Changing the World Two Wheels at a Time

The October 12 guest speakers were Chris and Rene Creed, founders of Living Life on 2 Wheels, Inc. and the owners of Pedal 'n Pi Bike Shop and Pizza in Crystal City. They currently operate an All Kids Bike program with 26 area schools with many more schools on the waiting list. This program provides 24 Strider balance bikes and helmets to kindergartners and first graders so they may learn bicycling skills in PE class. Strider bikes have pedals that can be added to the bike after the participant has learned to balance while keeping their feet on the ground. These bikes are used at camps for Pony Bird residents, with children and adults with Down's syndrome, autism and other developmental and physical limitations. Living Life on 2 Wheels is developing a bike park on Plattin Road. The park will include trails for hikers and bicyclists, bring to fruition their vision to provide safe places for families to participate in the sport of cycling together and develop programs and camps for everyone and all levels of ability. BB 5K Teen Suicide Awareness Walk Debbie Schumaker and Cynthia Buchheit-Courtway




Debbie Schumaker spoke to the group about the upcoming BB 5K Teen Suicide Awareness Walk. This is the 5th year for the walk. Debbie spoke of the history of the establishment of this walk being the June 2019 suicide of her grandson, Brian. Her family was encouraged to find a way to reach out to the community about the increase in teenage suicide, this walk is being used for that purpose. The proceeds from the walk have been used to give money to schools for sporting equipment. It is currently being used to award scholarships to students who write an essay on the need for suicide awareness. This year's topic was how teens feel they have changed and/or have seen changes in friends since the COVID-19 pandemic changed their school and family lives. At this year's walk eight \$500 scholarships will be awarded.

Debbie asked Missouri State Representative Cynthia Buchheit-Courtway up to speak about her efforts in Jefferson City to implement additions/changes/extensions to the health curriculum grades 5-12 in schools that include more mental health information and resources. Representative Buchheit-Courtway indicated she was going to be meeting with Aspen, a group that helps with suicide awareness by providing information about where to go to get help and who could be trusted to provide help.

CLUB PROJECTS


Dictionary Project



The Dictionary Project is a commendable initiative that aims to provide third-grade students with their own copy of a dictionary each year. The project is supported by our Twin City Area Optimist Club through a \$5000 grant issued by the Optimist Club St. Louis Foundation. This tradition not only equips young learners with a valuable resource for improving their language and literacy skills but also instills in them a love for the written word and a sense of empowerment through knowledge. The tactile experience of flipping through the pages of a physical dictionary not only enhances their vocabulary and comprehension but also fosters a sense of curiosity and independence in discovering the meanings of words. Moreover, it introduces them to the joy of exploration and the confidence to articulate their thoughts more effectively. The Dictionary Project thus plays an essential role in shaping the educational foundation of third-grade students, offering them a tool that transcends the classroom, enriching their lives with the gift of language and the potential for lifelong learning.

This year's project was chaired by two first timers, Allie Kister and Laura Lohman. Both Optimists have students in the local school districts who have and will benefit from this project. This year 57 boxes totaling 1,368 books were ordered and delivered to the following schools: Athena Elementary, Crystal City Elementary, Christian Outreach, Vineland Elementary, Festus Elementary, Grandview Elementary, Our Ladies in Festus, Hillsboro Elementary, Pevely Primary, Sunrise, Telegraph Intermediate, Twin City Christian Academy and St. Rose of Lima Catholic School in De Soto. In addition to the schools, we have added on local third Homeschoolers and plan to deliver rhyming dictionaries to the local Festus Pre-K building and for the Head Start project. 
