Frances Presley Rice

Topic of Speech

A Tribute to the African American Women Trailblazers
Who Helped Build Our Nation



FRANCES PRESLEY RICE is a retired lawyer and Army Lieutenant Colonel with 20 years of active service and several distinguished medals. She holds a Juris Doctorate from the UC College of the Law, San Francisco (formerly Hastings College of the Law); a Master of Business Administration from Golden Gate University, San Francisco; and a Bachelor of Science degree from Drury University in Missouri.

She was admitted to practice law in the states of Minnesota and Virginia, as well as the District of Columbia. She was authorized to practice law before the United States Court of Military Appeals and the United States Supreme Court.

Frances began her military career in the Women's Army Corps (WAC) where she served for ten years, first as an enlisted woman, then as an officer after attending Officer Candidate School (OCS). During those ten years of service, she was honored as the top graduate of her basic training class, her advanced training class and her OCS class. Under an Army program, she was selected to attend law school during the day where she was honored with the top Moot Court award, all while pursuing an MBA degree on her own at night at Golden Gate.

Upon graduation, she transitioned into the Army's Judge Advocate General's Corps (JAG) where she eventually became the Army's JAG highest-ranking woman.

Among her multiple Army assignments were WAC company commander, prosecutor in courts martial, adjutant of a basic combat training brigade where she was the only woman, special assistant to the Army's Judge Advocate General in the Pentagon, and legal advisor to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Equal Opportunity in the Pentagon.

Upon retirement, she was awarded the Legion of Merit for exceptionally meritorious service. Her other awards were the Meritorious Service Medal, the Department of Defense Commendation Medal, the US Army Commendation Medal (awarded four times), the Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal, and the United States Armed Forces Reserve Medal.

After her military career, she worked for the McDonnell Douglas Corporation as a government contract advisor on the law of space exploration. She taught Business Law for the European Division of the University of Maryland, Belgium.

She is the founder and Chairman of the National Black Republican Association, which was founded in 2005 and is dedicated to recapturing the rich civil rights legacy of the Republican Party.

Driven by a passion for revealing untold narratives about successful African Americans, Frances chronicles the achievements of little-known heroes, shedding light on their remarkable achievements despite facing obstacles.

Frances wrote the book *STEM Pioneers and Visionaries: A Compendium of African American Innovators and Inventors in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics*, which highlights the incredible African Americans who transformed every component of American life with cleverness and resilience.

She wrote, also, the book *Black Trailblazers: Pioneering African Americans Who Shaped the Founding and Development of America*, which helps bring to light the incredible achievements of African Americans and inspires current and future generations to strive for success.

Frances is also a screenwriter and producer of documentaries with renowned Director Bayer Mack.

Their films include:

OSCAR MICHEAUX: THE CZAR OF BLACK HOLLYWOOD, the critically acclaimed documentary film which was nominated for a Black Reel Award as the "Outstanding Independent Documentary" by the Foundation for the Advancement of African Americans in Film (FAAAF).

IN THE HOUR OF CHAOS which tells the story of the Reverend Martin Luther King Sr., father of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr, and the King family that was runner-up in the documentary category of the San Francisco Black Film Festival.

NO LYE: AN AMERICAN BEAUTY STORY which won the “Outstanding Independent Documentary” in the Black Reel Award, as well as “Best Documentary” in the Urban Mediamakers Festival.

PROFILES OF AFRICAN AMERICAN SUCCESS, which is a series about African American entrepreneurs who overcame incredible obstacles and achieved success against the odds in the late 19th century and early 21st century.

BLACK SEEDS: THE HISTORY OF AFRICANS IN AMERICA, the epic three-part documentary that won two awards: "Best Producer" in the Freedom Festival International and “Best Documentary” in the Denton Black Film Festival. The film received an “Honorable Mention” in the Orlando International Film Festival. It was an “Official Selection” of the Philadelphia Independent Film Festival, the African Film Festival, and the Denton Black Film Festival.


