SPECIAL ORDINANCE NO. 133-2023

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING POSSESSION AND MANAGEMENT/HANDLING OF DOMESTICATED ANIMALS SUCH AS DOGS AND CATS THROUGH LOCAL RABIES PREVENTION, CONTROL, ERADICATION COORDINATING COMMITTEE, COMPULSORY REGISTRATION AND VACCINATION AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

WHEREAS, Section 7 of Republic Act 9482 likewise known as the "Anti-Rabies Act of 2007" stated the responsibilities of local government unit in controlling, prevention and eradication of human and animal rabies;

WHEREAS, the Anti- Rabies Act provides that the LGUs shall support dog immunization and registration, strictly enforce laws and ordinances pertaining to impounding and handling of stray dogs as well as those prohibiting trade of dog meals;

WHEREAS, this Sanggunian, in order to curb the transmission of rabies to humans, deems urgent the enactment of a policy aimed at promoting responsible pet ownership while penalizing residents who are negligent in providing care to their pet animals;

WHEREAS, the adoption of Provincial Ordinance No. 003-2012 particularly Section 21 Penalties and Violation to strictly enforce the regulations regarding the maintenance of dogs and other companion animals, especially for those dogs and cats roaming in the streets for public safety and providing penalties for violation thereof;

WHEREAS, on May 17, 2000, the Sangguniang Panlungsod of the City of Lipa enacted the Special Ordinance No. 05-2000 Series of 2000, an ordinance creating the Lipa City pound and providing implementing guidelines thereof;

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2015, the Department of Agriculture published Administrative Circular 05 Series of 2015 with subject: "Policies and Guidelines in the Establishment and Maintenance of Animal Shelters";

WHEREAS, the above-mentioned City pound Ordinance needs to be more encompassing with regards to control, prevention and eradication of rabies and amended to comply with the Anti- Rabies Act and its implementing rules and regulations as indicated in Joint DA, DOH, DepEd, DILG AO no. 01 series of 2008;

WHEREAS, in observance of the foregoing provisions, the adoption of COMPANION ANIMAL REGULATION ORDINANCE OF LIPA (CAROL) OF 2023: An Ordinance Regulating the Ownership and Care of Companion Animals such as Dogs and Cats through Local Rabies Prevention, Control, Eradication Coordinating Committee, Compulsory Registration and Vaccination and Providing Penalties thereof is necessary;

WHEREAS, be it ordained by the Sanggunian Panlungsod of the City of Lipa, that:

**Rule I
GENERAL PROVISIONS**

Section 1. Title. This ordinance shall be known as the "Companion Animal Regulation Ordinance of Lipa (CAROL) of 2023."

Section 2. Purpose. This ordinance is promulgated to prescribe the procedures and guidelines for its implementation.

Section 3. Coverage. This ordinance shall apply to unleashed, stray, and abandoned companion animals such as dogs and cats only.



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**Rule II
DEFINITION OF TERMS**

Section 4. Definition of Terms. The words and phrases used in this ordinance shall mean as follows:

