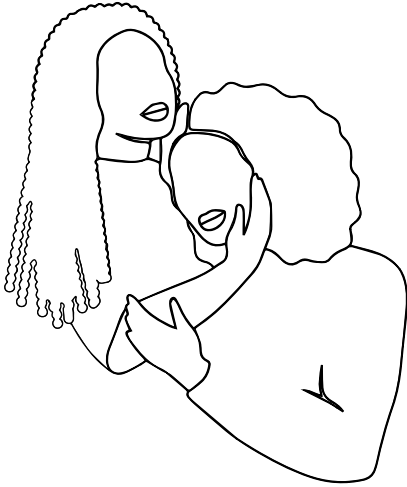


# HARRIET'S NEWARK SISTERS IN BLACK LIBERATION

IN 1803, JENNY, A BLACK WOMAN ATTEMPTED TO BUY FLORA'S FREEDOM FROM HER ENSLAVER MR. DODD.



CIRCA 1818, FREEDOM SEEKER MARY WARD ESCAPED SLAVERY IN THE SOUTH WITH HER INFANT SAMUEL. SAMUEL RINGGOLD WARD WOULD BECOME AN ACTIVIST AND TEACHER IN NEWARK'S PLANE STREET COLORED CHURCH.



IN 1816, AN ENSLAVED WOMAN ESCAPED WITH HER 2-YEAR-OLD DAUGHTER FROM ORANGE, NJ. SHE WAS CAUGHT AND PUT INTO NEWARK'S JAIL ON BROAD STREET.



IN 1834, HANNAH MANDEVILLE LEFT SLAVERY IN JERSEY CITY AND BECAME A LEADER IN NEWARK'S BLACK COMMUNITY.
