Approval of Minutes: The Minutes were approved by all present after a couple of corrections in the October 3, 2011 meeting minutes.

Ed Robinson stated that we have a permit but it needs to be amended by DEP. The Council voted and approved all proper resolutions applicable to PennVest funding applications.

Streets: Jim Butler reported that the new plans for the Wilson Rd Storm Water project is being reviewed by Brett Hildebrand of the Butler county Planning Commission. Gus Guenther stated that Bob Hixson and Bill Osborne fixed and repaired the Storm Drains on Kennedy Road. Motion was made to rezone the residential/business district And all present voted yes.

Ed Robinson asked Council for a Motion to have Attorney Coyer place the ads for Bids and time frames. Attorney Coyer said he would advertise and put a 20 day limit to get the bids in. Ed Robinson made the motion and Gus Guenther seconded and all present voted yes. Chris Eddy asked if the roads could be damaged by the Marcellus Shale and he was told that they would be bonded. Time will be allotted at the beginning of the next meeting for the Public to discuss the Marcellus Shale lease.

Parks: Bob Boice reported the Borough had a very good Halloween under the direction of Becky Gitzen, Glen Gitzen Jim Butler. There were 65 kids at the costume judging and

received generous donation made for the event. Jon Hiser from Hiser Engineering gave \$50.00, Marburger gave 50 drinks, Prospect Pizza gave 7 small pizzas, McDonalds gave coupons, Fairground Market gave apples, Corner Store gave apples and the Borough gave cash for prizes. The Sights and Sounds of Christmas will be the first Saturday in December, Glen and Becky Gitzen will be handling that event.

Police: The Police report was presented by Mayor Butler with 2 complaints, I for a dog running loose and 1 attempted burglary, 1 theft of tools and other items. Totals hours worked 17 and 53 miles patrolled. The Borough received 6 applications for a part time officer and Mayor Butler, Gus Guenther and Charles Tatton will interview the applicants in the near future.

Personnel: Nothing to report.

Maintenance of Facility: Nothing to Report.

Library: A report was presented to Council. There will be a Lego event at the Library on December 28.

Planning Commission: A letter from Alan Vagasky was presented to Council to approve the revised sub-division for Charles McGowan. Motion was made by Ed Robinson and seconded by Bob Boice and all present voted yes to approve the revised sub-division and all present voted yes.

Communications: A letter from First National Bank was received and Ed Robinson is going to have a meeting with the Bank.

Old Business: A certified letter has been sent to the American Legion requesting that they pay the Amusement Tax for their event at the Butler Fair Grounds in August. Per our solicitor Michael English this tax should be paid even though it was a fund raiser. Franklin Township has been notified of this.

New Business: Motion was made by Jon Hiser and seconded by Bob Boice to advertise the proposed General Fund Budget for 2012 and all present voted yes. Motion was made by Glen Gitzen and seconded by Ed Robinson to advertise the proposed Sewage Budget for 2012 and all present voted yes.

Communications: A letter was received from the Auditor General.
