In addition, the Board of Directors are enjoining in the strict compliance with the Provincial Government in implementing the rules and regulations under the General Community Quarantine and all the additional restriction measures as provided under the National Inter-agency Task force resolution. For your guidance, we quote some important portion of the provincial Executive Order No. 2HIM<sup>2</sup>-02 Series of 2021, to wit:

*Section 2.2 All mass gatherings including religious gatherings shall be prohibited. The holding of face-to-face meetings are highly discouraged and in alternative, virtual meetings are highly encouraged.*

*Section 2.3 Holding of weddings, baptism, and funeral services shall be limited to 10 persons.*

*Section 2.9 Visiting persons outside their immediate family or other households is strongly discouraged. Even at home, the wearing of masks for the elderly, the vulnerable and for the rest of the household, is strongly advised.*

Thus, for your additional information, we are attaching the copies of the above mentioned provincial Executive Order.

Let us take part and unite to stop the Covid 19 and its new variants. Let us help to ensure the safety of everyone. Please be guided accordingly to stay safe!

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**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2HIM<sup>2</sup> - 02  
SERIES OF 2021**

**ENJOINING STRICT COMPLIANCE BY THE PROVINCE OF BATANGAS WITH THE RULES AND REGULATIONS UNDER THE GENERAL COMMUNITY QUARANTINE AND ALL THE ADDITIONAL RESTRICTION MEASURES AS PROVIDED UNDER THE NATIONAL INTER-AGENCY TASK FORCE RESOLUTION NO. 104 SERIES OF 2021**

**WHEREAS**, Section 15 of Article II of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them;

**WHEREAS**, Pursuant to Section 16 of Republic Act No. 7160 also known as the Local Government Code of 1991, local government units are empowered to promote health and safety within their territorial jurisdiction;

**WHEREAS**, the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID) issued the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines to harmonize and codify existing policies of the IATF and member-agencies pertaining to community quarantine, which shall be applied to all regions, provinces, cities, municipalities and barangays placed under community quarantine;

**WHEREAS**, as provided under the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines, General Community Quarantine (GCQ) refers to the implementation of temporary measures limiting movement and transportation, regulation of operating industries, and presence of uniformed personnel to enforce community quarantine protocols;

**WHEREAS**, the entire Province of Batangas was placed under GCQ for the entire month of March 2021 wherein several Component Cities and Municipalities requested for de-escalation to Modified General Community Quarantine (MGCQ);

**WHEREAS**, the Provincial IATF of Batangas wrote a letter to the Regional IATF requesting that the Component Cities and Municipalities that were granted a MGCQ status be escalated to GCQ status until 04 April 2021 by reason of the increase in the COVID-19 positive cases in the Province;

**WHEREAS**, for the purpose of uniformity and orderly implementation of the GCQ, all City and Municipal Officials, Philippine National Police (PNP) Personnel, Barangay Captains and their subordinates should strictly follow the rules and regulations as prescribed by the aforementioned issuances;

**NOW THEREFORE**, in view of the foregoing, **I, HERMILANDO I. MANDANAS**, Governor of the Province of Batangas, by virtue of the powers vested in me by existing laws, do hereby order, that:

**SECTION 1.** The relevant and substantial provisions of the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine (Omnibus Guidelines) in the Philippines for

General Community Quarantine should be strictly followed in the entire Province of Batangas.

**SECTION 2.** The following additional restriction measures pursuant to National Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases Resolution No. 104 Series of 2021 shall be put in place in the entirety of the Province of Batangas:

- 2.1 To prevent the transmission of COVID-19 to other parts of the country, only **essential travel into and out of the Province of Batangas** shall be allowed. Public transportation shall remain to be operational at such capacities and protocols in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Department of Transportation. The use of active transportation shall likewise be promoted;
- 2.2 **All mass gatherings including religious gatherings shall be prohibited.** The holding of face-to-face meetings are highly discouraged and in the alternative, virtual meetings are highly encouraged;
- 2.3 Holding of weddings, baptisms, and funeral services shall be limited to 10 persons;
- 2.4 Current operational capacities of essential and non-essential services/industries shall be maintained, subject to adherence to safety protocols and minimum public health standards, particularly in the prohibition of aggregation in communal areas such as pantries, canteens, etc. However, the private sector is enjoined to adopt similar alternative working arrangements as those already in place in the executive branch of government, i.e. thirty percent (30%) to fifty percent (50%) operational or on-site capacity, where applicable;
- 2.5 Dine-in restaurants, cafes, and establishments shall be limited to delivery, take-out, and any outdoor or al fresco dining shall be allowed provided that additional engineering and administrative controls are put in place such as but not limited to, placing of acrylic or similar dividers, limiting to two persons per table with appropriate seating arrangements (one-seat apart in a diagonal configuration);
- 2.6 The suspension of operations of businesses/industries pursuant to IATF Resolution No. 103 issued on March 18, 2021, is hereby reiterated. The operations of driving schools, traditional cinemas and video- and interactive- game arcades, libraries, archives, museums, and cultural centers, limited social events at accredited establishments of the DOT, and limited tourist attractions except open-air tourist attractions shall be temporarily suspended. Cockfighting and cockpit operations, including in areas under Modified General Community Quarantine shall be temporarily suspended. Venue capacity of outdoor dine-in restaurants and cafes, personal care services shall be reduced to a maximum of fifty percent (50%);
- 2.7 **A common curfew** shall be imposed by all component LGUs **between ten o'clock in the evening to five o'clock in the morning** (10:00 PM to 5:00 AM). Workers, cargo vehicles, and public transportation, however, shall not be restricted by such curfew;
- 2.8 Any person below eighteen (18) years old and above sixty-five (65) years old, those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity, or other health risks, and pregnant women, including any persons who reside with the aforementioned, shall be required to remain in their residences at all times, except when indispensable under the circumstances for obtaining essential goods and services, or for work in their respective industries and offices. Persons above sixty-five (65) years old

may likewise be allowed for outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of outdoor exercises; Persons with disability (PWD) may be allowed outdoors for their therapy as well as for outdoor non-contact sports and other forms of outdoor exercises, upon presentation of prescription from their physicians or presentation of PWD ID; and

- 2.9 Visiting persons outside their immediate family or other households is strongly discouraged. Even at home, the wearing of masks for the elderly and the vulnerable and for the rest of the household, is strongly advised.

**SECTION 3.** The Provincial Inter-Agency Task Force is mandated to enact the necessary Resolutions for the implementation of the specific guidelines and action plans to combat COVID-19 in the Province in accordance with this Executive Order and the National Issuances and Guidelines.

**SECTION 4.** All Law, Orders, Issuances, Rules and Regulations, or any part thereof, subsequently enacted by the National Government, which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Executive Order are hereby adopted and shall supplement, modify or repeal the latter.

**SECTION 5.** This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