- a. *Bitten* refers to an act by which a Dog seizes, cuts or grips with its teeth so that the skin of a person has been wounded, pierced or scratched.
- b. *Concerned Officials* refer to barangay officials, health workers, police officers or government veterinarians.
- c. *Direct Supervision* refers to range supervision where physical presence of the veterinarian within the barangay is necessary.
- d. *Dog* refers to a common quadruped domestic animal belonging to the order carnivora (male or female), scientifically known as *canis familiaris*.
- e. *Euthanasia* refers to the process of painless death to Dogs and other animals.
- f. *Kennel* refers to any facility, land premises, shed, barn, building, trailer, or other structure or area housing intended to house domestic dogs for breeding, maintaining, keeping, and training. For regulation purposes, a kennel shall have 20 dogs or more at least 6 months of age and above.
- g. *Impound* refers to seize and hold in the custody of the law.
- h. *Owner* refers to any person keeping, harboring or having charge, care or control of a Dog including his/her representative.
- i. *Pound* refers to a public enclosure for stray animals.
- j. *Public place* refers to any place open to the public like parks, malls, markets, streets, etc.
- k. *Rabies* refer to a highly fatal disease caused by a lyssa virus, transmitted mainly through the bite of an infected animal and is characterized by muscle paralysis, hydrophobia and aerophobia, and other neurological manifestations.
- l. *Rabies transmission* refers to the transmission or passage of the Rabies virus through a bite by an infected animal, or through contamination with virus-laden saliva on breaks in the skin and of mucous membranes such as the eyes, the lips, the mouth, or the genital organs.
- m. *Rabies Vaccination/Immunoprophylaxis of Humans* refers to the inoculation of humans, with modern day rabies vaccines or Rabies immunoglobulin, by a trained doctor or nurse under the supervision of a qualified medical practitioner.
- n. *Rabies Vaccination of Dogs* refers to the inoculation of a Dog with a Rabies vaccine by a licensed government or private veterinarian or trained individual under the direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian. The services of the said trained individual shall be limited only to Rabies Vaccination Injection in Dogs and only during government mass vaccination campaigns.
- o. *Post-exposure Treatment (P.E.T)* refers to an anti-Rabies treatment administered after an exposure to Rabies, which include local wound care, Rabies vaccine, with or without anti-Rabies immunizing agent.
- p. *Pre-exposure Prophylaxis (P.E.P.)* refers to Rabies vaccination administered before an exposure to Rabies to those who are at high risk of getting Rabies.
- q. *Stray dog* refers to any dog leaving its Owner's place or premise and no longer under the effective control of the owner.
- r. *Veterinary or Human Barbiturates* refer to drugs that depress the function of the central nervous system.
- s. *S2 Licensed Veterinarian* refers to a license veterinarian who is authorized by law to purchase or buy or administer regulated drugs as determined by Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency and other like government agencies.

**Rule III
REGULATIONS**

Section 5. Impounding

- I. **Impounding and Field Control of Unleashed, Stray and Abandoned Companion Animals**
 - a. Owners must confine their pets within their premises and put those on leash when brought outside or in public. Leash must not be longer than 1.5m in length.
 - b. An impounded animal shall be released to its owner upon payment of fines according to the number of days that it is impounded.
 - c. Unvaccinated impounded animals will be vaccinated against rabies prior to release to its owner.
 - d. Impounded animals shall be kept in the Stray Animal Impounding Center for a maximum period of seven days.
 - e. Unclaimed animals shall be put on adoption/rehoming list when the three-day period for claiming has lapsed. These animals shall be kept in the center and offered for adoption within three days.
 - f. Animals that are un-rehomed shall be euthanized after three days as per the guidelines set under the Republic Act 8485 likewise known as the Animal Welfare Act.
 - g. Dogs or animals found outside the premises of the owner are considered stray dogs/animals. Stray dogs are immediately secured for impounding at the dog pound.
 - h. **Humane Catching of Animals** – Animals shall be captured, transported and restrained in a most humane manner. No dragging, whipping, throwing, unnecessary lifting and pulling by the neck, ears or the legs of the animals shall be done. The following shall be considered:
 1. Selection Criteria for Personnel/Catching Team



