MAHINDRA & Mahindra Ltd (M&M) is to hold 80 per cent equity stake in a proposed joint venture with Jiangling Motor Co Group (JMCG) that will mark the company's entry into tractor manufacturing in China.

The joint venture will acquire tractor-manufacturing assets from JMCG's subsidiary, Jiangling Tractor Company (JTC), producing tractors in the 18-33 HP range.

They estimated the relevant Chinese market at 70,000 units per annum, growing at 6-8 per cent. Further, China has over a million small tractors in the 15-18 HP category.

"ITC will provide the Joint venture with a strong manufacturing base, an existing distribution network in China and a complementary product range," said M&M's notice to the BSE.

It has a growing market for tractors imported from Korea and Japan and re-badged for sale in the US.
