Arrest report (PAGE ONE)

I, the arresting officer, certify that I:
• identified myself as a police officer
• told the arrestee that they were being arrested
• told the arrestee what crime they were being arrested for
• explained why it was necessary to arrest the accused
• explained to the accused that they were not free to leave

Arrestee name: Briggs, Harry

Date of arrest: 10 January

Time of arrest: 23:15

Place of arrest: Bateman House, New Malden

Persons present: Sgt Calum Brown, PC Helen Duggen, PC Brian Jones.
Mr Wilson Revel (Fire Brigade lead)

Notes:

- Arrestee was seen leaving burning building
- Arrestee's face appeared to be bleeding
- Looked dazed. When asked name, suspect responded "Harry"
- Arrestee was asked if there was anyone else inside. Arrestee responded with "I don't know, I assume he's gone"
- Strong smell of paraffin coming from arrestee
- When asked why he had been in the building, arrestee responded "I came to..." before refusing to continue
- The arrestee refused to speak or responded "no comment" to all further questions.
- Arrestee was then arrested under suspicion of arson.
- Suspicion of manslaughter added to the reason for arrest at 23:57 of the same date

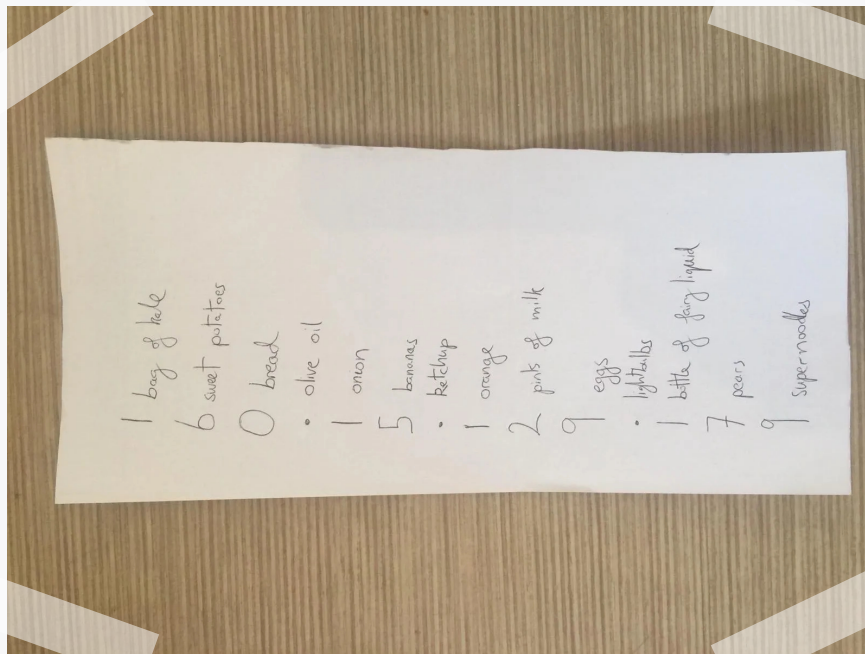