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- i. A mature individual that shall have empathy and act humanely towards dogs and animals in general.
- ii. Shall have undergone training on humane handling of animals conducted by experts on the field.
- iii. Shall be courteous to the public.
- iv. Shall be appropriately dressed (uniform) and identifiable preferably in uniform with visible personal identification.
- v. Catching Team shall consist of at least 2 animal catchers and 1 driver.
- 2. Selection Criteria for Equipment
 - i. Pole Nets – used to capture moving animals without harming them, allows catching more than 2 dogs. Net shall be deep enough to be twisted to fully restrain the dog.
 - ii. Loop Pole – allows restrain of dog while maintaining a safe distance.
 - iii. Cage Trap – used for elusive dogs and cats.
- 3. Obstruction of Personnel/Catching Team
 - i. It shall be unlawful for any person to oppose, resist, or otherwise interfere with the Personnel or Catching Team in the exercise of his duties as such.
- II. Adoption of Impounded Animals and Barangay Notice on Stray Animal Impounding Operations
 - a. The Barangay on which a recent stray animal operation has been conducted within its jurisdiction, must post within three (3) days the said notice.
 - b. Unregistered animal/s confined within the prescribed period of stay in the impounding area can be adopted by any person provided that he will pay for the registration and impounding fee of the animal and provided further, he can provide proper and appropriate care and management to the animal.
 - c. Animals for rehoming shall be vaccinated against rabies, registered and neutered or spayed before release to its new owner. A registration fee of P50.00 shall be collected from the new owner.
- III. Care of Impounded Animals
 - a. Health Care
 - 1. Any animal which appears sick or injured shall be given immediate medical treatment.
 - 2. All dogs and cats shall be vaccinated against rabies.
 - 3. All dogs and cats shall be neutered as soon as they are healthy to undergo surgery.
 - 4. All dogs and cats shall be routinely treated for ticks, fleas and worms. Neutered cats shall have an easily visible ear notch or tattoo, to avoid the risk of exposure to a second operation.
 - b. Vaccinations
All Impounded animals shall have updated vaccinations against rabies.
 - c. Euthanasia Protocols
 - 1. The stray animals impounding facility shall have euthanasia protocols which ensure that animals do not suffer or remain untreated.
 - 2. Sick animals shall either be under a treatment program, if treatable, or euthanized if untreatable, as determined by a licensed veterinarian.
 - 3. Euthanasia shall be strictly performed by an S2 licensed veterinarian only.
- IV. Stray Animal Impounding Facility Specifications and Design
 - Facility Design
The designs of shelters shall provide an environment conducive to maintaining animal health. Facilities shall be appropriate to species, the number of animals receiving care and expected length of stay in order to ensure physical and psychological well-being of the animals, and shall conform the following requirements:
 - a. Space Allocation Requirement
 - 1. Administration Office
There shall be an office allocated for the shelter manager, visitors, registration of incoming and outgoing animals.
 - 2. Employee's Quarters
There shall be an area allocated for the employees' quarters with a restroom, kitchen, bathroom
 - 3. Animal Areas
There shall be separate enclosures housing cats and dogs. Ideally, animals shall be kept in large communal enclosures if the animals are compatible, provided they are not under quarantine, are not sick and are already neutered or placed in individual cages.
 - 4. Quarantine Area
 - i. All shelters shall have a designated Quarantine Area where newly rescued and admitted animals will be immediately placed upon arrival and kept for a minimum of fourteen days (14), or longer if prescribed by the Shelter Veterinarian (a veterinarian). The Quarantine Area shall be situated where there will be the least amount of foot traffic to avoid the spreading of communicable diseases.
 - ii. No contact between animals in quarantine or between quarantined animals and other animals at the shelter shall be allowed. Waste coming from each quarantined animal shall not be accessible to other animals, shall not into contact with human foot traffic and shall lead straight into the drain.
 - iii. Disinfecting footbath or spray bottle containing broad-spectrum disinfectant shall be made available.
 - 5. Treatment Area/Euthanasia Area
 - i. It shall have a Treatment Area for shelter animals away from the animals' living areas and quarantine areas where sick or injured animals can be treated or where animals can be euthanized.



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ii. The treatment area shall have a water source and an examination table.

6. Surgery Room

There shall be room specific for performing surgeries.

b. Provision of Pens and Runs

1. Common areas for animals in the facility shall be areas where only (1) neutered (2) healthy and (3) rabies-vaccinated animals are kept.
2. Indoor and Outdoor runs shall measure not less than 1.83m (6ft) wide, 3.05 (10ft) long with fencing not less than 1.52m (5ft) high.
3. Adjacent individual roofed pens shall measure at least 0.91m x 1.22m (9x4 feet) to accommodate one native/aspin-sized dog (or a dog under 13kgs).
4. Roofed pens for multiple animals shall measure at least 2.74m x 1.22m (9x4 feet) roofed pens which is good for a maximum of five (5) native-sized dogs (or dogs under 13kgs) or 3 to 4 cats.

c. Floors and base of runs

All pens shall have smooth concrete floors, runs and troughs Floors of roofed pens shall be sloped toward a drainage system which has been made inaccessible to dogs and cats by either covering or placement exterior to the run fencing.

d. Humidity and Ventilation

The indoor portion of the facility where animals are housed shall be ventilated in such a manner as to provide fresh air to maintain health and comfort of animals.

e. Water Supply

The facility shall be supplied with a sufficient amount of running water for the purpose of maintaining proper sanitary conditions. The facility shall also provide a sufficient and permanent supply of potable water for the animals.

f. Lighting

Electrical lighting shall be provided in all pens.

g. Drainage System

The facility shall have an open drainage at a width of 0.60m and a depth of 0.50m and floors shall slope towards a drain that is outside the animal living areas. A drain opening of not less than 20cm diameter is recommended and it shall be covered by a strainer grid. The provision of mains sewers, a septic tank is essential and built in accordance with the building code.

h. Burial Pit

The facility shall have an appropriate local area for proper burial of euthanized animals.

