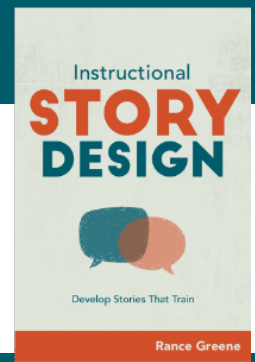

## Instructional Story Design Curriculum

Here’s how you can use each section of **Instructional Story Design**, step-by-step, as part of the core curriculum for your Instructional Design/Technology Program. **Use the case study at the end of each chapter to practice these skills.**

### **PART 1: DISCOVER** Chapters 2-4

*Strengthen performance consulting abilities and analytical skills*

1. Use PRIMED questions from the book to interview stakeholders and subject matter experts
2. Write a goal for training the client
3. Create an audience profile with the audience profile questionnaire
4. Complete the action list template

### **PART 2: DESIGN** Chapters 5-7

*Build story-writing skills and increase connection with learning audiences*

1. Create relatable characters following the character description guideposts
2. Match characters with conflicting actions and motivations
3. Start with a story premise and use the Build the Story worksheet to complete the story

### **PART 3: DELIVER** Chapters 8-10

*Develop a product that makes a business impact*

1. Complete the storyboard template
2. Produce the story with available tools and applications; use examples from the book and online resources at [needastory.com](http://needastory.com)
3. Design and develop a story-designed course using the Story-Reflection-Solving-Feedback model
