## What does ministry look like? The simplest explanation is "being the hands and feet of God"

You don't have to travel the world, or pastor a church, or become a full time missionary. Here are some simple examples of what you may already be doing. Can you increase them? Can you add others in your giftings? What God given desires jump out when you read these?

The Bible offers numerous examples of how individuals can act as God's hands and feet by serving others and spreading His love. This is not exhaustive. Here are 30 examples:

- 1. Feeding the Hungry: Jesus feeding the multitude with five loaves and two fish (Matthew 14:13-21).
- 2. CLOTHING THE NAKED: PROVIDING CLOTHING FOR THOSE IN NEED (MATTHEW 25:36).
- 3. Sheltering the Homeless: Offering hospitality to strangers (Hebrews 13:2).
- 4. Healing the Sick: Jesus' ministry of healing the sick and infirm (Matthew 4:23-24).
- 5. Visiting the Imprisoned: Ministering to those in prison (Matthew 25:36).
- 6. Caring for Widows and Orphans: James emphasizes pure religion as caring for widows and orphans in their distress (James 1:27).