Section 6. Registration, Welfare, Care, and Protection.

Dog and Cat Vaccination and Registration

- a. Owned dog and cats shall be registered automatically upon rabies vaccination by the City Veterinary Office. All veterinary clinics or facilities and other practicing veterinarians who have rendered animal vaccination services are required every end of the month to submit copies of vaccination records of the all animals vaccinated during the month to the City Veterinary Office within a month. Non-compliance with this requirement shall be a ground for revocation of business permits, without prejudice to the required compliance to DILG Memorandum Circular 2016-12 dated January 27, 2016 and such other regulations.
- b. All pet dogs and cat owners are required to mandatorily register their dogs and cats with their respective barangay or City Veterinary Office at the option of the owner. There shall be a one-time registration fee of P50.00 per dog and cat.
- c. Registration fees collected by the Barangay shall be used to support stray animal control and impounding activities in barangays with established mini-dog pound.
- d. Breeders shall have their kennels registered in accordance with the business regulations set by the city.

Section 7. Sanitation, Disease, and Nuisance Control

a. Socialized Pet Ownership Program

1. The City shall limit ownership of pets to persons or households without adequate area for confinement and leashing their pets. A minimum area of 2 square meters shall be required per household to maintain one head of dog in its compound. Free roaming cats shall be prohibited outside the owner's household.
2. If the Kennels as defined in this Ordinance are kept within a village or subdivision being operated by a Homeowners Association the household shall be required to annually secure Homeowners clearance to maintain the same. Failure to secure the said clearance, the owner shall suffer the penalty of 5,000 fine per animal. Failure to pay the appropriate fine within 15 days from notice of violation shall result to confiscation of the said animal by the City Veterinary Office.

b. Urinating and Defecation of Animals

1. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having control or custody of any dog to permit the animal to urinate or defecate in public upon the private property or another within the City.
2. Any person taking an animal in public or upon the private property of another should carry at all times a bag or suitable receptacle and instruments for the removal and disposal of animal feces.



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Rule IV
ENFORCEMENT MECHANISM

Section 8. Implementing Agency

Local Rabies Prevention, Control and Eradication Coordinating Committee

The City Rabies Prevention, Control and Eradication Coordinating Committee (CPRECCC) shall be composed of the following:

Section 9. Functions of Implementing Agency

- a. The CPRECCC shall implement the Local Rabies Ordinance aimed to control and eradicate rabies in our city. The following shall be included in the activities:
 1. Annual mass vaccination of dogs
 2. Creation and maintenance of a central database information system for registered and vaccinated dogs
 3. Maintenance of the city pound
 4. Animal population Control through spay/neuter
 5. Information and education campaign on rabies control and prevention and responsible pet ownership
 6. Provision of pre-exposure immunization and treatment to high-risk personnel and post- exposure immunization and treatment to animal bite victims
 7. Provision of free routine pre-exposure prophylaxis to school children aged five to fourteen years in areas with high incidence of rabies
 8. Promote Animal Welfare and ensure the enforcement of the provisions of the Animal Welfare Act of 1998
- b. Deputation and Implementation
 1. The office of City Veterinary shall be primarily in-charged in issuance of citation tickets for any violation of this Ordinance. Likewise said office has also the power to deputize Barangay Officials/representatives, CPOS Ordinance Implementation Division, and such other Government Agency as may deem necessary for the effective implementations of this ordinance.
 2. The Office of the City Veterinary, within 60 days from the effectivity of this ordinance shall formulate implementing Rules and Regulation of this Ordinance.

