For a short scale, use the three items in bold (items #2, #3, #5).]

- 1. I can run two miles in two minutes.
- 2. I eat cement occasionally.
- 3. I can teleport across time and space.
- 4. I am interested in pursuing a degree in parabanjology.
- 5. I have never used a computer.
- 6. I work fourteen months in a year.
- 7. I will be punished for meeting the requirements of my job.
- 8. I work twenty-eight hours in a typical workday.
