"Drug Activity" - Unfortunately it happens in our quiet little town a lot more than people realize. With the heroin epidemic sweeping Butler County, it will only get worse. If you see what you believe to be a suspicious vehicle or suspicious activity anywhere in the Borough please call us at 724-865-2799 and leave a message describing the activity with as many details as possible (date, time, number of people/vehicles, descriptions of the involved, activity that took place etc.) The more information you can get us, without personally confronting the actors, the better. We will keep your information confidential always. Please do not feel that you are wasting anyone's time, we may not get enough information from one call to charge someone right away, however all information received will be compiled and logged every time that you or your neighbors report such activity so that we can eventually make an arrest of the actor(s) involved.

Please keep in mind with winter here and snow and or ice falling that each owner, occupant or tenant who's property fronts or runs along any street in the Borough shall remove the snow and/or ice from all sidewalks fronting upon or alongside their property. This must be done within twenty four (24) hours after the snow and/or ice ceases to fall or to be formed on the sidewalk. **Snow is not to be plowed into or thrown into the streets from shovels, blowers and/or or plows.** We are only informing you of this as a courtesy as this is an ordinance of Prospect Borough and one can be fined.

Property Tax Relief, Homestead & Farmstead Exclusion

The Homeowner Tax Relief Act, Act 72 of 2004, was signed into law by Governor Rendell on July 5, 2004, to allow school districts to reduce property taxes through homestead and farmstead exclusions. Property tax relief will be funded by a combination of state revenue from gaming and dedicated local income taxes. Under a homestead or a farmstead property tax exclusion, the assessed value of each homestead or farmstead is reduced by the same amount before the property tax is computed.

- You may only have one Homestead and Farmstead Exclusion.
- Must be an owner-occupied property that is your primary residence.
- You must apply prior to March 1st of each year.
- Once reviewed by the assessment office, if you are eligible your discount will not be shown until the following year.
- The Homestead and Farmstead Exclusion only effects the School Tax.
- If you are already receiving the discount it will be shown on your school tax card as "Homestead Exclusion or Farmstead Exclusion".

Tax Collector

A few notes from Judy Raisley, The Prospect Borough Tax Collector:

- Hours: Monday and Thursdays from 1 to 5 Other hours by appointment. **Ph:** 724-865-2535
- Email: raisley@zoominternet.net
- NOTE: If you are planning on moving a mobile home you need to obtain a mobile home removal permit that is available at my office. I also issue no-lien letters for real estate purposes.
- Notify me if you move in or out of the township or if you change mortgage providers. This helps me keep accurate records for tax mailings.

County & Borough taxes can be paid at discount in March and April, face amount in May and June. After that there is a 10% penalty.

School taxes can be paid at discount in August and September, face amount in October and November. After that there is a 10% penalty.

Don't forget to pay your per capita tax. Everyone over 18 living in your home is responsible for the per capita tax. Sometimes it is included on your property tax notice, and sometimes you get a separate notice. It is \$5.00 per person and if not paid the school submits the names to a collection agency and fees are added on.
