter the musician's age or ability, performing music is a powerful way for a person to express themselves and SPPTA's goal is to empower teachers and their students to find many opportunities to a share the beauty of music with others.

The SPPTA board is always brainstorming ways to improve the SPPTA recital program. Next year will be see a few modifications to recitals. We will no longer be using registration forms; teachers will now email the names of the students they are registering and the information about the pieces that are being performed. Please continue to mail the registration fees and SASE's to the programmers.

Because students and teachers invest so much time into learning and polishing the pieces for

recitals, we would like the audience members to know how much the performers own the pieces they are playing. Therefore, we are now requesting teachers to submit 2-4 sentences that the student would like the programmer to read to the audience before the student performs. This could be sharing what mood the student is trying to evoke in the piece, an interesting fact about the composer, a brief description of the form of the piece, or simply something that the student would like the audience to listen for. We encourage teachers and their students to be creative! This can be used as a stepping stone towards preparing for MMTA's Music Bridges program.



The Center seeks an inspiring and creative individual who has excellent interpersonal skills, editorial experience, fluency with technology and demonstrates a high level of writing and communication. Experience in publishing is an asset. Experience with team management is preferred. Duties will include extensive editing, writing, editorial process management, content scheduling and planning, design process, and the overall advancement of the publication.

Requirements: Extensive experience in and familiarity with piano teaching and learning, commitment to piano teacher education, and connection to the professional community. Strong organizational and communication skills—the ability to interface with various publics and to successfully meet deadlines is essential. Strong language skills, with a particular focus on style, grammar, and the written word is required. Functionality in MS Word, Excel, web-based communications, and a professional music notation program (Finale or Sibelius preferred) is needed.
