These are challenging times! Despite this, we are working hard to lift the burden of shelters having to euthanize animals. We receive emergency calls for help daily and weekly, so you may often see posts asking for foster homes for cats and dogs. Sometimes we're already covered, thanks to our wonderful group of volunteers who dedicate their time to healing both the body and the soul.

We always need help. One of the most effective ways you can support us is by making a one-time or recurring donation. Many Virginia shelters — particularly those in the Northern Neck, Southwest Virginia, and West Virginia — do not have the county funds to provide medical care for animals. We are fortunate that in Northern Virginia we have many adopters willing to open their homes and hearts.

We do our very best, but money is tight, and unfortunately, veterinary costs have risen sharply, even for rescues. This year alone, we have taken in **815 cats** and **141 dogs**, and have adopted out **787 cats** and **114 dogs** — an incredible accomplishment made possible through your support. These are animals that were at risk of euthanasia due to lack of space, being under eight weeks old, or having minor health issues (mostly colds).

You can help us continue our mission to "save cats and dogs from needless euthanasia."

 prepare a cat for adoption and around \$400 for a healthy dog. Some dogs with medical
 issues have cost us over \$8,000 this year.

Our goal is to help make Virginia a no-kill state by 2026, and we're well on our way. We partner with many other rescues to make this vision a reality. Every week, countless healthy, adoptable cats and dogs are euthanized simply because shelters run out of space and resources.

I often hear people say, "You can't save them all." My response is always, "I'm going to save as many as I can." Sadly, without a physical shelter and with limited funds, there are times I have to turn away pleas for help — not because I don't care, but because it hurts to see what I can't fix. This is our reality. Until every pet is spayed and neutered, this heartbreaking cycle will continue.

I never turn someone away without offering an alternative solution, and we make it a point to respond to every communication.

We've made a real difference in the lives of so many animals. It's deeply gratifying to know that our cats and dogs are now loved and safe in their forever homes. To date, we have rescued **over 30,000 animals** — but there's still so much more to do.
