We hosted two collector groups in 2019 and a neighboring group in Indiana, The Randolph County Antique Tractor Club, spent Saturday with us after driving their tractors about twenty miles to get to our show. The Oil Field Engine Society always has a nice display of oil field engines and are willing to share their knowledge with visitors.

This was the first year for the Buckeye Allis Club to come to our show as a guest group. They had an impressive count of 103 tractors, as well as several pieces of equipment.

The New Idea Historic Preservation Committee was also featured. Many area people were employed at the New Idea plant in Coldwater, Ohio. There were several rare pieces of equipment on display and many people eager to share their memories of working at New Idea.

The addition of indoor vendor space in the Coliseum brought some new and unique vendors to our 2020 show.

Tractor games, the DYN0, and special events in the Ohio Center rounded up the new or updated additions to the 2019 show.

CAMPING IN 2020

We will be following the same camping rules in 2020 as before: campers will be spotted, no "u" shapes or "4 square," 15' on either side of the camper, and 10' back to back. Campfires are allowed as long as they are above the ground and contained. Any changes in campfire rules because of grounds conditions will be posted and announced at the show.

Dogs in the campground area will need to be registered in the show office according to regulations by the Darke County Health Department. The information we need is similar to that of getting a dog license, including the date of the dog's last vaccination. We have to make this information available to the Darke County Fairboard only if there is an issue with a dog's behavior such as biting or attacking someone. There is no registration fee for this.
