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
Our Mission

The Remote Leader – Lyndon Friesen (Ignitor Leadership)

I am not a health care worker or have a background in science, but I do have a profound admiration and care for those that do.

In my career, I am privileged to work with teams in organizations in all industry sectors. Teams that are intent on becoming better versions of themselves.

Over the past year I have had the opportunity to work with a vast number of organizations involved in healthcare across Canada and United States. My gratitude and indebtedness is felt each time towards these people during these leadership events together. Health Canada (led by Dr. Theresa Tam) and the CDC in United States have promoted very similar guidelines during the pandemic wear a mask, stay six feet apart from others, and only go into public spaces if required. In other words, do everything you can to minimize the infection and transmission rates by staying away. What we do with healthcare workers is we tell them the opposite. We tell them to run towards those affected with the virus who need our help.

Over the past 15 months I have witnessed lots of support for our healthcare workers. Numerous viral expressions of support, front lawns with with signs, and even the odd bumper sticker expressing our gratitude.

I hope we are also there for them when the pandemic is months or years past the apex of cases. There is an untold, incalculable cost to walking into 'danger' on a regular basis. While we know so much about COVID-19 and the destructive variants that have come along with it, there is still so much more to know. Often it is this unknown that causes us added stress. History tells us that when individuals push aside stressors for significant periods of time, without processing these stressors, it manifests in some way at some later date.

I am not predicting PTSD or mental health issues to widely affect those that have worked in the health care industry for the past 15 months. However, if our healthcare workers needs us, my hope is we remember their commitment to getting us all through a generational pandemic. My hope is that they feel supported not just during the crisis but long after the crisis has been overcome. I am grateful for all those that have raced on a daily basis into the heart of the pandemic to give humanity a chance.

Treasurer's Report – Jennifer Sharp


