Today's Program: We heard from Angelayeh Carter and Brenda Porter from Rainbow House. Their mission since 1986, has been to keep children safe and to support families in crisis through prevention, assessment, and intervention in cases if child abuse and neglect. They do this through their Emergency Shelter and the Regional Child Advocacy Center. The Emergency Shelter works to provide a stable loving home, while keeping siblings together and keeping them in their home schools, while also working with families to provide counseling services and strengthening parenting skills. The Regional Child Advocacy Center serves children in 11 counties in Mid-Missouri. Children are brought to the CAC when it is believed abuse has occurred. Their team includes law enforcement, Children's Division medical and mental health professionals, prosecutors and other professionals to make decisions on how to help the clild. Lindsey presented our check of continuing support for \$500 to Rainbow House.
