

Cufflinks? Shirt Studs?

We know, these are accessories you don't use everyday. Not to worry, at Sukie's we try and make putting on your Tux as easy as possible. This handy little guide will explain what they are and how you wear them!

When you rent a tux from Sukie's Tuxedo, it will come with a small bag containing two cufflinks, and depending on your tie choice, you may also receive four studs. This is your "Formal Jewelry."



- If you're wearing a bow tie with your tuxedo you will want to wear ALL 4 of the studs on your formal shirt.
- If you're wearing a long tie with your tuxedo you will not wear the studs on your formal shirt because your long tie would cover them up.

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CUFF LINKS

With your shirt on, pinch the cuffs of your sleeve together in the manner shown. You may be tempted to fold the edges of the cuffs together to form a cylinder or barrel shape. Don't do this... it's best to wear your cuffs in the manner shown in the photo. This way is much more appropriate - and stylish!



Insert the cufflink through both holes in the shirt's cuff. The colored, decorative part of the cufflink (usually black or ivory), should face the outside when your arm is at your side.



On the backside of the cuff, flip the bar to hold the cufflink in place. If you have a Bow Tie, locate your set of four studs for the next two steps...



SHIRT STUDS

Our tuxedo shirts have specially designed stud holes and you'll find them located right next to the button. Each stud should first be fed through the back stud hole on the formal shirt. Ignore the pearl button that may be present on your shirt. It is not needed if studs are worn.



Then, with the stud acting as a button, feed it through the front button hole in the formal shirt. This will secure the shirt front closed. Smooth out any wrinkles your fingers may have made and move on to the next three studs. After all four studs are inserted, you're ready for your formal event!