Rule V
PERSON LIABLE AND PENALTIES

Section 10. Penalties and Violations. Any dog and cat owner/possessor and authority who fails to abide by any provisions of this Ordinance shall be subjected to a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) and not more than Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) as per provisions of Republic Act 7160;

- a. Pet owners who fail or refuse to have their dog/cat registered and immunized against rabies shall be punished by a fine of five hundred pesos (P500.00) on its first offense and one thousand pesos (P1,000.00) on its second offense for every dog and cat;
- b. Pet owners who refuse to have their dog/cat vaccinated against rabies shall be liable to pay for the vaccination of both the dog/cat and the individuals bitten by their dog/cat;
- c. Pet owners who refuse to have their dog/cat put under observations and do not shoulder the medical/funeral expenses of the person bitten by their dog/cat shall be fined five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) for every dog/cat involved and shall be liable to pay the medical/funeral expenses of the victim. In the event that the pet owner has no means to pay the fine, community service may be imposed at the discretion of the court.
- d. Pet owners who refuse to put leash on their dog/cat when they are brought outside shall be fined five hundred pesos (P500.00) for each incident;
- e. An impounded dog/cat shall be released to its owner upon payment of a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) with corresponding impounding fee of P50.00 per day that the dog/cat remains in the impounding center. (modified from the original provision)
- f. Any person found guilty of trading of dog/cat for meat shall be fined five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) per dog/cat and subject to imprisonment, to the discretion of the court.
- g. Any person opposing, resisting or otherwise interfere shall be penalized with a fine of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00).



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- h. Any person owning or having control or custody of any dog permitting the animal to urinate or defecate in public upon the private property or another within the City is in violation of Section 7(II.a) hereof shall be penalized an amount of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00).
- i. In the event that any stray animal is found loitering in the aerodrome operation of Fernando Airbase or any flying institution that would endanger aircraft, pilot and crew, said flying institution may resort to such other measures to catch and/or neutralize, if necessary, the said stray animal/s without incurring any liability under this Ordinance.

**Rule VI
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISION**

Section 11. Appropriation. The appropriation necessary for the program, activities and projects in relation to the implementation of this ordinance shall be included in the operating expenses of the office of the City Veterinarian and shall be every year thereafter be included.

Section 12. Separability Clause. If for any reason, any section or provision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction; such declaration of unconstitutionality shall not affect or impair the other provision or parts thereof which shall continue to be in force and in effect

Section 13. Repealing Clause. Special Ordinance No. 05-2000, otherwise known as the Lipa City Dog Pound Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced with the "Companion Animal Regulation Ordinance of Lipa (CAROL) OF 2023: An Ordinance Regulating the Ownership and Care of Companion Animals such as Dogs and Cats through Local Rabies Prevention, Control, Eradication Coordinating Committee, Compulsory Registration and Vaccination and Providing Penalties Thereof" in order to further improve the efficacy of the passing of Republic Act 9482 likewise known as the "Anti- Rabies Act of 2007".

Section 14. Effectivity. This shall take effect immediately upon its approval and its publication in newspaper of general circulation.

Rehistrasyon, Kapakanan, Pangangalaga, at Proteksyon

- Ang mga alagang aso at pusa ay nararapat lamang na mai-rehistro, matapos mabigyan ng bakuna laban sa rabies ng Office of the City Veterinarian. Lahat ng nagmamay-ari ng aso at pusa ay kinakailangang ipa-rehistro ang mga alaga sa baranggay o kaya naman ay sa Office of the City Veterinarian (Php 50.00 kada aso at pusa)
- Ang mga breeder ay dapat magparehistro ng kanilang mga kennel alinsunod sa mga regulasyon sa negosyo na itinakda ng lungsod

Pagi-IMPOUND

- Dapat ikulong ng mga may-ari ang kanilang mga alagang hayop sa loob ng kanilang mga bakuran at lagyan ng tali kapag dinadala sa labas o sa pampublikong lugar
- Ang impounded animal ay maaaring makuha ng may-ari nito pagkabayad ng multa ayon sa bilang ng araw na ito ay na-impound
- Ang mga hayop na walang bakuna sa rabies ay babakunahan bago ibalik sa may ari nito



- Ang isang hayop na nahuli ay dadalhin sa Stray Animal Impounding Center at ito ay maaaring manatili dito sa loob ng pitong (7) araw
- Ang hayop na hindi tinubos ng may-ari nito sa loob ng tatlong araw ay mapupunta sa listahan ng maaaring ampunin. Ang pag-papaampon ay isasagawa lamang ng tatlong araw. Kung ang hayop ay hindi maihahanap ng bagong tahanan, ito ay kakailangang i-euthanize alinsunod sa RA 8485 Animal Welfare Act of 1998
