Today's Speaker

Today's speaker is Annelle Whitt, JD, Program District Coordinator, Multicultural Achievement Committee (MAC) Scholars, through the Columbia Missouri Public Schools. Ms. Whitt also made available a number of MAC Program pamphlets at the presentation.

As per the available pamphlets – "the MAC Program is a holistic collaborative, educational support function of Columbia Public Schools. The MAC program is designed to provide students with the necessary skills and support they need to achieve success academically, emotionally and socially. The purpose of the MAC Program is to increase the number of historically under-represented students in Columbia Public School's most rigorous course work, honors and advanced placement courses. The program's goal is to ensure college and career readiness for students from cradle to career."

Partners in education with MAC Program includes the Columbia Public Schools, Shelter Insurance, University of Missouri and Columbia College.

Many programs offered through MAC Scholars Program. This includes such programs and initiatives as (but not limited to):

- In partnership with University of Missouri Division of Inclusion, Diversity & Equity Women of Color, Honor and Ambition initiative for female high school students;
- In partnership with University of Missouri Division of Inclusion, Diversity & Equity Men of Color, Honor and Ambition initiative for female high school students;
- The Mini MAC Scholars Program with goals to have students have personal commitment to academic achievement and success, celebrate academic success each and every day, and encourage students to begin thinking about college.
- Additional MAC programs and initiatives for middle school and high school students.

The MAC Program also has such events as a MAC Conference at Columbia College. About 500 students from Columbia Public Schools participate. There is also a program where students travel to different States in the USA to complete college tours.

Any Columbia Public School student can participate in MAC Program. Students would need to sign a contract to participate and have a 3.0 grade point average, or show how they are going to achieve a 3.0 grade point average or better. The MAC Program has an excellent reputation with students and their families, so students want to participate in this program. At Columbia Public Schools, there are 678 students from Kindergarten through High School in the MAC Program. The average student in this MAC Program has a 3.3 grand point average.
