Family Promise at First U U of Stockton August 25, 2022

Our second hosting Aug 21 thru Aug 28 is underway and going VERY well thanks to the "hands on" support of our congregation's members : Rosemary Atkinson, Mary Bullard, Christy Dillemuth, Fred Dillemuth, Sharon Marr, Cindy Milford, Leslie, Anita, Bev Blum, Miriam Cottin-Rack and family, Gene Aguirre, Kevin Smith and Gloria Smith and a few others who donated .

This time around, there have been a number of volunteers willing to do the overnight host duties.*

As always, there has been an equal number of supporting volunteers from our sister church the Cathedral of the Annunciation.

Our final hosting will be November $20^{\text{th}} - 27^{\text{th}}$.

There will be a coordinators meeting August 30 7pm at the Family Promise Day Center. On the agenda will be wins/ misses within the congregations' experiences as well as calendaring for next year.

One item we have discussed at FUU / Cathedral is to have our own set of inflatable beds. This will be a cost of 60/Twin 80/ queen. Our current guest population is 6-two adults and 4 children. Approx. cost would be 360 for the twins plus 160 for queen beds for the hosts. (though actually I think the twin is fine for a single individual). Our discussions are in the early days and we will be having a group meeting after services, mid September. (we haven't checked the church calendar yet to avoid conflicts.)

The Family Promise Day Center at Zion Lutheran is being renovated and there will be an open house on September 29th 5:30 PM.

* What is an overnight host? In a nutshell, arrive between 7:30 – 8pm; say hello to guests and evening hosts. 8 pm tell guests to go to bed because the van comes early. Lock cottage and J Hall doors so intruders cannot enter. Visit and play games with the evening hosts and other overnight host, if there is time. Go to your space and read a book, practice your violin or guitar or piano. Fall asleep, wake up 5:45, open J Hall and turn on lights for guests to come in and make their breakfasts. Guests leave at 6:30 am. Clean area and dishes from breakfast. Lockup the cottage and church.

KEEP ON GIVING INTO THE FUTURE!

Ensuring the long term strength of our church is important! We love our church, and give to it in so many ways—financially, volunteering, baking goodies, serving on committees, cleaning up—the list goes on. But there's one way to give that we don't often think about—giving after we're gone. Perhaps we don't want to consider our own mortality, or it seems too hard to figure out. But it's not that difficult.

Here are two easy ways to do it.

- 1. Add the First Unitarian Church to your Will or Trust. Wills and Trusts need to be reviewed and updated periodically, why not now? While your attorney can advise you, language in our trust is "... to the First Unitarian Church, current Tax ID Number 94-6184441, a non-profit corporation, located at the time of the execution of this trust at 2737 Pacific Avenue, Stockton, CA 95204." Note that the name is "First Unitarian Church", which is our official name with the IRS.
- 2. Make the First Unitarian Church a beneficiary of an IRA, giving the same Information as above, especially the Tax ID. Since we are a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization, IRA money comes to us tax free, unlike other recipients who pay taxes on withdrawal. This can be done as simply as filling out a new beneficiary form.

If you decide to help First UU into the future, it would be great for the church to know about it!
